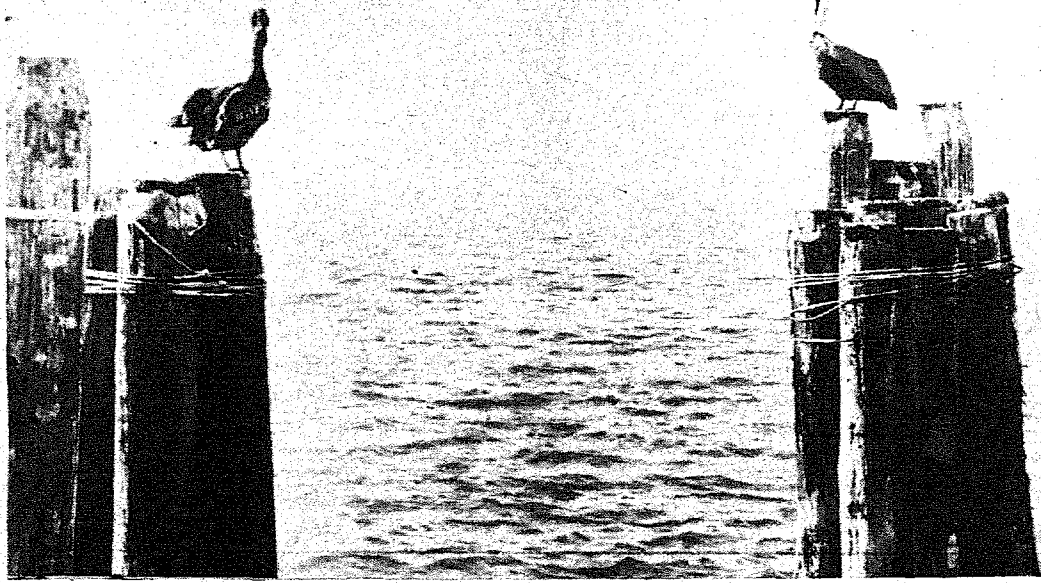

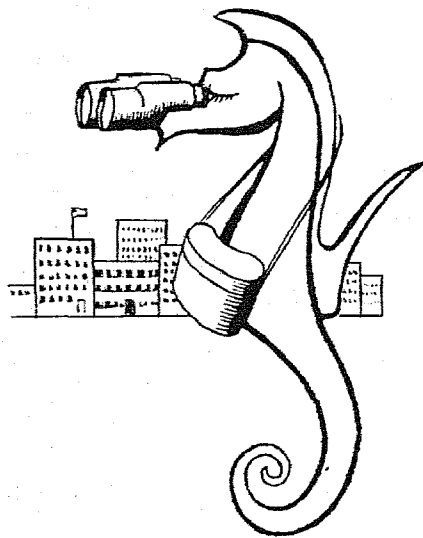

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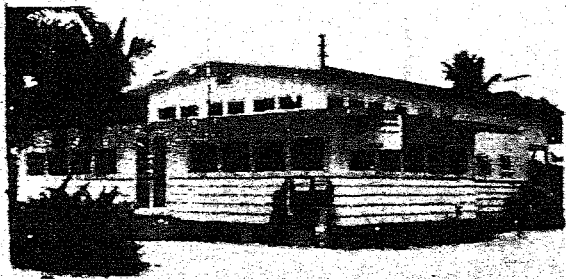

Mr. and Mrs. Hills have just taken occupancy of their new home in Chatea-sur-Mer and were still putting on the finishing touches when the Cooleys visited.

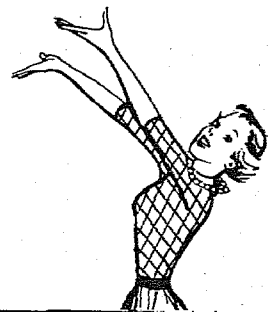
Dr. Cooley is the author of the well-known study of Sanibel vegetation published some years ago. He and Mrs. Cooley will return about November 15 for the season.

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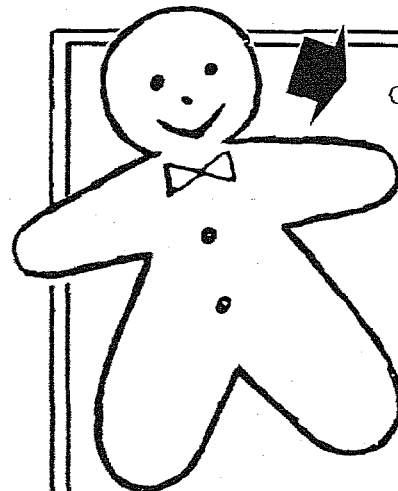
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



Mrs. PAUL STAHLIN and Mrs. JOE GAULT went to Sarasota early this week to see MARG SIMONDS, who now lives there.



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
