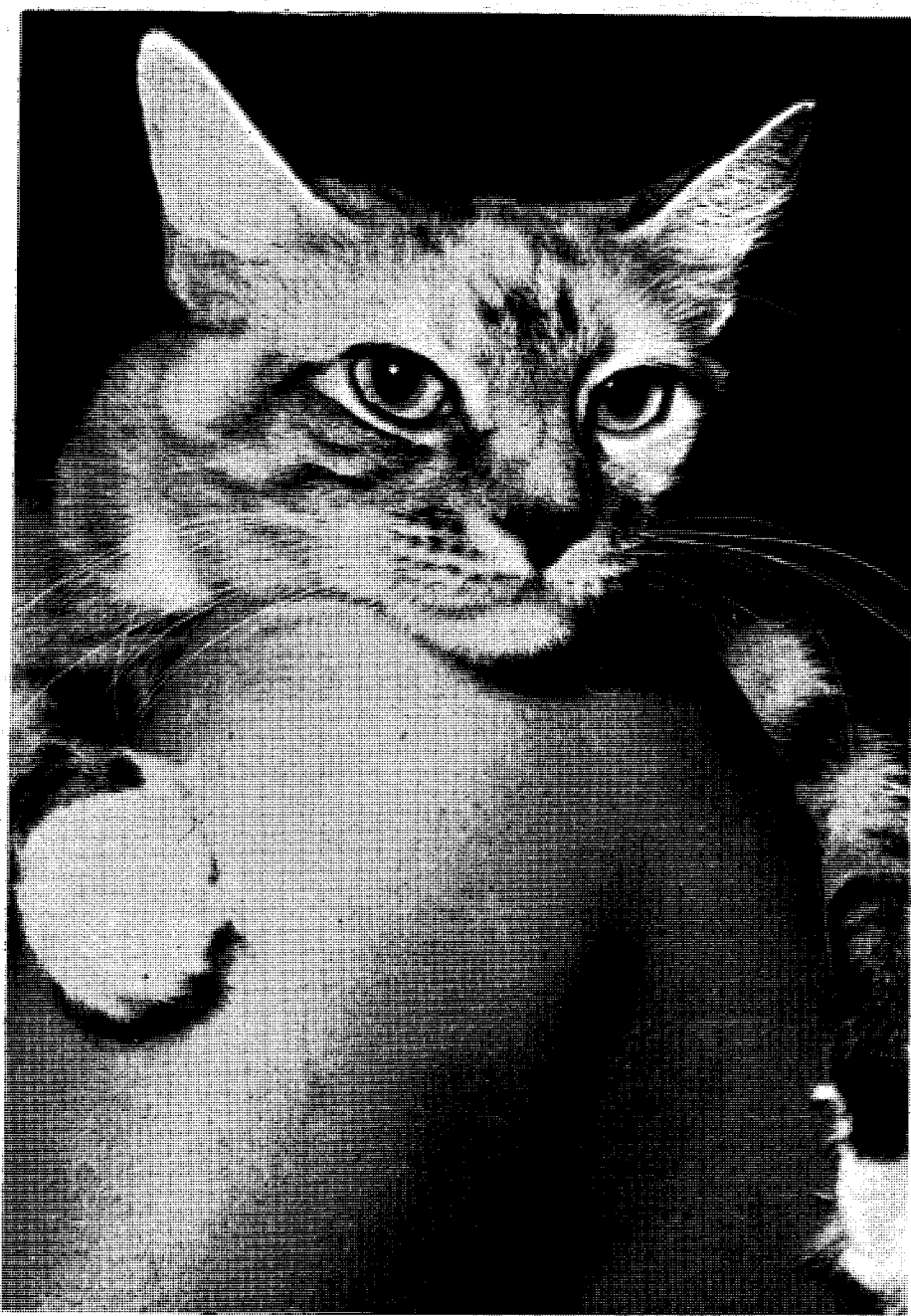

AUDUBON GALA TONIGHT

What promises to be one of the highlights of the season is in store for those attending the Audubon Society show, to be held tonight at 8 at the Sanibel Community House. Mario Hutton, whose "photo-verse" presentations have attracted national attention and will be shown in New York in May, will offer an almost entirely new hour-long program of slides set to rhyme. It will include three features to be shown for the first time: "Bowman's Beach," a rhymed triptych; "My Lilliputian Cosmos," a lyric composition in two parts; and the intriguingly titled "Days in the Life of a French Model." Other new presentations will be: "Woodmen of the World," "A Mild Case of Nostalgia" and "The Hepsy Generation." By popular demand, Hutton will also show a few episodes of his highly successful "Recapturing Captiva." As usual, all are welcome.



