SANCTUARY IMPROVEMENTS DISCUSSED

A proposed brochure outlining plans for the J.N. (Ding) Darling Sanctuary on Sanibel was discussed at a meeting of the Sanctuary Committee with representatives of U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service from Atlanta and Loxahatchee, and of the J.N. (Ding) Darling Foundation of Des Moines, Iowa, at St. Michael's and All Angels Church last Friday. The brochure, which will be prepared by the Fish and Wildlife Service, will cover proposals for improving and maintaining the three wildlife refuge areas on Sanibel: the Ding Darling Sanctuary, the Bailey Refuge, and the area around the lighthouse.

While the brochure primarily will be the basis for a detailed master plan to be drawn up by Fish and Wildlife, it will also be available for distribution to conservation organizations and others interested in conservation. It will contain maps, a short history of the areas, photos of the local wildlife that will be protected, and proposals for refuge facilities.

The group agreed that the area should be kept in as natural a state as possible. Natural land is disappearing rapidly, so every effort should be made to conserve the little remaining. Work actually inside (cont'd., on page 9)

CHILDREN'S BOOK'S DONATED BY PUBLISHER

Twenty books for children up to 12 years old have been received by the Sanibel Public Library from the Children's Book Club of American Education Publication, Inc., of Middletown, Conn. The books are a most welcome addition to the growing children's section of the library, but the sequence of events that initiated the donation makes an interesting story.

Northern friends visiting Fort Myers Beach last winter spent a day with Mrs. H.A. Romine on Sanibel. When they returned home they reported their visit with Mrs. Romine to a mutual friend, Eleanor M. Johnson, telling her of Mrs. Romine's work with the children of Sanibel. Miss Johnson is the retired Editor-in-Chief of "My Weekly Reader," the largest children's publication in the U.S., and much interested in promoting and encouraging reading by children. Miss Johnson, in turn, passed on the story of Mrs. Romine's work to Mary L. Kennedy, Director of the Children's Book Club, and the Sanibel Public Library is the beneficiary of the interest and generosity of these dedicated women. Miss Johnson has written several English text books as well as editing the children's paper.

NEW CONSTITUTION DISCUSSED

Former CBS news commentator Griffing Bancroft of Captiva, political science teacher Dr. Charles C. Fishburne of Sanibel, and Fort Myers attorney Harry Blair will explore Florida's present Constitution and compare it with the revision drafted by a special Revision Commission of 37 members authorized by the 1965 State Legislature. The panel meeting will be Wednesday, March 22, 8:00 p.m., at the Sanibel Community Center.

Griff worked on the Hill in the Nation's capital, primarily concerned with the activities of Congress, for CBS for many years. Before that, he worked on the Chicago Sun. For the last nine years, he has lived on Captiva, writing, and is currently preparing material for the Voice of America.

Dr. Fishburne received his B.S. from West Point, his M.A. from the University of Maryland and Ph.D. from Florida State before becoming instructor of Political Science at Edison Junior College, he was Asst. Professor of Government at Jacksonville University, Jacksonville. Dr. Fishburne built a new home on the Gulf on Sanibel last year, and was joined by his wife and two daughters in August. For some years before teaching, he was with Headquarters, U.S. Air Force, Pentagon, Washington, D.C.

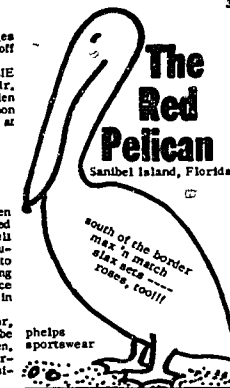

LAST SYMPHONY SATURDAY

Favorite music from well-known operas will be featured in the concert of the Fort Myers Symphony Orchestra Saturday evening, March 18, at 8 o'clock in the Fort Myers High School auditorium. Arlo Deibler, conductor of the orchestra, has arranged a program of light numbers, among them "Evening Star" from Wagner's "Tannhauser" and "Celeste Aida" from the Verdi opera.

In three sections, the program ranges from Mozart ("The Marriage of Figaro") through Verdi and Puccini to Wagner and Beethoven. Each section opens with an orchestral overture.

Musical talent of local musicians and vocalists is exploited in the concert. TAXPAYERS ASK IRS

Q.-Looking over some of the settlement costs I paid when I bought my house, I noticed an item for county transfer tax and another for revenue stamps. Are these deductible?

A.-No, these costs are not deductible when paid in connection with the purchase of a house for personal use but they should be added into the cost basis of your home. If the house was purchased for rental or income producing purposes then these expenses could be deducted as a business expense.

Q.-What's the social Security tax rate on self-employment income?

A.-Net earnings from self-employment are taxed at a rate of 6.15 percent for 1966. This rate goes up to 6.4 percent for 1967 earnings.

Q.-Do you have to be 65 to take advantage of retirement income credit?

A.-No you don't. If you retire before reaching age 65 under a public retirement system you may be eligible to use this provision of the tax law. Q.-I read in the papers where some taxpayers have gotten their tax refunds already. Are you getting them out faster than last year?

A.-The time it takes to process complete, accurate returns is little different from last year. However, taxpayers who file early will find that refunds will be processed faster.

Q.-To avoid delays in receiving refunds, be sure to check whether all the information required has been supplied. Missing signatures, W-2 forms, Social Security numbers and supporting forms and schedules will all hold up expected refunds.

Taxpayers
ASK IRS

Q: Is there any limit on what you can claim under the minimum standard deduction?
A: Yes, the limit is \$500 for married persons filing separately and \$1,000 for single persons or married couples filing jointly.

Q: I just moved. Should I notify the I.R.S. of my new address since I'm expecting a refund?
A: Yes, it will avoid delays in receiving your refund.

Q: My 14 year old boy earned several hundred dollars last year on his paper route. Does he have to report it or do I since he is my dependent?
A: If your son earned over \$600 last year he is required to file a tax return. You should not report his earnings on your return even though he is your dependent.

Q: Where do I report money from a pension?
A: File Schedule B with your Form 1040 to report this income.

Q: We paid sales tax on a color TV as well as a new car last year. Can we add this to the amount shown in the sales tax table?
A: You may add the sales tax paid on the car to the amount shown in the sales tax table, but not the tax paid on the television set. Of course, if you can show you actually paid an amount greater than shown by the table, you may deduct this greater amount.

Q: Our son works a paper route. Will he have to file an income tax return?
A: A return is required if he earned \$600 or more for the year. He should also file a return to get a refund if his income was less than \$600 and income tax was withheld from his pay.

Q: I heard there was some new procedure for taxpayers who are over-withheld because of the new graduated rates. Where can I find out about this?
A: Instructions for claiming additional withholding allowances based on large itemized deductions are explained in Schedule A (Form W-4). Copies have been supplied to employers and are available at local IRS offices.

To reduce withholding under this procedure a taxpayer must have filed a return on 1966 income.

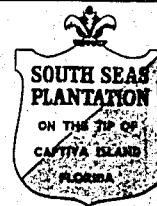

the Sanctuary, therefore, would consist of such things as beautifying the road by planting it with native plants to keep it stable, nature trails, and interpretive signs describing the birds, animals, and plants to be seen.


The Bailey Refuge, which is supporting less wildlife than it did several years ago, would be restored to its original state. To do this, silted-up ponds would be deepened to provide more water area. The Bailey Refuge would be used as a demonstration of how wildlife can be brought back through proper management. The lighthouse area would be maintained as an open space, where people would be free to fish, shell, or just wander around.
