



## State Board of Health



## BORN IN TIME OF TERROR

It was a hot summer in Jacksonville in 1888. Rumors were spreading that yellow fever had been brought into port on a ship. People began piling their belongings on wagons and leaving town. Out bound trains were loaded and by every means possible the residents of the city were leaving until over 10,000 of the

residents had fled.

As the news and epidemic spread, stores closed, buildings were boarded up and the sound of death carts was heard in the streets. Panic was rampant and there were brutal incidents when men would flee, leaving a sick wife and children, because of uncontrollable fear.

There had been other yellow fever epidemics in the past but none equal to this. The first recorded Florida epidemic occurred in 1835 when the schooner, "Grampus", brought yellow fever to Pensacola, Tampa and Key West, Fernandina, Cedar

Key, St. Marks and Apalachicola were other towns which had been visited by the fever. But in Jacksonville there were over 5000 cases and 400 deaths.

At the time, many Florida counties had their own health boards and sought to isolate themselves from the disease by posting armed guards at their borders. Travelers were turned back unless they had a "certificate of acclimation" which showed that they had survived the disease or exposure to it. Physicians were threatened with death for visiting patients in neighboring counties. A candidate

for governor, Francis P. Fleming, experienced this restriction during his campaign and one of his first acts after being elected to office was to ask authorization for "an organization which would administer protective measures freed from extreme fear or unreasonable restrictions."

The idea of such an agency was not new in 1888. It had been proposed for a number of years. In 1873, a bill establishing a health agency and carrying an appropriation of \$200 had been presented in the Legislature but the idea was rejected because the cost was "exorbitant." Each Legislature was urged by various physicians and organizations to establish a health agency but it was not until the yellow fever epidemic of 1888 in Jacksonville that action was taken.

The disruption of commerce in the city was so great that donations of money, food and clothing poured in from all parts of the world. An agency was established to handle general relief, as well as to combat rumors and to deal with criticisms. A "governmental relief service" was formed to coordinate medical and relief measures. Nursing and medical care were made available to those in need and every home in which a case of yellow fever had occurred was fumigated - the one preventive measure believed to be effective.

The idea of a state - wide health agency had reached maturity during this epidemic and Governor Fleming, still

smarting from the embarrassment of his campaign, called the Legislature into special session to create the State Board of Health. Special attention was given to "yellow fever, smallpox and cholera." Other infectious diseases and the general supervision of public health were given less priority.

The Governor promptly created a three-man board and named a Key West Physician, Dr. J.Y. Porter, who was experienced in the control of yellow fever and who had acted as consultant to Jacksonville during the epidemic of 1888, as the first state health officer. Thus, the Florida State Board of Health began its work in 1889 and continues today as the protector of Florida citizens and visitors.

Next Week: Instrument of Torture

The early Florida women called it "fashion." The State Board of Health called it an "instrument of torture."

FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS

M. T. Dixon, director of the Fla. Dept. of Veterans Affairs, said today that recent changes in the GI Home Loan Program should make it easier for thousands of unremarried widows to get GI home loans. Basic eligibility requirements are that the widow's husband either die on active duty or from a service connected disability, and the Veteran's service was during World War II, Korean Conflict or the Vietnam era.

A new law permits the VA to guarantee home loans up to \$12,500 of the loan amount, but not more than 60% of the loan. The higher ceiling on GI loan interest rates which went into effect recently, should help these widows get a GI loan from a commercial lending institution. Many eligible widows had husbands who served in World War II, and under current legislation they still have more than two years to obtain a GI loan - until July 25, 1970. Entitlement for qualified widows of men who served in the Korean Conflict is not scheduled to expire until January 1975.

Widows whose spouses served during the Vietnam era, or any time after January 31, 1955, will have their eligibility expire (a) 20 years from the date of the veteran's death in service, (b) 20 years from the date of the veteran's discharge, or (c) March 3, 1976, whichever is later.


