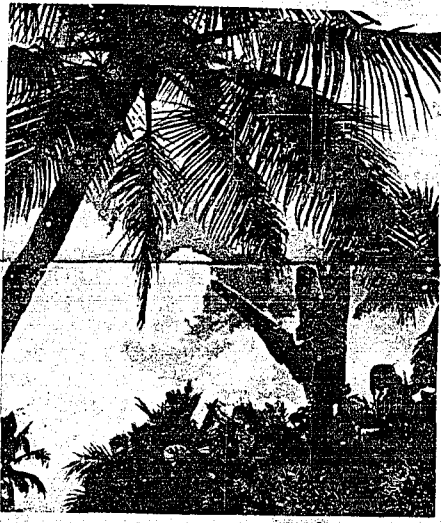

Applications are now being accepted, and will be, until August 22, the U.S. Civil Service Commission has announced. Details as to procedure, requirements, qualifications, etc. can be obtained at the Sanibel Postoffice, where the notice is posted on the bulletin board. The position pays \$7,088 a year; a written test is required and applicants must have resided within the delivery area of the Sanibel Postoffice for one year immediately preceding the closing date for applications. Efforts are being made to see that the County Commissioners do not place the trailer park application to go before the Zoning Board on August 28, on the agenda for the September meeting of the Commissioners. This resulted from a meeting of 35 members of the Interested Citizens Committee, held at the home of Admiral and Mrs. Carlos Cardeza, Monday, July 24, 7:30 p.m. As a result a torneys representing this group, Mr. Michael Jackson of Stewart and Stewart, and the Sanibel Community Association, Mr. Harry Blair of Blair and Anderson, are petitioning that zoning and commissioners hearings not be held at a time when the large majority of islanders may be off the islands on vacations.

Islanders are urged to write letters to this effect, and to send copies of such letters to all officials concerned, not just of the Commissioner, or just the Zoning Board. List of those to whom any letters on the trailer park issue should be sent is given in the article on this page. At the meeting of the Interested Citizens Committee, Dr. Mary Elizabeth Schlayer (Mrs. Cardeza) who presided as chairman pro-tem, presented a history of the battle against the trailer park application and Attorney Michael Jackson of Stewart and Stewart answered questions from the floor.

Additional contributions were solicited so that the attorneys may represent the maximum number of donors, which will strengthen their position before the Commissioners. Call Mrs. Cardeza or G.T. Martin regarding contributions to the two attorneys' fees.

The Committee voted unanimously to have Mrs. Cardeza continue as chairman and give her authority to name an executive committee that will select a successor when she leaves Sanibel in September. Proceedings were taped and the tapes will be made available to any members of the committee who could not attend the meeting.

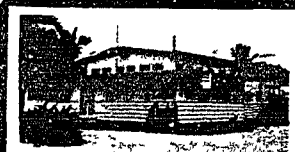

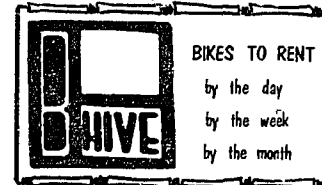

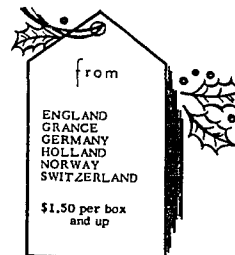
