## EVERGLADES AUDUBON

About thirty members of the Audubon Society of the Everglades, with headquarters at West Palm Beach, visited Sanibel and Captiva from November 10 to 12. Most used the camping facilities of Periwinkle Trailer Park, and some stopped at other Island resorts. Long and rewarding hours were spent touring "Ding" Darling Wildlife Sanctuary, and other localities offering the opportunity to observe the Island's excellent wildlife assets.

The party was welcomed and escorted by Mario F. Hutton, President of the Sanibel - Captiva Audubon, who on the evening of Saturday, November 11, entertained the visitors with a special showing of one of his "photo - verse" slide programs.

The visit of the Everglades Audubon was the first in a series of tours by several Florida Chapters scheduled for the coming winter months. The visits will take place in acceptance of the cordial invitation extended to all Chapters at the recent Grand Bahama Leaders Conference. It is expected that playing host to such groups will contribute notably, throughout the entire State, to the better knowledge and appreciation of Sanibel and Captiva's unique place in the field of Florida's natural resources and scenic beauty.



Mrs. Hills suggests to other beach-combers to "leave sleeping eels lie."



**SEA CHEST**

I'm convinced that you have more opportunities to see wild-life while traveling along the waterways by boat than by any other method. There's not enough boat traffic in the unsettled areas to drive the animals away and if you're traveling slow and not making much noise they'll just watch you go by.

We came on a deer once that was alarmed at our approach but couldn't climb the steep bank to escape. I'm glad we were just looking and not hunting. If you watch carefully, you'll see raccoons down by the water washing their food before eating it. I've often wondered why they wash everything.

When we were on our way to Florida several years ago, we noticed a strange thing around Charleston, South Carolina. A large number of the sea gulls had only one leg. A few of them had no legs at all. I couldn't believe my eyes so I got out the binoculars and focused down on some close ones. They certainly were missing one or more legs. The logical explanation is that fish in the area had bitten them off. But I've never seen so many gulls with missing legs in any other place. Why do the fish (if this is really the explanation) bite off so many gulls legs in the Charleston area? The missing legs didn't seem to handicap the birds much.

Speaking of birds, have you ever watched the behavior of pelicans? Everybody in Florida has seen these birds catch fish by sort of collapsing in the air and diving into the water with break-neck force. But I've also watched them cooperating in a group to catch fish. They'll swim along in a rough line towards shore, ducking their heads under water every so often and coming up with fish.

Pretty soon the line breaks up and they all take off and fly over to another spot. Then the whole business starts all over again. You wouldn't think they'd have sense enough to work together like that. I suppose you've seen gulls fly up in the air with a heavy clam and drop it on the road to break it open so that they could get at the meat. Birds are not so dumb.

Porpoises will get together sometimes and cooperate for fishing purposes. We lived

aboard in a cove near Cape Kennedy for awhile and in the evening it wasn't unusual at certain times of the year for a half dozen porpoises to enter the cove and really start a commotion.

It was usually after dark when we'd hear a thump on the side of the boat and then it would rock from wave action. We'd go on deck and we could see the surface of the water from the reflection of the lights from the streets and businesses. The water was only four or five feet deep so the porpoises couldn't go deep. We'd see two or three mounds of water turn towards us and when they were still 25 or 30 feet away, there would be mullet jumping all over the place. The mounds of water on the surface, caused by the speeding porpoises, would turn away from our boat when only a few feet away. They'd sometimes hit the bottom of the boat with their flukes, they'd come so close.

What the porpoises were doing was a herding operation. They'd get together and chase the fish in towards shore where there was some kind of pocket that made escape difficult. When they'd bunched the fish in close, they'd dive in and gorge on mullet with much blowing and splashing. They seemed to be having a ball and we always enjoyed watching them.

In this same cove I saw two small (about three feet) alligators swim by the boat one morning while I was shaving. At first all I saw was two knobs side-by-side followed by a rough line of other knobs. Then I noticed another group of knobs following the first. I never saw them again.



**DON'T DRIVE PEEK-A-BOO ON FALL MORNINGS**

Don't be a Peek - A - Boo driver warns the Florida Highway Patrol in calling attention to cool Fall mornings when fogged up car windows make driving hazardous.

"This time of the year drivers frequently find a heavy coat of dew on their vehicles in the mornings," said Col. H.N. Kirkman, Director of the Department of Public Safety, "and they should make a practice of cleaning windows all around and not just atart down the road with vision limited to the area cleaned by the windshield wipers."

The Patrol Commander explained that early morning fog is also very frequent now and reminds drivers that Florida law requires headlights be used in fog, smoke or rain. "Good visibility is the first step to safe driving, so why make a rough job rougher by driving blind," said Kirkman.


**THE SHELL TABLE**






