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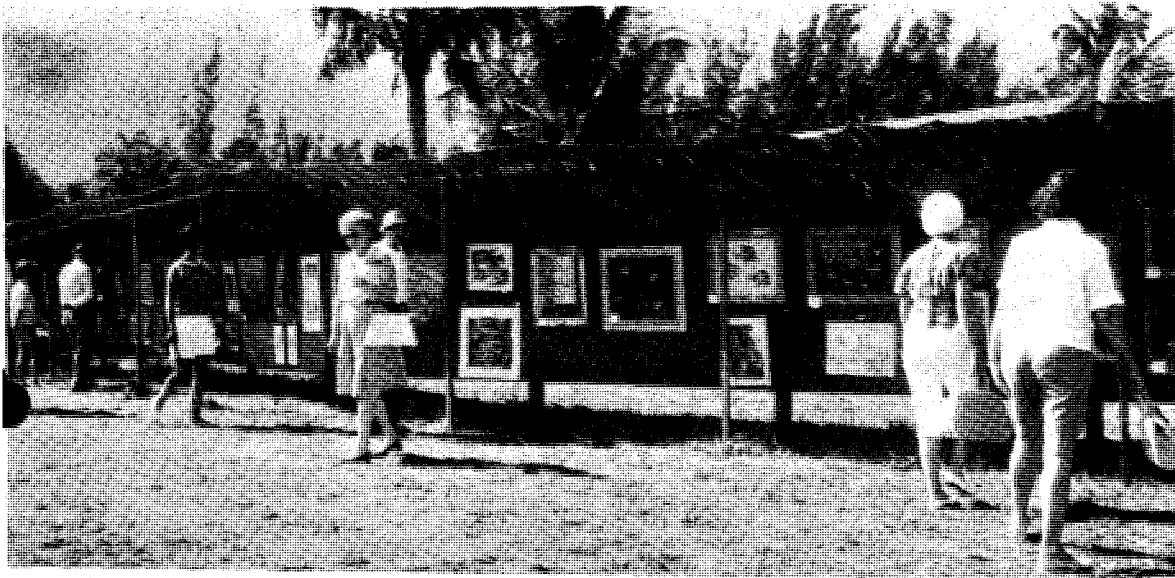

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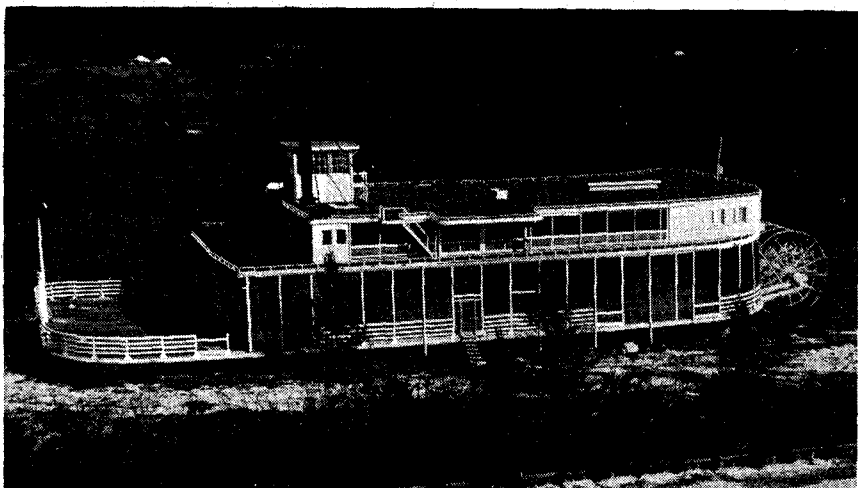
The thirty-first annual Shell Fair opening today at the Sanibel Community House, is the largest in its history, since 146 entries have been accepted for display and competition. This Fair has another first ---it is the first time the exhibits were judged by a husband and wife team. Dr. R. Tucker Abbott of the Philadelphia Museum of Natural Sciences is main judge; his wife is assistant judge.

Grace Horn, Mary Purdy and Dorothy Stearns judged the artistic division. The live exhibit, while fascinating, is not competitive. All winners will be announced in next week's ISLANDER.

The 146 entries, ranging in size from one to eleven cases, should be fascinating, as are all the other extras---the live exhibit, the driftwood booth (which includes shell handicraft), the outdoor art exhibit ---and for the inner man, the snack booth.

Admission is free, there are acres of parking space, and the Shell Fair will be open today, Friday and Saturday from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Amateur photographers are welcome to practice their art between 9-10 a.m. TOMORROW (Friday) morning. The price of admission is to carry a camera---and this will be the best time to take pictures, unhampered by spectators.



