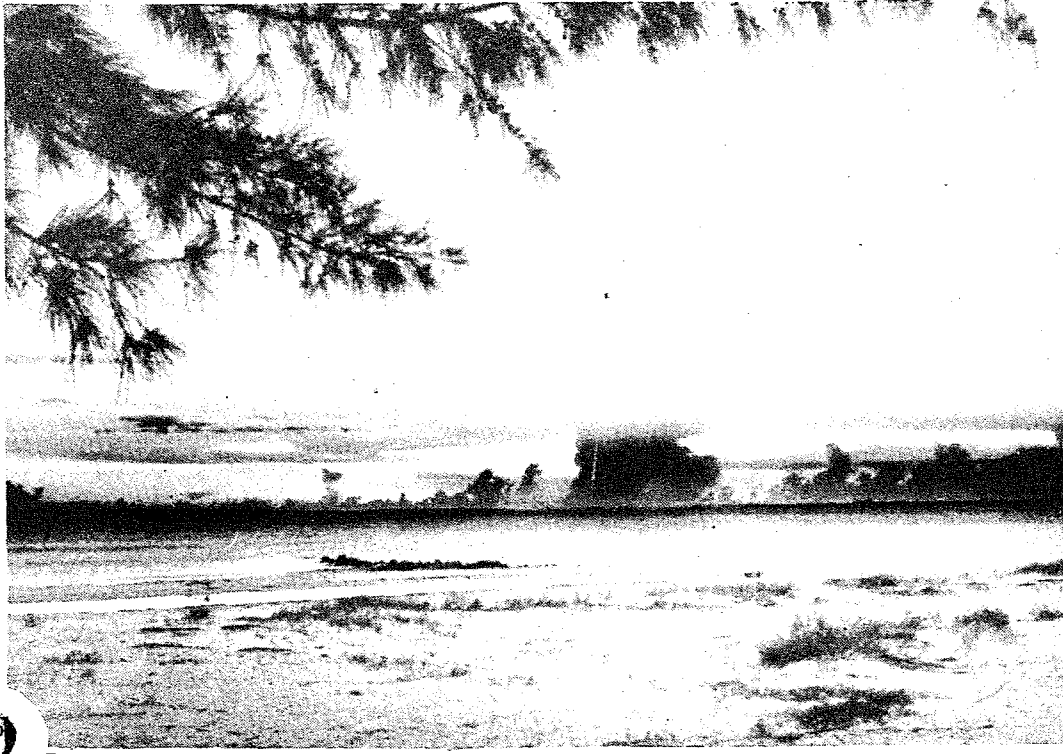

PHOTO EXHIBIT AT "SEA HORSE" ART GALLERY

An exhibit of Wildlife Color Photos by Mario F. Hutton will take place at the Art Gallery of the Sea Horse Shop, Sanibel, from Jan. 17 to the 31st. The exhibit will include over sixty framed enlargements from slides, never before shown, most of them taken in the Ding Darling Wildlife Sanctuary, with others featuring birds photographed in their natural habitats on Captiva, Kitchell Key and several other Southwest Florida localities. Mr. Hutton's pictures are distributed world-wide by Photo Researchers, Inc. of New York and Hillingdon, England.

A reception for the preview of the exhibit will be held on Tuesday, January 17, from 5 to 8 p.m.

AUDUBON SOCIETY MEETING

The Sanibel-Captiva Audubon Society holds its next meeting at the Sanibel Community House on Thursday, January 12, at 8:30 p.m. The program includes a showing of the film "The Bald Eagle," which covers all aspects of the campaign being conducted in all States to insure the survival of this now scarce bird, representing the emblem of the United States.

Also featured will be a report by Charles LeBuff, who will furnish detailed figures on the results of the Annual Bird Count held on Sanibel and Captiva on December 30. All interested persons will be welcome.

MEETINGS HELD ON COUNTRY CLUB

The proposed community Golf and Country Club for Sanibel and Captiva Islands was discussed Tuesday, January 3, at a special meeting of the Board of Directors of the Chamber of Commerce, in joint session with the Country Club Committee, headed by John Kontinos. It was decided that the project is ready to present to Islanders for their consideration, now that the committee has all details on costs, procedures, etc.

The Chamber Board, therefore, called a meeting for this past Tuesday, January 10, at the Sanibel Community Center, to present the facts and obtain community reaction. Full details in next week's Islander. (The Tuesday meeting, was, regrettably, too late for our deadline.)

Those who have had homestead exemption receive a form each year from the County tax office. But, if you are a new home owner, you must make the first application yourself by going into the County Tax Assessor's office, Lee County Building, Fort Myers. All you need bring is your last recorded deed.

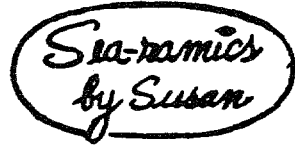

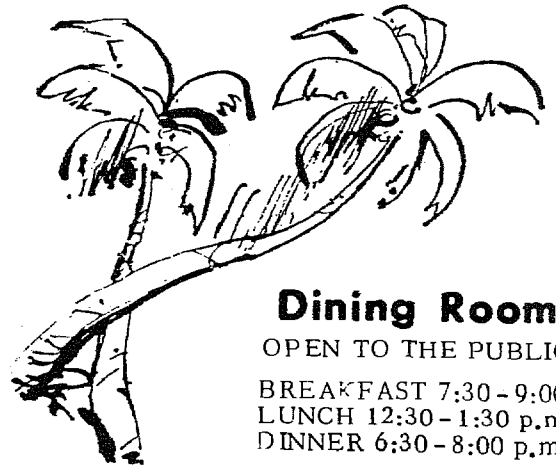

She's now in the process of enjoying the peace and quiet of Sanibel and is using her spare time for reading, studying and art.

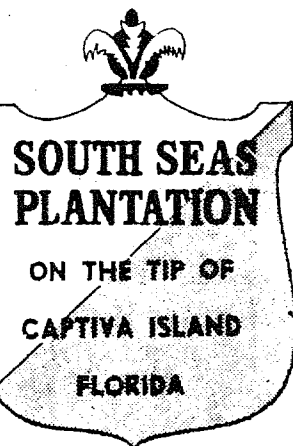
