FIRST AID FOR HORTICULTURAL HURRICANE VICTIMS

Immediately after a hurricane passes our way, there are some first aid practices that are very important to the well-being of our ornamental plants.

First of all, you should remove all moss, broken branches, and all debris which might be on or about the plants. By an immediate pickup practice, you perhaps can minimize the danger of moss seed-spores being attached to your ornamental plants. Altho spanish moss is an air plant, it does tend to smother the growth of the plants, and without the leaves to carry out the process of making food, it may cause the loss of the plant.

Second, prune away all broken and badly damaged wood in the tree or plant, using sharp pruning saw or shears. All wounds of more than 1/2 an inch in size should be covered with a good tree paint to prevent disease from getting into the plant system.

If it has been some time since you fed the plants, it might be wise to apply a light application of good plant food. The tremendous amount of rainfall that accompanies a hurricane usually causes most of the plant food to become soluble and be washed below the depth of the roots. We do say "light applications" because if your plant food was a high natural organic you still may have some nitrogenous deposits and too much might burn the foliage of the plant.

It is very good practice, according to President Richard C. Johnson of Florida Nurserymen and Growers Association, to keep trees on your premises thinned, pruned and heavy moss deposits removed. This helps them come through a hurricane with less damage. While our first hurricane of the season has been an ideal one, with more water than wind, this last point might be most important to you. Before another one comes along, check your trees for moss, weakened branches, etc. and have them cleaned and pruned so your tree has a better chance of survival without damage. Moss deposits that have become heavy can cause branch breakage when they become wet...and the weight of the moss also is a factor in trees uprooting during a heavy hurricane wind.

Just as in medicine, prevention is more important than cure, you will find that some preventative steps to protect your trees will pay good dividends. After all, it does take a long time to grow a mature tree!

TAXPAYERS ASK I.R.S.

Q - What do I do about a missing refund check? It's been 3 months since I filed and I have't heard anything yet.

A - Write to your regional IRS service center telling when you filed your return and where it was sent. Be sure to give your social security number as well as your name and address so that your refund claim can be traced.

Q - How much can I earn this summer before I have to pay income tax?

A - When your earnings reach \$600 for the year, a return must be filed. However, with the exemptions and deductions the law provides, there will be no tax to pay until income reaches \$900.

Don't forget that if tax is withheld from your earnings, a return must be filed to obtain any refund that may be due.

Q - I lost my refund check, can I get it replaced?

A - Yes. Report the loss to your local IRS office. They will give you the forms needed to apply for a replacement check.

Q - The notice I received on my estimated tax installment said I might have to increase my payment because of the change in the Social Security Law. What was that?

A - The maximum annual income subject to self-employment tax was increased to \$7,800 this year. This compares to \$6,600 in 1967. At the present rate of 6.4 percent, this means the maximum self-employment tax is just \$76.80 higher than it was in 1967.

Q - My return was audited and the agent wouldn't let me take all the charitable contributions I'd claimed. Is there anybody else at IRS I can talk to about this?

A - You may request a district conference to discuss the disallowed deductions.

Procedures for doing this are explained in the notice you receive which explains the adjustment.

This conference will provide you with an independent review of the items questioned. Legal counsel is not needed but you may bring someone to represent you if you wish.

In a district conference the taxpayer meets with an experienced conferee, who is not associated with the audit group that examined his return.