Captiva Does It Again; Asbach Takes Best In Show

Hugo Asbach, of the Sanibel-Captiva Art League, captured the Best of Show award at the current Sears Art Council of Southwest Florida Show, it was announced yesterday by Maxine Keegan, chairman of the Show and Edward Lobenstein, Council president, at the Awards ceremonies held in the Edison Mall where the show is now hanging. Over 400 paintings were submitted for the juried and judged Show and of these, 132 were selected to hang, and a goodly number of the chosen ones came from the Sanibel-Captiva area. There must be some subtle artistic emanation on our Islands, or could it be the persons who are here?

Other local winners in the Show include first prize in oils to Oreita McCulloch for her "Hibiscus Giganticus," and an Honorable Mention to Marjorie Reinters with her "Elsie's Studio" in mixed media.

Among other members of the Art League who had their paintings chosen to hang in the show are Jane Bancroft, two of whose paintings were hung, "Halgrim's Garden," and "Sunday." Dodi Booth also with two, "Chicago 1966" and "Creation." Mimi Forstner with her "The Marble Cliffs," (incidentally she is Mrs. Hugo Asbach). Three paintings of Bob Haynie, "The City," "Space Carnival," and "Linea"; three of Leon Levy's pictures were hung, "Woman and Bird," "Journey," and "Drought"; Wilbur Snyder had his "#2 Acrylic" also hung.

Among the prize winners,

Asbach also had two more hung, "Porphyry" and "Watercolor Study." McCulloch had another oil, "Bonne Chance." Judge of the show was the well-known artist from Englewood, Rolph Scarlott.

The three most outstanding paintings in the Show which began yesterday and will continue through Saturday in the Mall will be included with the collection of Contemporary Southern Art for its one year tour of 40 major cities. These paintings are all insured by Lloyds of London and may be sold by the artist on a price-upon-request basis. Delivery will be made only after the tour's close.

Another interesting feature is that purchase of a painting may be placed on a Sears Easy-Payment Account with the artist receiving payment in full immediately.

At the close of each Exhibit Year, the collection's paintings are exhibited at a leading Museum in the South at which time the Best of Show painting, chosen by the judge, will receive a \$1,000 cash prize. Five \$200 cash awards of merit will be presented.

Vincent Price will review and select the outstanding works for possible purchases in depth. The collection will also be reviewed by leading greeting card companies and hotels. A representative collection from all media will also be purchased annually by the museum of the final show for presentation to an art association in the South as a permanent exhibit of Southern Art of the 60's.

NEW WILD LIFE SANCTUARY


At the last meeting of the Sanibel-Captiva Audubon Society it was announced that a new Wildlife Sanctuary operated under the cooperative plan of the Florida Audubon Society has been established on land owned by Admiral Ed and Anne Konrad in the Western section of Sanibel. This forty acre tract is part of the Island's fresh water slough system, and consequently very valuable for its ecological character. It is hoped that other land owners in the same general area may want to increase the size of the refuge through similar arrangements with the local and Florida Audubon Societies.

Roy Bazire, Sanibel realtor and active conservationist, has been elected the new president of the Sanibel-Captiva Conservation Foundation.

Other officers elected at a meeting of the Board of Governors of the Foundation were: vice chairman, Mrs. Ann Winterbotham; secretary, Mrs. Phoebe Haynie; and treasurer, James Jack.

Bazire, former vice chairman, succeeds Mrs. Emmy Lu Lewis, who asked to be relieved of her duties after six years as head of the group. Mrs. Lewis, who received a warm vote of thanks from the meeting, will continue to serve on the board.

The Foundation, successor to the original Ding Darling Memorial Committee which was instrumental in setting up the Ding Darling sanctuary on Sanibel, plans to work closely with the Fish and Wildlife Service and national and local Audubon groups in conservation work and study. To facilitate co-ordination the presidents of the Foundation and of the local Audubon Society will serve on each other's boards.



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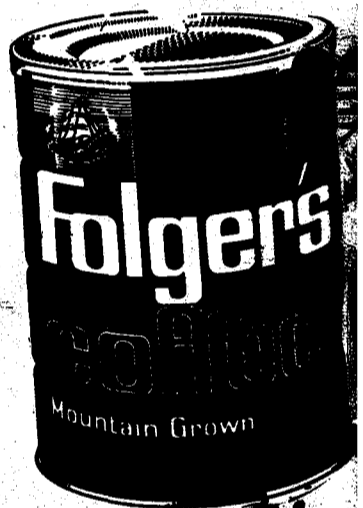

SANIBEL PUBLIC LIBRARY

Seven new books have become available at the Sanibel Public Library, though only one is a novel.

