LET THERE BE LIGHT

It has been learned, via the grapevine, the Lee County Electric Co-op has asked for bids on replacing the power cable to the Islands with one buried in the bottom of the Bay. The cable is to be placed two feet under the surface of the bottom between the two concrete poles on either side of the channel. The 1,000 foot trench will be dug by divers who are also expected to lay in the electric cable. The job of trenching is expected to take one or two weeks depending on weather conditions.

It is not known just yet when work will commence but it is hoped that it will be done within the next two months. Electric service is not expected to be interrupted to any great extent, possibly only one time at the end of the job when the new cable is connected to the old one. This improvement will be a boon to those who have electric clocks and have to be at work on time in the morning. No more late sleeping due to the clocks having "run out of juice."

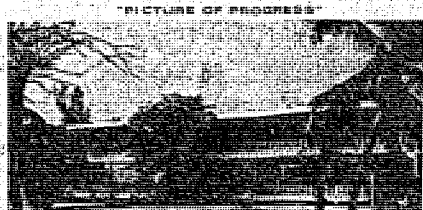

Dr. Slater was the recent recipient of the 1967 Irving Langmuir Prize for physics. The award was given to Dr. Slater for his contribution over the year to quantum physics. In January Dr. Slater participated in the Winter Institute of Quantum Theory at Casa Ybel on Sanibel, where more than 300 scientists from 25 countries gathered to honor him. At that time, he was presented with a 600 page book written in his honor from the papers of some 60 scientists. The book was titled "Quantum Theory and Atoms", Molecules and Solid State.

In addition to his work in radar, Dr. Slater has made significant contributions to the development of the transistor. A former president of Bell Telephone Laboratories said that "had it not been for the work of Professor John C. Slater and a few other academicians in solid state physics, the team of scientists at Bell Laboratories could not have invented the transistor."

The Irving Langmuir Prize, sponsored by the General Electric Foundation, is named for the late Dr. Irving Langmuir, Nobel Prize winning scientist of the General Electric Company.

The program, which begins at 8 o'clock, is not one in the subscribed series. Individual tickets are being sold at \$1.50 for adults and 50 cents for students. They may be purchased at the door.

As arranged by Arlo Dethler, conductor of the symphony, the program includes:

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
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FROM EZRA WITH LOVE
