"THANKS" - BUT MORE NEEDED

The Improvement Committee of the Sanibel Community Association, with approval of the Board of Directors of the Association, has retained Harry A. Blair as attorney to represent residents and property owners on the Islands who do not approve a change in zoning to permit a trailer park in the Sanibel Isles area.

Since the funds of this committee are limited, any donations from residents and property owners who would like to help defray this legal expense will be greatly appreciated and checks should be made out to Sanibel Community Association, Inc., with the notation that such donation be used for this purpose and mailed to E. NEW FAIR FOLDER PLANNED

The new 1968 Sanibel-Captiva Shell Folder will be a completely new departure from previous years. It is designed not only to promote the Shell Fair which will be March 1-2-3, 1968, but to promote tourism in both Islands all year round.

It will be a 2 color broadside 16 x 18 which will fold down to the standard size of 4x9. It will fit accepted standard display racks and is suitable in a #10 envelope. An imprint space 4 x 1 3/4" is provided on the back cover for distributors of these folders to imprint their name, address and message by rubber stamp or have them individually imprinted in type.

The folder is a beautiful picture story of the Islands and the Fair. It will be ready for distribution in October which gives all those businesses who are backing the folder by subscription a years promoter.

The Sanibel Community Association is producing 25,000 copies for distribution and it is projected that an additional 25,000 will be distributed by Chambers of Commerce, air lines serving the "Sunshine Coast," rental car companies and travel agents.

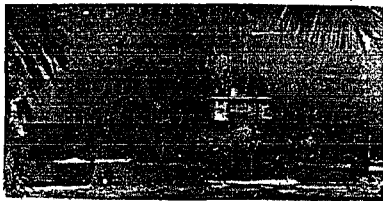
It is most important for Island businesses to call Mr. Gerald Martin at OP 2-4911 to get their copy to him. The deadline was July 15 but has been extended for the accommodation of the few remaining unsubscribed businesses on the two Islands who will want to be represented. It costs \$15 for a two line representation in the folder or \$20 for three lines. It is not possible to reconstruct all businesses or extend the deadline more than another week in order to meet the October distribution date.

Mr. Jimmie Yeomans, Chairman Lee County Zoning Board In Re Proposed 51 Ace Tractor Park to be Built on Sanibel Island

Dear Mr. Yeomans

As Sanibel Island property owners, Mrs. Lerch and I wish to strongly object to the granting to the above project promoters of permission to build and operate such a trailer park.

Mrs. Lerch and I have owned gulf frontage on West Gulf Dr. since 1952 and completed the building of our winter home on that property in 1959. The original purchase of the property and the building of that winter residence was prompted by our desire to get away from the crowds on the east coast of Florida and many places along the west coast, and to have a location where there would be a small occupancy per acre.

By maintaining these features with proper zoning on Sanibel Island, this would of course result in no "honky-tonk" or other over crowded undesirable conditions. By properly developing the island, this would in the long run result in an increased value of all the property on Sanibel Island with consequent greater tax yield.

To permit such a large trailer court population would of course mean that the people occupying that facility would not be satisfied to stay where they are for any length of time and so they would be "spilling over" to various other parts of the island resulting in the loss of privacy for those already owning and occupying property. This in turn would thereby depreciate the value of the property on the island.

With the recent reassessment of property values on the island resulting in such tremendous increases in real estate taxes, this in turn depreciates the value of the property. The overcrowding of the beaches from the addition of a large trailer park would cause further depreciation of property values, with the elimination of further building of nicer homes which carry higher values for tax purposes.

Your earnest consideration of our views, which coincide with those of many others on the island, would be greatly appreciated.

We do not need a paid employee from the Mosquito Control to take bite count every night on Sanibel. The residents do this free of charge and unwillingly 24 hours a day, and I am sure we can find an adding machine where the total is too big to handle off hand.

Fort Myers is a paradise free of mosquitoes. I enjoy outdoor picnics, and shopping days free of repellent and mosquito bites. Congratulations to Mr. Miller.

As my friends in Fort Myers are bragging, the fogging planes spray the city every morning without fail. (They live on McGregor Blvd.) Every morning at 7:45, motorists see a fog of insecticide cover the city like the smog covers Los Angeles. You can smell it too! The last time the planes fogged sparingly Sanibel was on the 4th of July.

According to our official tax collection rates, everybody in Lee County contributes the same amount for Mosquito Control. So, why does only Fort Myers benefit from the daily plane fogging?

Since we are building Permanent Mosquito Control Quarters, there may be a need for Permanent mosquitoes, and a breeding center too! These you will find on Sanibel. We are a bird sanctuary, but should we also be a mosquito, gnar and horse fly sanctuary too?

Our old residents tell me of the good old scratching days, when the skeeters were really bad, but in those days, skeeters were tax-free too.

Since we are in the mood for petitions, let's have one to request that the planes fog at least once a week against the daily fogging of Fort Myers and get some return on our resident tax payer money, and a reduction of our bite count.

