



# SANIBEL COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION ANNUAL MEETING

### BOOK ON THE EVERGLADES

The Florida Everglades have represented many things to many people for 2,000 years—home, food, livelihood, highway, refuge, fortress, convivial companionship, blessed solitude, startling beauty, sudden death, swift rebirth.

There is something of all of this in "Man in the Ever-glades," by Charlton W. Tebeau (University of Miami Press, Coral Gables, Fla.)

First there were the Calusa and Tequesta Indians, then the Seminoles and white settlers. The earliest Indians built the mounds, dug canals and plied the water routes. Later inhabitants built their dwellings on the mounds and cultivated their gardens there.

Spanish soldiery and missionaries, plunderers and martyrs, moonshiners and farmers, fugitives from justice and bird hunters—and periodic hurricanes—all left their mark on the Everglades.

mark on the Everglades.

Dr. Tebeau, chairman of the history department at the University of Miami and historian extraordinary of Florida, has been tireless in running down the track of man in the Everglades. The present volume is a completely revised edition of Dr. Tebeau's earlier book, "They Lived in the Park." Its value is enhanced tremendously by a profusion of illus-

trations, most of them unique.

The reader is indebted to
the professional historian who
came along to rescue from oblivion the fragile strand of Florida history while there were

still available some of those who knew the colorful personalitites who helped to shape that part of Florida now occupied by Everglades National Park.

Among the stories he tells are those of Ed Watson, the bad man of Chatham Bend on the Florida west coast and onetime associate of Belle Starr, the western outlaw; Arthur Leslie Darwin of Possum Key, in 1967 the last private resident on Everglades National Park lands, who claims he is a fifthgeneration descendant of the naturalist Charles Darwin; and John Gomez of Panther or Gomez Key, who was said to have served with Napoleon Bonaparte and to have been a cabin boy for the pirate Gasparilla and a slaver and blockade runner in the Civil War.

Dr. Tebeau opens his book with a portrait of the Ever-glades; the second chapter is devoted to the Indian population; third, the period of exploration and removal of the Indians from the park region. The next four chapters are given over to specific sections of the park, and the last chapter tells of the birth of the idea and the development of the area as a

national park.
Dr. Tebeau is the author of "Florida's Last Frontier," "Chololoskee Bay Country" and (with Ruby Leach Carson) "Florida from Indian Trails to Space Age." He is currently working on a definitive history

of Florida.
For further information on "Man In The Everglades" by Charlton W. Tebeau, write to Coral Gables, Florida, University of Miami Press. There are 192 pages with illustrations. The cloth bound book is \$4.95 and the paper bound is \$2.95.

### GARDENING NEWS

For example, in Zinnias there is the big bybrid cactus flowering variety known as "Wild Cherry, along with many other varieties of Zinnias ranging from the tiny "Thumbalina" to the Giants that tower tall with flowers of to eight inches across! Other interesting summer annuals include Marigolds, Tithonia, Gloriosa Daisies, Torenia, Gaillardia, Portulaca, Verbena, and others. Matter of fact, Salvia is another beautiful annual for summer plantings. These all are available in marvelous

Annuals may be used in window boxes, hanging baskets, porch or wall boxes, in urns or tubs, for edging, mixed borders and terrace plantings. 

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



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
