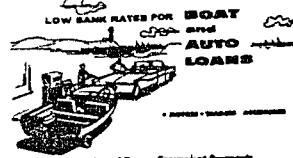

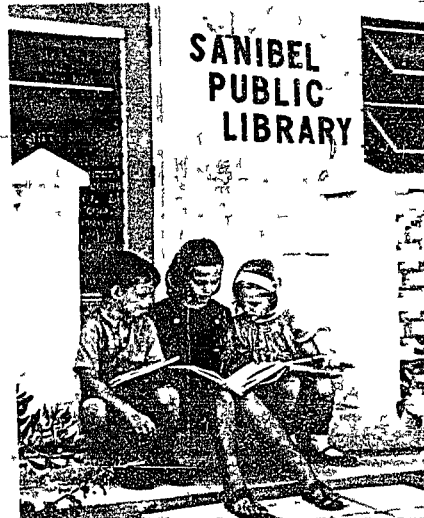

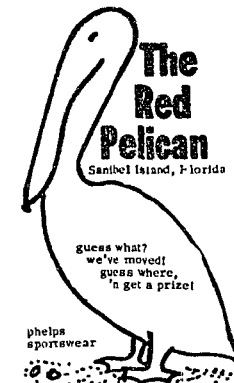

reputed to be King Arthur's.

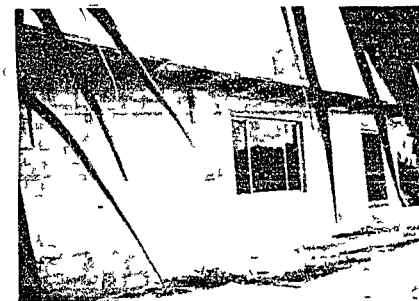
"Another day we drove to

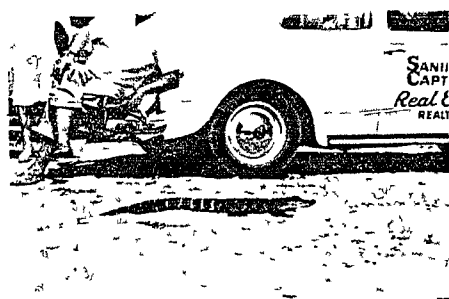

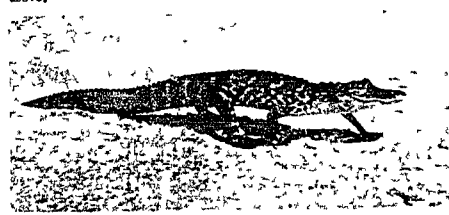