"WHAT DO WE DO, OTHER THAN . . ."

Prompted by such query from a member of the Board of Directors of the Sanibel Community Association, the rest of the question "have the Shell Fair, covered fish suppers and game night?"

Since its inception, the Sanibel Community Association chartered in 1954, has striven to be a force for good in the island's community. It has, at times, provided a meeting place for every church on the island. Through the years it has always been open for any meetings for the general good of the islands.

When a hurricane impends it is stocked with water and food to provide a haven for any in need. It provides a free clinic room for the county health nurse who comes monthly to the island. The Sanibel Community Chamber of Commerce came into being within its walls where for many years it was given space until the Chamber built its own facilities. The Sanibel Public Library was originally sponsored within the Sanibel Community Assoc., and was given free space until it outgrew such space and was financially able to provide its own quarters.

It provided free office space and loaned part of the necessary funds to get the Island Water Association underway. It provides a meeting place for other civic, fraternal, scientific and social organizations at a very nominal fee to help defray expenses. Each March it stages the Sanibel Shell Fair which attracts thousands of visitors to the island. It has sponsored a blood bank.

It provides trash receptacles on which is lettered the word PLEASIE, in strategic spots on the island, and the pick-up from such receptacles in an effort to keep our islands beautiful. At present the Improvement Committee hires a man to even pick up the rubbish that somehow seems to get scattered outside the receptacles. These are only a few of

the many projects in which your Sanibel Community Association either has been, or is engaged.

It is suggested that each member clip this and keep it for reference when you invite someone to join and the query is "What do we do, etc."

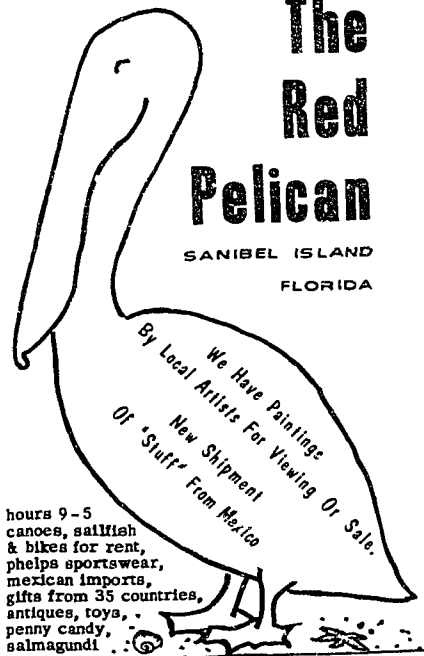

Mr. and Mrs. STUART LANKTON of Delray Beach are guests at Hurricane House, on one of their many visits to Sanibel. Mr. Lankton, accompanied by his father, made his first visit to Sanibel in 1907. Mr. Lankton said his father wanted to come to Sanibel at that time because he had been told that marsh rabbits were so thick here that you didn't need a gun. . . All you needed was a big monkey wrench which he hurled into the bush, went in, found the wrench and picked up your rabbit.
Young Lankton, then only a boy of six was just recovering from a bad attack of whooping-cough and father felt that the salubrious climate of Sanibel was just what the boy needed. So they packed up and took a train from Lakeland to Fort Myers. Mr. Lankton recalled that the cars were the old wooden ones and drawn by steam engines, of course, and that they were delayed when they ran into a tremendous forest fire which caused trees to occasionally fall across the tracks. The train crew had to get out and hack up the trees and pull them off the track each time before they could proceed. They took a horse and buggy to Kinsey's Pier, then they went by boat to Bailey's Pier.
Finally having arrived on Sanibel they took lodgings at a house on the bayside next door to the Post Office on the Duell property. This establishment was known as the Sanibel Boarding House and was run by Mrs. Lucy Richardson, the daughter of Mr. William S. Reed, Postmaster at that time, the building is no longer there. Mr. Lankton remembers the old wagon roads, being the only kind there were then, and the fun a boy of six could have on the beach and in the water and the awe, wonder and maybe a little fright, when across the beach he saw a shark, and the fact that he wasn't a bit interested in snells. But the thing that impressed him the most was the tremendous number of fiddler crabs skittering sideways across the beach the sands were literally covered with the odd but beautiful little creatures in those days. No longer are they seen in such quantities.

The Lanktons have made their home at Delray for the past fifteen years and have been to Sanibel about fifty times during that time. They have seen many changes. Mr. Lankton said, and most of them for the good of the Islands. His only fear is that the landowners now here may not be able to keep it that way.
Having heard that Mr. Lankton is a very experienced in planning and zoning we asked him what we could do to accomplish this. He said he would suggest that the Islanders get together and hire a professional planner to develop an over-all comprehensive plan in order to control high rise buildings, proper road lay-outs, development of parks and preservation of beaches for public use and many other items.

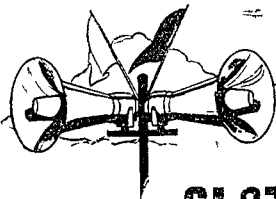