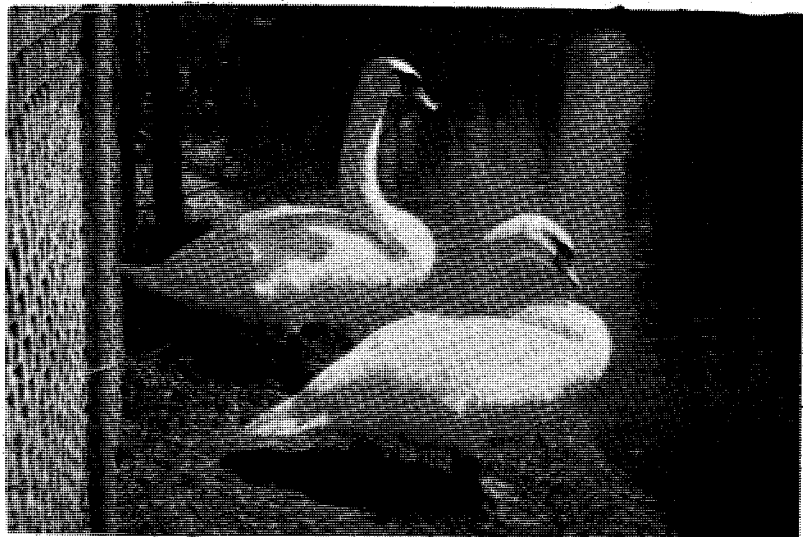

FLORIDA GARDENING

Is there a bare corner in your home, your business building or your industrial plant that needs "something"? Nothing is more attractive than a low planter filled with colorful tropical foliage plants arranged in pyramidal fashion to form an interesting pattern against the wall, says President Richard Johnson of Florida Nurserymen and Growers Association.

In selection of plants for such a planter you will want an accent plant. This might be a tall palm, a bold-leaved sea-grape, or a fiddle-leaved Ficus Pandurata---or even an orange tree! This is your "piece de resistance" or accent plant. In selecting other plants you will want to select plants for contrast in foliage shape, size, and color---and it may range from the bold-leaved Philodendron to the fern-like pilea!

Color harmony and color contrast are important. You will need some glossy green foliage, some variegated foliage, some gaily colored foliage. Since this plant is to add life and vibrancy to the room you will want to try several plants to make sure the arrangement is working out well.

When selecting plants for planters, compatibility has to be considered. Most people have an idea that compatibility is a term used in divorce courts, but plants, to be as beautiful as

they should be, must also be compatible. It is not wise to plant plants that need lots of water in a planter where there are plants that should be kept on the dry side. If you are not sure as to what plants are compatible in sun and moisture requirements, then you should consult with your FNGA nurseryman. He can help you select those that will give the proper effect to your planting, and yet thrive under the same care.

Many people do not remove the plants from the pots, but plunge the pots into the peat moss or fill soil and feed and water each plant individually. This takes a bit more time. If you are careful to get compatible plants, you can plant them into the planter and care for them all at the same time ---and usually these plants will maintain loveliness longer, since they have root space to expand.

TED RANDELL ANNOUNCES

Rep. Ted Randell announced this week that he would seek re-election to the Florida House of Representatives. In announcing his decision, Rep. Randell stated, "My terms in office have been a challenge which I have enjoyed. I am proud of my record and will offer a review of my accomplishments for the consideration of the voters."

