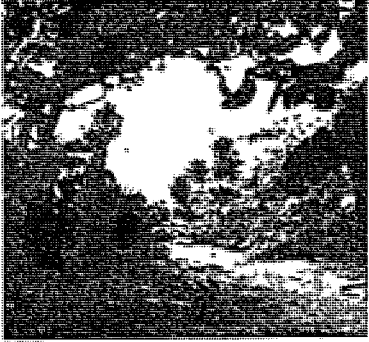

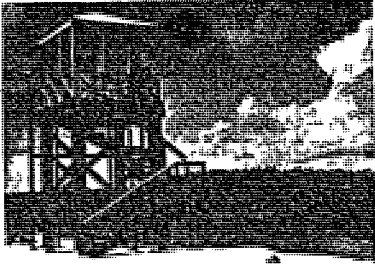

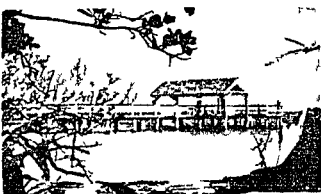

Collier's man was the first to come over to write us up! And to photograph our tropical island! Collier's is now extinct as the Dodo but was a big shot at the time Sanibel burst into print. At the time I was the one on the island interested in sea shells at the time the reporter and his charming wife came over. There was no electricity on the island as yet. The Lee County Electric Company was just installing the electric system at that time and were bringing over the tall poles on trucks by way of the ferry.

One day the Collier's reporter was taking a cleanup of choice sea shells which he had spread out on a sandy spot in my front yard, when eight or ten men arrived dragging a monster pole across the yard. The Collier man never by the flick of an eye or the slightest sign took any notice of them or the pole. They were non-existent! But the electric men were so interested in what the Collier man was doing that they put down the pole and came over to watch him! Finally they picked up their pole and departed. The Collier man won and not for one second had he even noticed them. Of course he had put on a better show!

Next came The Saturday Evening Post article. And what a wonderful one it was! The article was called "Shell Shock" and was written by Theodore Pratt and had a double page of colored photographs, and splendid photographs they were. This was in the February 22, 1941 issue. Fortunately I have a copy.

And lastly the National Geographic sent a man over for a very special sea shell number. The reporter was on the island for three days during a Sanibel Shell Fair. He stayed at Island Inn. I happened to be chairman of the Fair at the time so Jerry Powell took an everywhere in her station wagon and she saw to it that he didn't miss anything!

So Sanibel has been fortunate in having proper publicity!

PLAN VACATION NOW URGES HIGHWAY PATROL

"Plan your trip and work your plan" is the suggestion offered by the Florida Highway Patrol for a happy and safe vacation this Summer.

"Vacationers need to start right now to map out a route that is really a vacation and not a deadly grind with the crowding of too many hours behind the wheel," said Colonel H.N. Kirkman, Director of the Department of Public Safety.

From 300 to 400 per day or about seven hours of steady driving is the safe maximum distance and time, that should be figured in planning a balanced vacation trip. Any more than this means either too many hours behind the wheel or too fast

an average speed for safe driving.

Kirkman continued, "Driving in daylight hours is highly recommended because statistics show that the fatal accident rate is much higher at night than in the daytime. Advance reservations for overnight stops will eliminate the necessity for hurrying to reach towns or cities before 'no vacancy' signs appear, thus permitting travel at safe and prudent speeds."

Don't become a member of the "legion of the lost," concluded Col. Kirkman. "Use the foresight to leave your planned schedule with a neighbor or relative. Emergencies at home often make it necessary to find you quickly."
