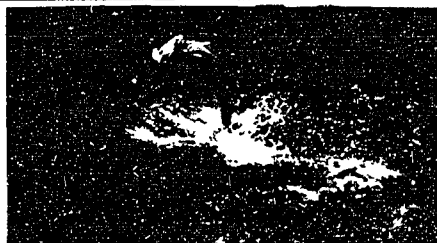

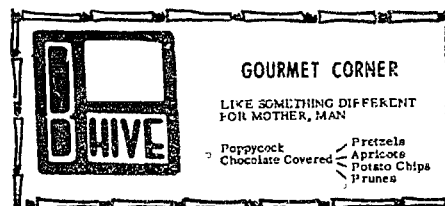

A small rescue operation introduced me to the stars of Sanibel Island.

I had retired early—as does nearly everyone on the island, where it is said there is "nothing to do and no time to do it" in the middle of the night I awoke and went out on the front porch to admire the seashells collected during the day. Thus I discovered some of them to be still "alive"—their occupants were straining out of their opened "houses" pitifully trying to reach the distant sea.

Feeling both soft of head and heart I collected flashlight, donned sandals, assembled the living sea-creatures and stepped out into the deepest night I have ever known. Like most city-dwellers in this day and time I am ill-at-ease alone in the dark out-of-doors, feeling myself to be a too-easy and defenseless prey. With as much speed as I could manage, I walked through the wind towards the invisible beach below and at a respectful distance con- signed my charges to their nat- ural element. Then I paused, flashlight out, and looked up.

There they blazed, in brilliant and awe-filled splendor—the stars of Sanibel Island. Not since my early childhood had I been able to see the Milky Way—our galaxy on end. They looked upon me, those magnificent stars, as they had upon my ancestors and their's before them.

Abruptly the fear of the dark night left me and only the great

peace and stillness of the uni- verse remained. Beside me, the Gulf plunged and roared, around me the air moved restlessly with its currents, I could have stayed there forever.

Much has been written about the seashells and sands of Sanibel Island. It is the fortunate isle where the former pile inches deep and replace the latter completely in many areas. From everywhere the people come to harvest the shells, wander on the sands, admire the birds, seasons and sunsets, I, another visitor, shared their admiration and enjoyment of all of these.

But the wonderful night, mag- ically gift-wrapped and at once a glory and a benedic- tion, will remain my great memory of Sanibel Island. There I re-discovered peace and there my mind, befogged like any other in this day of tensions and turmoil, relaxed and became again what it was meant to be—a receptacle into which the wonders of sea, sky and shore sank and were at home.

Somewhere, in another time and place I can take out this gorgeous toy, admire and hold it close, and so renew the rap- port between us—the tiny human being and the mighty universe to which I belong, it is mine for the rest of my life—well-chosen words—for nothing can ever give the rest of body and mind that such exercise of memory can.

Worry, neither past nor present, can co-exist with it. Annoyances cannot intrude. Greater than the mind can en- compass, it is yet a private world and retreat, and a re- freshment of spirit forever.
