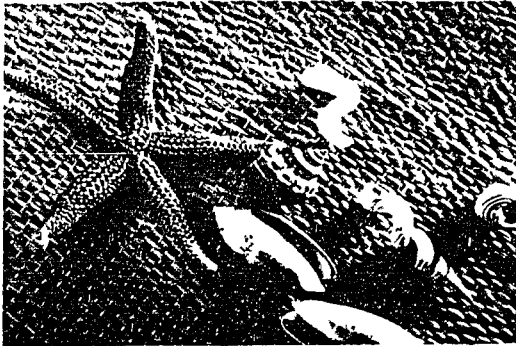

SANIBEL - CAPTIVA AUDUBON SOCIETY MEETING

The next meeting of the Sanibel-Captiva Audubon Society will be held at the Sanibel Community House on Thursday, March 9, at 8-30 p.m. The program, entitled "Birding Down Under," will be presented by Mrs. Whitney Eastman, for the past 12 years a winter Sanibel resident, and a birder of international fame. She is one of a select group who have sighted about 25 per cent of all known bird species, numbering well over six thousand. Mrs. Whitney is a life member of many leading ornithological societies and is a world-wide traveler. Her program promised to be a highlight of the present season of the local Audubon. As usual, the meeting will be open to the public.

SHELL FAIR RESULTS

Over 5,000 persons from all over the United States and many foreign countries registered at the Annual Sanibel-Captiva Shell Show to make it one of the best in many years. Entries this year, 75 in the Scientific Division, filled the Sanibel Community House for the three day show. 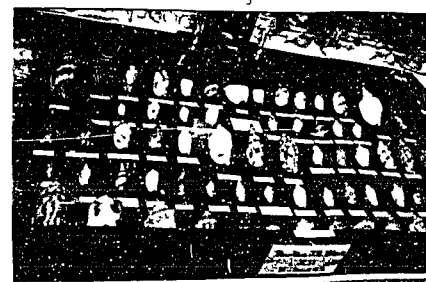

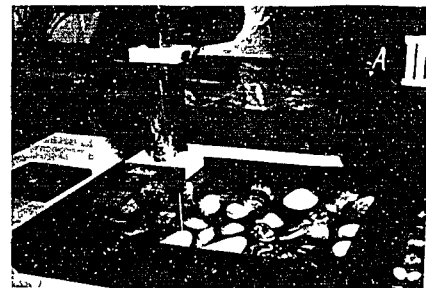
If the audience at Sunday's

DEMOCRATIC CLUB FORUM

What the proposed revision of the Florida Constitution means to the people of the State will be explored by a panel of experts Wednesday, March 22, 8 p.m. at the Community House. Panelists are Sanibel's Charles C. Fishburne, Jr., who teaches at Edson Junior College, Captiva's Griffing Sanford, journalist and former news commentator, and Harry A. Blair, Fort Myers attorney.

All island voters and residents are urged to attend to acquaint themselves with this vital issue. A new constitution can have far reaching and long-lasting effects and the citizens of the State will have an opportunity to express their opinions on it when the Legislature meets later this year to deal specifically with the matter. The panel meeting seeks to help local residents form their opinions with understanding. It is sponsored as a community service by the Sanibel-Captiva Democratic Club.

TO THE ISLANDER

An open letter to people interested in the Golf and Country Club from the Golf Committee: There are approximately 90 different businesses and 239 private homes on the Islands. Over the years we find we all have something in common, that is a growing interest in the proper development of the Islands.

"Keep the Islands green," keep them from becoming a "honky tonk" area and keep them from becoming a freak of the building world of today. Community spirit has to date controlled all of the things mentioned. Thousands of dollars have been spent by all of us in beautifying our lovely Islands. Ding Darling Sanctuary is another guarantee that our Islands will be protected against increasing commercialization. A well-landscaped golf course can be a valuable asset in promoting these aims.

Here on the Islands we only have so much land, and it is fast being removed from the market by different groups or individuals for possible future home sites or larger development.

We have a chance to receive federal aid to develop this area and build a golf course. This type of aid needs community support. Many things must be considered and kept in mind. This is a fact; if this aid passes by it may be forever lost because we only have so much land. After that, the old saying, applies, "That's all, folks."

Recently you received an information sheet and a subscription blank requesting membership to an 18 hole golf course. Possibly the goal was greater than most would care to subscribe to.
