

FIRE AT CASA YBEL

At 9 a.m. fire destroyed a gulf front cottage at Casa Ybel last Sunday. Fire Chief Allen Nave stated that it was probably caused by faulty wiring in the kitchen area. The efficiency unit sustained approximately \$9,000 damage.


The vacationers in the cottage were out by the time the department arrived, about 9:20, but lost all of their belongings in the fire. One of the two Sanibel trucks stayed at Casa Ybel until mid-afternoon, the other and the Captiva truck assisting them returned home shortly after 10 a.m. Smoke from the blaze could be seen as far as Fort Myers Beach.
