

Shells valued at several hundred thousands of dollars were displayed in competition at the 31st annual Sanibel Shell Fair. Many entries included shells that are so rare that only a few specimens have ever been found. The competition was keen in almost every category. Dr. Abbott said he'd never thought he'd see the day that he would have to put an Honorable Mention ribbon on one entry that included some of the world's finest.

The artistic exhibits left many viewers with the feeling that many hours of exacting work as well as artistic ability were represented. The entries were an inspiration to all the artistically gifted.

Even the weather man co-operated! The thousands of visitors to the show could enjoy all of the outside exhibits to their fullest. The live exhibits had a constant gallery of lookers. All church members and their friends are invited to attend. BIRDING IN NEW ZEALAND - AUDUBON SUBJECT TONIGHT

An illustrated talk entitled "Birding Safari in New Zealand" will be given by Karen Eastman to the Sanibel-Captiva Audubon Society at the Sanibel Community Center tonight (Thursday). The meeting, which will be open to the public, will start at 8 o'clock.

Mrs. Eastman, who divides her home between Sanibel and Minneapo-lis, is one of the leading birders of the country. She and her husband, Whitney Eastman, are members of the highly exclusive "600 Club," which is limited to people who have observed 600 species of North American birds north of the Mexican border. At present the club has only 19 members, so in the Eastmans Sanibel boasts more than one

tenth of the entire membership. The Eastmans have spent the last 15 years traveling around the world on birding trips. All told they have observed 25 per cent of the world's 8,600 species. To do this they have visited North and South America, Africa, Europe, Australia, the Pacific islands, and Japan.

They are joint authors of many articles in ornithological and conservation publications, based upon their world trips. They are both members and officers of numerous ornithological, Audubon, and birding societies.

Mrs. Eastman has given several programs for the Sanibel-Captiva Audubon Society, and has a considerable following on the Islands. Her talk on birding in New Zealand ties in with a very popular one she gave last winter on birding in Australia.



Leon Levy has given the library an original painting, "October Forest," to be sold for the benefit of the library. The picture is on display at the library building.



I promise a vigorous and intensive campaign to the voters of this district, so that the decision can be made at the local