Elected for the first time in 1964, Rep. Randell was re-elected in 1966 and 1967 without opposition. Since the reapportionment of the legislature, Randell has represented Collier, Glades, Hendry, Lee and Monroe Counties. During his successive terms he has served ten sessions of the legislature in Tallahassee.

Rep. Randell presently serves as vice-chairman of the Committee on Salt Water Conservation, vice-chairman of the Committee on Game and Fresh Water Fish, member of the Committee on Public Roads and Highways and recently was appointed as chairman of the Legislative Council Committee on Fresh Water Management. Rep. Randell has received statewide recognition for legislation which he sponsored in the fields of conservation and parole and re-habilitation.

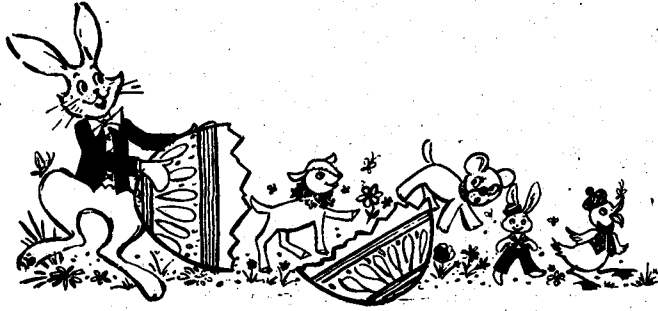

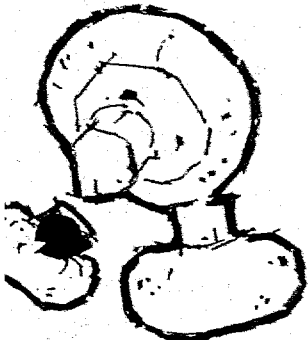

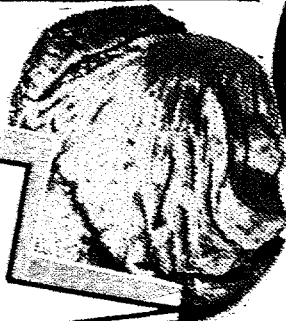

ART LEAGUE**

The Sanibel-Captiva Art League's showing of three movie shorts on Painting Techniques, on Tuesday evening, March 12, at the Captiva Community Center, attracted an audience of about 60 persons, both artists and non-artists, in spite of a heavy downpour of rain.

The audience included a delegation from the Cape Coral Art League, headed by retired

Navy Captain Jack Wilson, past president of the Southwest Florida Art Council, and now a distinguished water-colorist and teacher. Captain Wilson had a more personal interest in the showing than any of the others present, as he had once been a pupil of Elliot O'Hara, whose work and techniques were the subjects of the films being shown.

Mr. O'Hara, who did the running commentary as well as the demonstration of his methods of painting, is a mem-

ber of the National Academy and one of the bestknown water-colorists in the world, and the films were followed with rapt attention by the gathering.

Jane Bancroft of Captiva was in charge of the arrangements and Hervey Roberts, also of Captiva, was the projectionist for the films.

The showing was received with such enthusiasm that a second program has been arranged for on Friday, April 19, at 8:00 p.m., at the Captiva Community Center. This program will feature three more O'Hara short subjects, "Painting Abstracts," "Painting Clouds" and "Painting Reflection on Water." Those interested in seeing these films should put this date down on their calendars at once. The Sanibel-Captiva Art League plans to continue this series of films next year, and will try to cover a broad range of subjects, including oil painting techniques, use of acrylics and other media. On the basis of last Tuesday's experience, it seems probable that these subjects will be of as much interest to non-painters as to the artists themselves.

The public is invited. There is no charge, but small individual voluntary contributions toward the rental cost of the films will be accepted.

MUSICAL RECITAL

An organ and recital of choral music will be given in Saint Michael's Church on Sunday evening, March 24, at 7:30 by the boy choristers of Saint Luke's Church. The boys will sing a varied program of Lenten and passiontide motets. The brilliant organist, Ralph C. Tilden, formerly of Saint Luke's Cathedral will present a program of Bach, Purcell and Buxtehude. All Islanders are cordially invited.

