


SENTS FOLK CONCERT APRIL 27



## SANIBEL-CAPTIVA CONSERVATION FOUNDATION, INC.


THE SANIBEL-CAPTIVA CONSERVATION FOUNDATION, INC., ISSUED THE FOLLOWING PROGRESS REPORT AFTER THE FEB. 5, 1968, CONSERVATION CONFERENCE AND DINNER:

THE FOUNDATION HAS EXPANDED ITS BOARD TO 15 MEM-BERS, PLUS AN ADVISORY BOARD IN PROCESS OF FORMATION. New OFFICERS HAVE BEEN ELECTED AND WE HAVE MOVED INTO OUR OWN TEMPORARY BUILDING, THE FORMER NATURE, INC., NEAR THE SANIBEL COMMUNITY HOUSE. THIS HAS BEEN AR-RANGED BY MR. KIRKPATRICK, OWNER OF THE PROPERTY.

NATURE ENTERS DIVISION OF NATIONAL AUDUBON SOCIETY HAS REPORTED FAVORABLY ON THE FEASIBILITY OF A NATURE GENTER FOR SANIBEL. OUR BOARD LAST WEEK AUTHORIZED THE NEXT STEP, A COMPREHENSIVE PLAN. THE NATURE GENTERS TEAM, HEADED BY JOSEPH J. SHOMON, DIRECTOR, WILL BE ON SANIBEL AGAIN IN JUNE TO DO THE FIELD WORK FOR THE PLAN.

DR. MANLEY BOSS, HEAD OF THE BIOLOGICAL SCIENCES DEPARTMENT AT FLORIDA ATLANTIC UNIVERSITY, BOCA RATON, AND DR. ANDREW J. MEYERRIECKS, DEPARTMENT OF ZOOLOGY, UNIVERSITY OF FOUTH FLORIDA, TAMPA, HAVE PRESENTED TO THE BOARD PROPOSALS FOR RESEARCH AND EDUCATIONAL PRO-JECTS ON FANIBEL USING FACILITIES AVAILABLE FROM THE FISH & WILDLIFE FERVICE, OUR FOUNDATION, AND OTHER SOURCES. DETAILS WILL BE DETERMINED IN THE NEXT FEW WEEKS.

PRESERVING THE SANIBEL SLOUGH SYSTEM, BROUGHT INTO SHARP FOCUS AT THE CONFERENCE AS A VITAL FACTOR IN THE ISLAND ECOLOGY, IS THE GOAL OF A SPECIAL COMMITTEE OF OUR BOARD. IT IS WORKING WITH NATIONAL AND FLORIDA AUDUBON, GOLLIER COUNTY CONSERVANCY, THE FLORIDA STATE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH, LEE COUNTY MOSQUITO CONTROL, TO DEVELOP PLANS FOR SAVING OUR UNIQUE ISLAND DRAINAGE SYSTEM. IMMEDIATE AIMS WILL BE TO SEEK COOPERATION OF OWNERS OF THIS INLAND AREA IN SETTING ASIDE THEIR LAND



UNDER CONSERVATION EASEMENT AGREEMENTS. THIS WILL AL-LOW TIME FOR FINDING METHODS TO PRESERVE THE SYSTEM AND PROVIDE FOR ITS ORDERLY DEVELOPMENT TO YIELD MAX-IMUM PROFIT TO THE OWNERS WITH MINIMUM LOSS OF THE SLOUGH SYSTEM ITSELF.

WE ARE CONTINUING TO WORK WITH THE U.S. FISH & WILDLIFE SERVICE ON OUR FIRST GREAT PROJECT---THE J.N. "DING" DARLING SANCTUARY, AND WE ARE WORKING FOR THE ADDITION OF SANCTUARY LANDS ON THE ISLAND CHAIN.

WE ARE CONDUCTING A MEMBERSHIP CAMPAIGN, ENLISTING THE SUPPORT OF THOSE WHO HAVE EXPRESSED AN INTEREST IN THE PAST. EXTENSIVE MEMBERSHIP CAMPAIGNING AND FUND RAISING WILL COME LATER, WHEN OUR PLANS---NOW BEING INVESTIGATED AND CONSIDERED---ARE FINALLY SET.

