DEMOCRATS TO HOLD PICNIC

The Sanibel-Captiva Democratic Club announces the Club's Pre-Election Outdoor Beach Picnic and Hotdog Barbecue, on Sanibel, at the Sanibel Lighthouse, Sunday, October 20th at 4:30 p.m.

So successful was the combination Annual Meeting and Beach picnic held last April 21st that County officials and Club members decided a repeat performance is in order. Almost 100 local club members, County and State officials and candidates attended the spring get-together.

Invited guests for the pre-election gathering will include Senators Holland and Smathers, Governor Collins, Congressman Rogers, Congressman Haley, Senator Friday, Representative Randell, and their wives. All County officials and candidates have been invited and Presidents and Board of Directors of Lee County Democratic Clubs.

There will be no set speeches. Instead everyone will have an opportunity to meet, and to talk to, the men and women who now represent them, or who are candidates for public office in the forthcoming elections. The club feels that this method of personal contact will bring about a closer understanding of the views of both voters and politicians, and that these exchanges, which will take place in an informal and relaxed atmosphere, will be conducive of results not possible in any other type of forum.

To induce a really relaxed atmosphere, officials and candidates will be asked to serve on "KP detail," led by Chief Chef Julian Hudson, Chairman of the Lee County Board of County Commissioners. Dishing out the food, they'll get to meet everyone present.

There are many new members who are now presently members of the Democratic Club, and the Board of Directors wishes to extend to these residents, as well as to other Democrats who have not yet joined, a cordial invitation both to attend the picnic and to become affiliated with the Island Club. The dues are \$1.00 per year per person. Membership does not entail any further financial obligation, but those members who wish to contribute any sum, large or small, to the expenses of the picnic may do so. Such help will be appreciated and will help to defray costs of the picnic.
