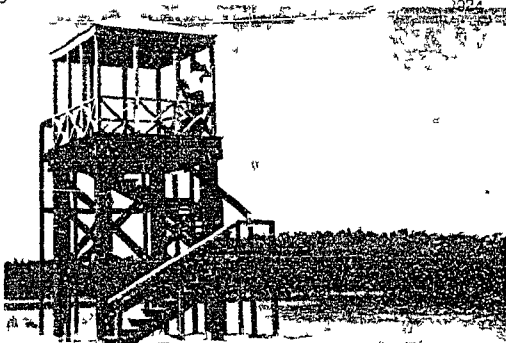

## HELP NEEDED

Deeming it an improper use of its special funds, the J.J. (Ding) Darling Sanctuary Committee at a meeting at the home of Mrs. Herbert Lewis, Tuesday, April 25, decided against spending any additional money to maintain the dike-access through the Sanctuary. Investigation of possibilities for obtaining assistance from government and other island organizations was suggested. Since funds given to the Ding Darling fund are for memorials, and almost \$1,000 has already been expended by the committee in dike-maintenance, the group decided it has done its share and only projects of permanent worth will be considered for the future. Another problem is not knowing the extent of costs that may be necessary to keep the dike in condition, nor for how long this may continue until the U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service can take title to the land and assume responsibility for the dike-access. Further discussion centered on future projects for the Committee, and the coming meeting between representatives of the Committee and executives of the Jay N. (Ding) Darling Foundation in Dea. Molines, IGWA, Mrs. Herbert Lewis, chairman, and Roy Bazire, vice chairman, will attend the Dea Molines conference.

## DEMOCRATIC DINNER WELL ATTENDED

Never before have so many County Commissioners been on the island at one time as last Tuesday night. Headed by the Chairman of the Commission, Julian Hudson, the group which attended the Annual Meeting of the Sanibel-Captiva Democratic Club included Herman Hastings, Kenneth Daniels and Bruce Scott, along with Mrs. Hudson, Mrs. Hastings, Mrs. Daniels and Mrs. Scott. Sheriff Flanders Thompson and Lee County Democratic Executive Committee Chairman Robert Cody Brown and Mrs. Brown, also were on hand.

Preceded by a roast beef dinner, the annual affair at Golden Sands Restaurant was a lively session, with 44 members and guests. A new president, Mrs. George W. Winterbotham, took over for a two year term.

The business meeting which followed the dinner was presided over by retiring president Roy Bazire, who brought up as a matter of new business the condition of the dike-access through the Ding Darling Sanctuary. He advised the Commissioners and the Club members that its maintenance is not the obligation of the local Ding Darling Sanctuary Committee, nor does this group have the financial resources to take such responsibility. Since the Sanctuary is a major public attraction of the islands, and Lee County, its use is of public concern, if it is to remain open to the public, assistance from the County and possibly other island organizations will be essential. The County Engineer, resources to check the dike to determine what is required in maintenance.

A petition requesting this has been signed by approximately ninety percent of the Mohawk subscribers. If this movement is to be successful for Sanibel and Captiva, it is necessary that a like number of Greenleaf subscribers also sign a petition.

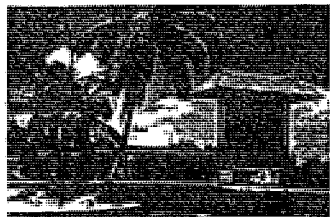

of others.

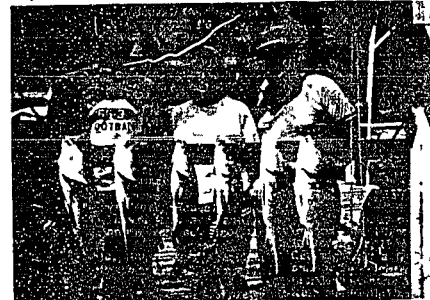
"Cottonpickin'" Chicken-

## LEE COUNTY ELECTRIC COOPERATIVE PLANS PROGRAM

Mrs. Jean Hayford of Captiva was in Tallahassee last week, (April 20), to help plan a greater role for women in rural electrification matters.

Mrs. Hayford, a director of Lee County Electric Cooperative, said the group will concentrate on working with youth in areas served by electric cooperatives.

Plans recommended by the Women's Activities Committee, of which Mrs. Hayford is vice chairman, include promoting a statewide beauty pageant of rural electric contestants and a youth tour to Washington, D.C.

Winners in the local beauty pageant would compete in a statewide contest at Jacksonville in December, 1967. The statewide winner would receive an expense-paid trip to a national contest in January, 1968, at Dallas, Texas. There she would compete for college scholarships and other prizes.

The proposed youth tour would be for boys or girls who are juniors in high school. The winners would receive a week long expense-paid trip to the nation's capital to visit historical sites and see our government in action. For information see Jean Hayford.