FUNDS DEPOSITED WITH THE J.N. "UING" DARLING FOUN-DATION IN DES MOINES, IOWA, AND EARMARKED FOR USE ON "ANIBEL BY OUR PREDECESSOR, THE J.N. "UING" DARLING MEMORIAL COMMITTEE, ARE TO BE TRANSFERRED TO US. WE ARE GRATEFUL TO THE PARLING FOUNDATION FOR THEIR FULL COOPERATION IN THE PROCESS OF TRANSFORMING THE COM-MITTEE INTO THE FOUNDATION.

FLORIDA, WHOSE LARGEST NATURAL RESOURCE IS WATER, IS NOW IN A STATE OF DROUGHT WHICH THREATENS ALL WILD LIFE AND ULTIMATELY, MAN HIMSELF.

REPRESENTATIVE TED RANDELL, CHAIRMAN OF THE FLORIDA LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL, MET WITH 12 SENATORS AND REPRESEN-TATIVES AT THE EVERGLADES NATIONAL PARK TO FIND OUT SOME OF THE PROBLEMS FACING THEM.

THE WATER SUPPLY FOR THE SOUTHERN HALF OF FLORIDA COMES FROM THE KISSIMMEE AREA WHICH EMPTIES INTO LAKE OKEECHOBEE. FROM THIS VAST BODY OF WATER ARE MANY CANALS WHICH DIRECT THE WATER TO AGRICULTURE AND TO CITIES (SUCH AS THE RECENT DEVELOPMENT OF THE LEE COUNTY TIE-IN TO THE GALOOSAHATCHEE RIVER ABOVE FORT MYERS).

ANY WATER LEFT OVER GOES ON DOWN TO THE EVERGLADES. AND THE EVERGLADES TAKES IN A VAST AREA OF SOUTH FLORIDA.

THIS SMALL AMOUNT OF WATER HAS EVEN BEEN TURNED OFF COMPLETELY AT TIMES AND FLUSHED OUT THROUGH THE CALOOSA-HATCHEE ON THE WEST COAST AND THE CANALS OF THE EAST COAST.

WHEN YOU COUPLE THIS WITH A NATURAL DROUGHT, THE VERY EXISTANCE OF THE WILD LIFE IN THE EVERGLADI'S IS IN DANGER.

WITHOUT ENOUGH WATER THE ALLIGATORS HAVE CROWDED INTO THE MUCKY POT-HOLES FOR SURVIVAL. THIS IS THE WAY IT AL-WAYS WORKED UNTIL MAN, INCLUDING POACHERS, GOT INTO THE ACT. IT IS QUITE EASY FOR A POACHER TO SHOOT OR KULL THE ENTIRE POPULATION OF AN AREA IN A NIGHT OR TWO. THE HIDES, WHICH ARE ONLY THE BELLY SKIN, BRING ABOUT \$6.00 PER FOOT. <sup>A</sup>ND, AS EASY AS IT IS FOR THE POACHERS, REGRET-FULLY, IT IS EQUALLY AS HARD TO DO ANYTHING ABOUT THEM.

WHEN THE 'GATOR IS GONE FROM A HOLE, IT FILLS WITH AQUATIC WEEDS WHICH, IN A SHORT TIME, COMPLETELY FILL THE DEEP HOLES WHICH THEN CANNOT EVEN HARBOR THE TINY FISH WHICH ARE THE NEXT LINK IN THE CHAIN OF SURVIVAL.

WHEN THE HOLES ARE GONE AND WITH THEM THE FISH AND THE FROGS AND THE SNAKES AND SNAILS AND THE INSECTS, THEN THE BIRDS DIE OFF BECAUSE THERE IS NO FOOD FOR THEM.

IN THAT END, IF AN ANSWER IS NOT DEVELOPED IMMEDI-ATELY, MAN WILL RULE OVER THE FISH IN THE SEA, THE FOWL OF THE AIR, AND OVER EVERY CREEPING THING THAT CREEPETH UPON THE EARTH---BUT ONLY ON PAPER. AN EXTINCT ANIMAL OR PLANT CANNOT BE RECREATED BY MERE MAN.

THE SHARK RIVER SLOUGH IN THE EVERGLADES NATIONAL PARK IS PROBABLY THE AMERICAN ALLIGATOR'S LAST CHANCE FOR SURVIVAL. AND THE SLOUGH'S OWN CHANCE FOR SURVIVAL IS NOW IN DANGER.