The Glory Tent, a slim book of less than 70 pages, records a new miracle involving Homer Smith, the hero of The Lilies of the Field by William E. Barrett.

The Young Traveler in Canada, by J.H. Ingram, is a second edition of this travelogue across Canada which was first published in 1950.

Winged Warfare, the story of Canadian Ace Lt. Col. William A. Bishop, is a revision of a long out of print account of Col. Bishop's exploits in World War I. The present volume is edited by Stanley M. Ulanoff, author of The Illustrated Guide to U.S. Missiles and Rockets.

Give us the Tools, by Henry Viscardi, Jr., is the story of Mr. Viscardi's work with handicapped people. Severely handicapped himself from birth, Mr. Viscardi has had a successful career in business, and now is founder and president of Abilities, Inc., a firm that employs disabled people.

The Lawyers, by Martin Mayer, is a report on the practice of law in the United States from county courthouse to the Supreme Court.

Animal Gardens, by Emily Hahn, is a tour of the great zoos of the world and their inhabitants. The book unobtrusively traces a history of zoos from the pre-Christian era in China and Egypt to the latest modern structures.

So Excellent a Fishe, by Archie Carr, is a natural history of sea turtles. Laws to protect the turtles were passed as early as 1620, when the slaughter threatened to make them extinct.


Thanks to the sale and recent contributions by Islanders, the library building fund is now within about \$850 of the minimum needed to start building.

ONE WEEK BIRD STUDY SHOW

Ever 'eard of an Erd Bird? We 'adn't until we visited the Artisan Shop on Gulf Drive.

There we found them coming to roost for a special one-week show starting this Sunday, March 10. Their creator, Sarasota artist Dorothy Erd, will have some two dozen studies of island birds on display---all original oil monoprints. In her pictures, sandpipers race, gulls wheel and herons stand at silent attention.

A newcomer to Florida, Mrs. Erd has received numerous first awards at shows in the Chicago area where she lived before moving to Sarasota last year. In 1967 she won first place for Illinois in a national competition sponsored by the General Federation of Woman's Clubs and the Outdoor Advertising Association of America.

Constantly experimenting, Mrs. Erd works in oil, water color, linoleum and wood block, and collage. A frequent visitor to the Islands, she bases most of her bird studies on her Ding Darling observations.

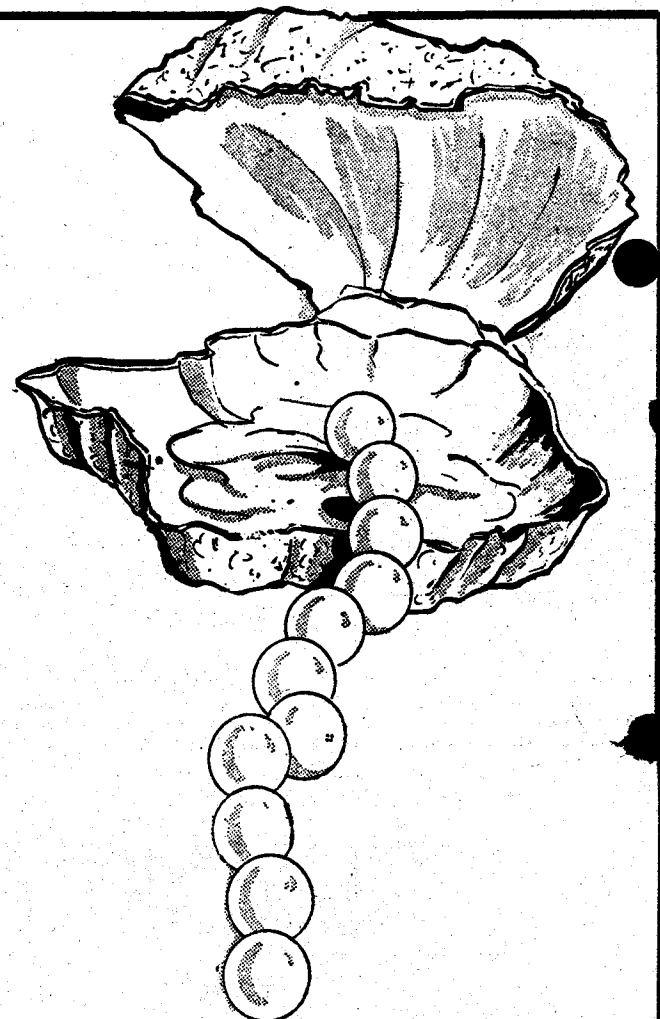
