## CONSERVATION CONFERENCE

Climaxing the conservation conference February 6, sponsored by the Sanibel-Captiva Conservation Foundation, Inc., will be a dinner for more than 75 invited guests, at the Coconut Grove Restaurant, 6:30 p.m.

Feature of the evening will be talks by Dr. John Gottschalk, Director, Bureau of Sport Fisheries & Wildlife, U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service, Washington, D.C.; Dr. Joseph J. Shomon, Director, Nature Centers Division, National Audubon Society, New York, N.Y.; and Dr. Manley Boss, Chairman, Department of Biological Services, Florida Atlantic University, Boca Raton, Fla.

Invitations are being sent to the heads of island organizations and conservation groups, conservation groups throughout Lee County, Senators Holland and Smathers, Congressmen Rogers and Haley, County Commissioners, other officials of the State of Florida and Lee County, and other people closely connected with work on the "Ding" Darling Sanctuary and conservation efforts on our Islands.

The conference itself will have working members from groups that are directly concerned with the past and future of the "Ding" Darling Sanctuary, and proposals for a Nature Center and research facilities, to be coordinated with U.S. Fish & Wildlife operations of

## NEW POST OFFICE TO BE BUILT

Postmaster General Lawrence F. O'Brien announced that a contract has been awarded to build a Post Office at Sanibel.

The building will be owned by the Scott-Florida Company, Inc., who will rent it to the Post Office Department for five years with renewal options running through fifteen years. Preliminary estimates indicate that the initial investment in the project will total approximately \$14,460.00.

This represents the lowest responsive bid of six received by the P.O. Department on a competitive basis.

The new one-story building will be air-conditioned and offers more working room than the present building. It will have an interior space of 1,200 square feet, compared with a total of 600 square feet in the present building.

The new post office is expected to be completed by approximately April 1, 1968. Space in the present building will then be abandoned for postal purposes.

Postmaster General O'Brien explained that the additional space and equipment will mean greater efficiency in line with President Johnson's directive to provide the best possible postal service at the least possible cost.

Mr. O'Brien said "The nation is experiencing a dramatic expansion in mail volume and services. Post Office construction and remodeling are undertaken in areas showing the most urgent needs."



#### ALLEN T. WEEKS

Allen T. Weeks died Sunday, January 7.

Mr. Allen was one of the best known residents on Captiva Island. He was a descendant of New England forebears who owned one of the great New Bedford whaling firms (Swift & Allen). He and his wife became year around residents on the Island in 1934. Conditions, of course, were considerably more primitive then than they are today, but as a graduate of MIT he was equipped to deal with many of them.

Mr. Weeks was instrumental in getting the first paved road on the Islands. He was deeply concerned with the welfare of the Islands, especially with wild life conservation, and with the halting of erosion, projects to which he gave a great deal of time.

For twenty years he was a volunteer Cooperative Observer for the Federal Weather Bureau which required daily temperature and rainfall reports. He also made a comprehensive study of hurricanes many of which he went through in his years on Captiva.

He had a great love of the sea and was well known along the New England coast and as an experienced yachtsman he was one of the founding members of the Cruising Club of America.

A grave side service for Mr. Weeks was held at Memorial Gardens in Fort Myers and a Memorial Service at the Chapel by the Sea on Captiva, both services conducted by Dr. Guthrie Speers.

