Don't forget to vote Tuesday, May 28.








NOTICE TO ADVERTISERS



Continuation of last week's story "Islander Returns for a Visit."

As was mentioned in last week's article the first home that the Knowles' family had was built of Palmetto. This shack had a dirt floor, where the young Bob played many happy hours. His mother went down to the beach and brought white sand to spread on the floor, with this and shells, she succeeded in covering the black dirt. This first Island home of their own was destroyed by fire.

When young Bob reached the age of four, or four and one half, his father was working on his own, cutting buttonwood into stove lengths, loading it into a sailboat, and delivering it to Fort Myers. Sometimes this trip would take as long as a week, as the rate of progress was governed by the winds, which as we all know can be very fickle. Bob and his mother went along on these trips occasionally and their bed at night was a mattress spread on the deck, but what good sleeping! One recollection that he has of one of these trips is when the Boom came came around, striking the father and knocking him overboard. Luckily the water was only about neck deep and his father managed to scramble back aboard. Can't you just hear young Robert breathing a sigh of relief to see his father safely back aboard? This was the family's source of livelihood for a while.

When mother and son remained home, they never knew just when Mr. Knowles would return, and many times they would walk to the shore and watch for a sail on the horizon, and when one hove into view, then they rejoiced to know he had made a safe return.

One recollection of Mr. Knowles' is of attending a religious service with the Bryant family on another island. Their method of transportation was by boat, and as they were proceeding along the wind arose and blew quite hard, they were all sitting on the high side, and someone said, "Robert, sit hard," his reply was, "I is sitting hard."

Another time he and his parents were in a rowboat when a big fish came up under the boat and began to nuzzle it, which to a small boy was quite frightening, but since it did not seem to disturb his father at all, he gradually became calm again.

A little later his father built a home on Buck Key. This was originally homesteaded by H.P. Knowles, young Bob's grand-father. The house was built by the side of the dock, and the house was built over the water. His playground at this time was the dock, and his playmate a little girl named Ann Brainerd. One day as they were playing together on the dock, using a grocery box as his boat, a stick nailed to one end for a mast, and a rag tied to it for sail, as all good sailors must, he climbed the mast, it toppled over and so did young Bob. The water was about six feet deep, and the tide fast going out. Young Ann nonchalantly walked to the kitchen door and said, "Mrs. Knowles, Robert tumbled overboard. Quickly his mother ran by his grandmother's room, grabbed her, then to the dock where she found her son clinging to a piling. Mother looked over, son looked back, and then he spoke, "Oh, my Lord," Mother replied,
"Oh, you're alright," and the with grandmother's aid he was rescued from the briny deep, just as wet as a drowned rat. After that he sat around in the house for several days in a deep study, having been told that the big fish in the water would eat him, he marveled at his escape. and that was the last time he fell overboard.

#### CHILDREN'S HOME NEEDS **DRIVERS**



Bailey Road Opposite the Standard Station the "Vin Fiz," is the first story written for children published by the Smithsonian Institution Press of Washington, D.C. It tells of the first Atlantic to Pacific flight in 1911 by Cal Rodgers.

The original Vin Fiz may be seen in the National Air and Space Museum, Smithsonian Institution at Washington, D.C.