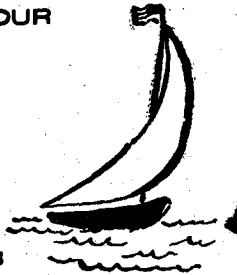



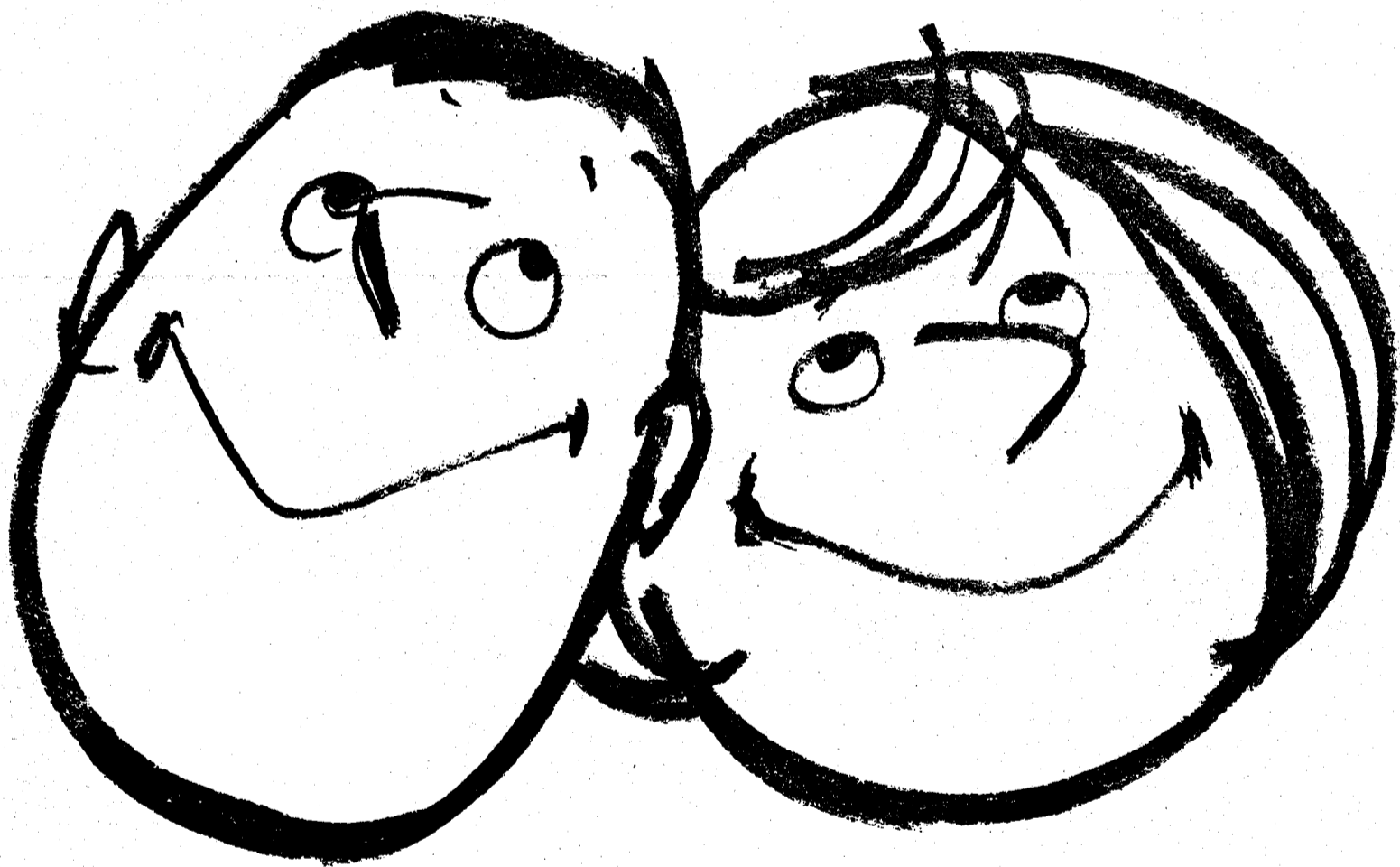