#### CYPRESS LAKE P.T.A.

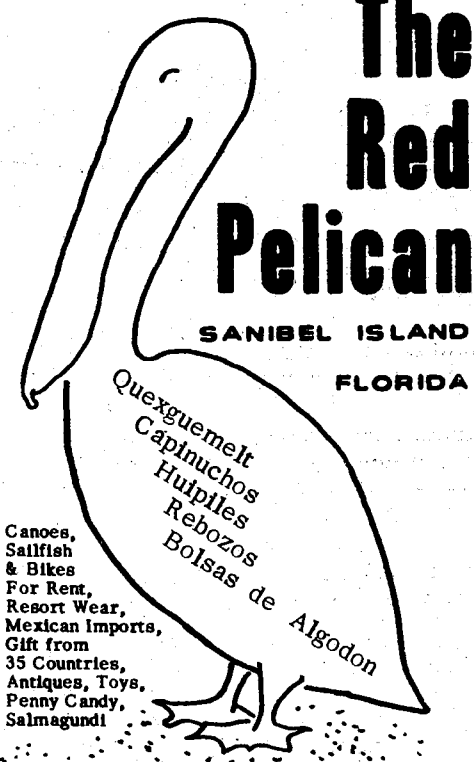

## FLOWERING SHRUBS FOR COLOR AND CHARM

Now is a very picturesque season in Florida, for Azaleas are in full bloom over much of the state, and the masses of gorgeous color are thrilling to visitors and home folks alike. Floridians who garden are fortunate, for in most of the state, Azaleas like an acid soil, and are easily adapted to our climate, producing bloom in abundance for our winter and spring color.

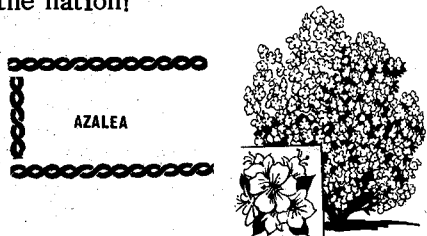
If you live on a seacoast, or in a limerock area, Azaleas will prove more difficult to grow. However, if you can prepare your soil and use an acid type plant food, you can grow them---but if you live in areas where Azaleas do not thrive, you can grow other plants for masses of color that do well in your type of soil and climatic conditions.

For example, a grouping of Ixora in full bloom can add the same mass effect as the Azaleas in flower---or a grouping of Gardenias---or Thryallis---or one of many other shrubs.

Successful plantings are the result of planting the right plants in the right place, says President Richard Johnson of the Florida Nurserymen and Growers Association. If you need some suggestions as to what is available in your area to plant in mass plantings for color visit your friendly FNGA nurseryman, who knows his plant material and can recommend the best for your need. Gardeners in Florida are fortunate---there are so many wonderful plants which we can grow---some of them tropical, some hardy, some needing acid soil and others preferring an alkaline soil. There are plants which will thrive under most conditions, so these are the ones with which you should be familiar, for they will give the most satisfaction.

Seasonal variances in climate, moisture, and weather temperatures can cause some variance in blooming periods. Now in Central and South Florida the Flame Vines are magnificent, as well as the Bouganvilleas---somewhat earlier than usual, but none the less beautiful! Bauhinias or Florida Orchids are also in full flower at least a couple of months earlier than usual.

No wonder visitors to Florida are amazed by the many colorful trees, shrubs and vines in full bloom when snow covers the ground in most other parts of the nation!

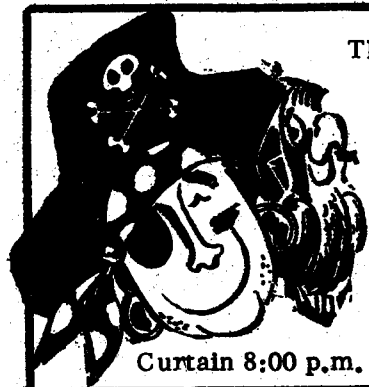

the Sanctuary. Delegates will include Dr. Gottschalk, Mr. Lawrence Givens, Regional Supervisor of the Atlanta, Ga., office of the Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife and two associates; Dr. Joseph J. Shomon and two associates from the National Audubon Nature Centers Division; Dr. Boss; Mr. W.M. Partington, Assistant President, and Mr. George Cooley of Nature Conservancy, Washington, D.C.; Mr. and Mrs. Richard Koss of the J.N. "Ding" Darling Foundation, Des Moines, Iowa; Mr. Terry O'Brien of the Alice M. O'Brien Foundation, St. Paul, Minn. These participants will meet with the 11 members of the local Foundation's Board to consider plans for the Darling Sanctuary and coordinate efforts to achieve common goals.

The conference, and the site and feasibility survey for a Sanibel Nature Center, are being financed from a \$5,000.00 grant to the local Foundation from the Alice O'Brien Foundation. The Nature Center team will spend three days on the Islands in their preliminary study prior to drawing up a comprehensive plan for the Center, if deemed feasible. The project could involve up to a quarter of a million dollars, apart from future U.S. investments in the Sanctuary, and research facilities which may be deemed advisable in the future.
