NEW 1967 CATEGORIES

Mary Nix, Exhibit chairman for the 1967 Sanibel Shell Fair, reports entries for the shell show are already coming in. Several new categories have been added in Division A. Although elementary school students have entered their self-collected Sanibel-Captiva shells in the past, there was no category for Sanibel-Captiva Self-collected by high school students. This year they are included and not only will ribbons be awarded, but a trophy will also go to the blue ribbon winner.

Two categories have been added that need no labeling but will be judged on beauty alone—one for self collected Sanibel-Captiva shells and one for beautiful shells collected from any source. A category for giant shells has been included these are not 'freak' specimens but exceptionally large specimens for their species.

A category for shells from one area was added a specific category for Florida shells was deleted since those entries would automatically fall in this category. Collections of one specie which show variations in color, growth, etc., will have a category in which they may be displayed.

Geode (agatized coral) collectors will find a category in which their beautiful treasure may be displayed for us all to enjoy.

If you are in doubt as to which category your shells should go, ask your favorite dealer (they are not in competition with you but will have a division of their own).

LIVE EXHIBIT

Veteran 'live' exhibitors Mrs. J.P. Glass, Dan Malone and Tom Nix have welcomed Howard Schriener to their committee. For many weeks now they have been gathering and adding to the tanks that were set up to show at the coming Sanibel Shell Fair.

Already there are four tanks of bivalves and univalves happily dispersing themselves while awaiting the big event. The bivalves are busily enjoying the pleasure of gastronomic delights from the fresh Gulf water that is regularly added while the univalves partake of donacs with the exception of the horse conchs which seem to prefer devouring the tulips and leaving their empty shells in the sand!

Our mild little "fighting conchs" (*Strombus alarus*) are grazers and enjoy munching grasses that grow on other shells along with green algae.

If you find live specimens that you would like to contribute or loan for the Fair, they will receive good care and may be turned in to Tom Nix on Gulf Drive where they will first be placed in a holding tank to be sure they are in good health then added to tanks holding specimens that show habits similar to their own.

SANIBEL SPINDRIFT

"Did you know that there are armadillos on Sanibel? Well neither did we until the other evening after an hour with Charles (Charlie) Le Buff, Jr., biological technician with the Sanibel National Wildlife Refuge, about Sanibel and its wildlife. The armadillos were introduced to the islands a few years ago by a resident and have thrived. They weigh about 13 pounds each and grow to a length of about two feet. If you're interested in a first hand look you can find them roaming the highlands at night.
In answer to a question about the "red tide," Le Buff explained it is caused when conditions of salinity, copper content and phosphorus are in a certain balance in the water thereby causing the microorganisms involved to multiply in great numbers until the water is almost stumpy, making it impossible for fish to breathe. Usually this phenomenon occurs a distance from shore. On the beaches the only evidence is the thousands of dead fish washed in and the odors. The chemical reactions color the waters a reddish color, hence the dramatic name "red tide."
Among the other animal wildlife on the islands are to be found raccoons (as who can forget), otter, diamond-back rattlers, coral snakes, Indigo snakes and, of course, the alligator. Fortunately, he said, these snakes are rarely to be seen unless one ventures into the wilder sections. One of Le Buff's most important duties is to apprehend alligator poachers who sometimes visit Sanibel, killing many alligators by baiting large hooks for them and clubbing them when caught. The hides sell for about \$5.00 a foot on the black market. As to deer, there are none. The last of them, Florida white-tail, were drowned in the 1928 hurricane flood waters.
Among the multitude of duties his department performs is the planting of wigwag grass to provide food for wild ducks. It is transplanted from abundant areas to sparse areas under water in the Spring and by Winter it is in full bloom. The work is laborious but rewarding.
Of special interest to all inglers, the "official" name of the injured white headed pelican who begs and borrows without leave fish to eat is Pelicanus. (PAGE 5)

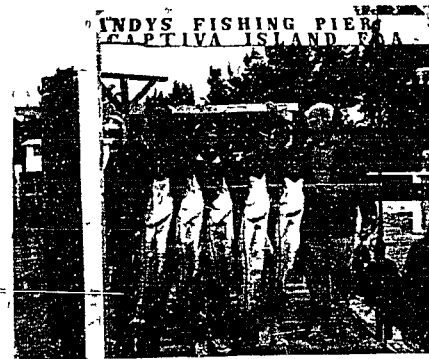

can Pete. Charlie said he hurt his wing in 1940 Hurricane Donna and can't fly well or catch his own fish since then. Pelicans, he added, are now on the endangered species list. Too frequently fishermen in the United States have destroyed them in the mistaken belief that they hurt commercial fishing by their feeding habits. Aerial surveys of wild bird life are carried out in a Cessna 180 plane with Charlie as observer.

One of the most interesting aspects of his job, he said, is the tagging and census taking of alligators. Numbered tags are inserted in the tail section of the gators and a written log book tells where and when the tagging of that individual took place. When encountered again, the tag and logbook tell a vivid tale of growth, migration and numbers of alligators. Le Buff said that a probable grower for one of an individual alligator was set when they tagged a three year old and just fourteen months later ran across him and discovered he'd grown 25 and 3/4 inches in that time!

Incidentally, Le Buff advises, if you should be prowling the mangrove depths some night and see an alligator's shining eyes and want to estimate his length, just calculate the length in inches from his eyes to the tip of his snout and he will be very close in feet in length to that number of inches. This reporter now hastens to say that he intends to leave that kind of estimating work entirely to Mr. Le Buff.

Mr. Le Buff is age 31, was born in Medford, Mass., and has been engaged in conservation work since 1957 when he started in the Bureau of Commercial Fisheries in Naples, Florida. His hobbies include camping and photography. Tom Woods is the refuge manager of the Sanibel Wildlife Refuge assisted by Le Buff and Bob Sabatino of Captiva.

STATE CONSTITUTION DRAFT AVAILABLE SOON

Complete text of the third draft of the proposed new Constitution for Florida, as prepared and recommended by the official Revision Commission set up by the 1965 State legislature, will soon be available here.

Consideration of the proposed Constitution by the public, prior to legislative review and action, will now be possible.

Copies of the complete text of the proposed Constitution are being obtained by the Sanibel-Captiva Democratic Club, and will be made available to all local interested voters. A public meeting for consideration of the new Constitution and the changes it proposes, will be announced later.

WORLD DAY OF PRAYER ONCE AGAIN HELD ON ISLANDS

A world-wide day of Prayer is held each year in 128 countries on the first Friday of Lent and is sponsored by the United Church Women of the National Council of Churches. This Prayer service was inaugurated in 1887 and was first held on the Tonga Islands in the South Pacific. For the 47 years Queen Salote Tupou ruled this tiny island, she led her people in the preparation and observance of this day of prayer and shortly before her death in 1963 she completed the order of service to be used this year. The theme, "Of His Kingdom there shall be no end," Luke 1:33, is most appropriate to come from this regal woman of strong Christian faith. So beginning in the tiny islands of Tonga in the South Pacific prayer will encircle the globe on February 10 to Sanibel and Captiva Islands.
