GAME RESERVE

Pine Island Sound and Matlacha Pass, sovereignty submerged lands held in trust for all people of Florida, thus coming under state jurisdiction rather than County are in the process of being placed into a game preserve, said Roland Roberts, candidate for the County Commission from the 3rd District. After the Beach Chamber of Commerce meeting Thursday night at the Commodore Hotel, in which the matter of the game preserve was brought up, Roberts telephoned Tallahassee to check with officials there and also checked with the local representative on the Florida Development Commission since there seemed to be some questions brought up at the Chamber meeting in regard to the right of County citizens to express their opinion on the matter.

"This is now cleared up," said Roberts. "There will be hearings which are required by law. Our representative assured me that they had received the last of the three reports prepared by the Inter-agency Com-

mittee to study and formulate guide lines for the administration of these lands.

"The hearings will be held, as was the case in the Estero Bay project, before a final decision is reached. Every interested person or organization will have a chance to study the proposal.

"I feel that this proposed reserve, similar but larger than our Estero Bay preserve, will be an asset to Lee County and prevent destruction of our marine sources, our fishing and shrimping industries and will be the channel for millions of dollars to flow into our County because of the tourist and tourist business."

SCA OPENS 32nd YEAR OF COMMUNITY SERVICE

This year's Shell Fair Brochure will be distributed at the meeting and tickets for the Shell Table will be available. This year beside the traditional Shell Table for first prize, two shell domes containing specimen junonias set in coral will be offered as second and third prizes. You can see all of these for the first time at the meeting.

All members are urged to attend and visitors on both Islands are cordially invited. Price of admission is either a main dish, vegetable salad, dessert or rolls. Coffee and fruit punch are furnished free by the Association. A radio will be on hand for those who want to get early election returns. Come early and stay late and get to know your Island neighbors.

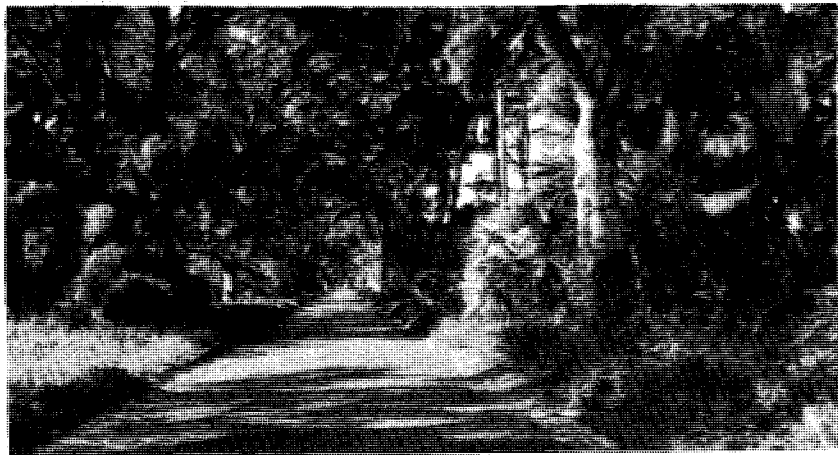



**THREE ARRESTED
FOR BURGLARIES**

Approximately 60 percent of an estimated \$1,350 in money and merchandise stolen from two Sanibel Island firms was recovered by Sheriff's officers Monday. Three persons were arrested in connection with the burglaries according to Jim Loeffler, Sheriff's Investigator.

Isiah Gavin, 20 of Sanibel, and Sherwin Fuller, 19 of 1942 Wright Street, will be charged today with breaking and entering to commit grand larceny and possession of stolen property. Isaac Brundage, 21, of Sanibel will be charged only with possession of stolen property.

The arrests were made in connection with the burglary of Bailey's General Store during the night of Oct. 13-14 and the burglary of Friday's House of Treasures during the night of Oct. 3-4. Approximately \$1,000 was taken from the General Store and about \$350 from the House of Treasures. Loeffler said, "several hundred dollars worth" of the loot was recovered Monday from two houses on Flagler St. just off Anderson Ave.

**BUSINESSMEN WARNED OF
BOGUS LABOR PUBLICATIONS**

Don Bottorff, Executive Manager of the Fort Myers-Lee County Chamber of Commerce, today warned businessmen to be wary of high-pressure operators soliciting advertising for bogus "labor" publications. He said "boiler-room" operators soliciting advertising for bogus labor papers continue to drain millions of dollars from American business.

In long-distance telephone calls, the solicitor usually makes exaggerated claims to the businessman for his "labor" publication and in some instances makes veiled threats about labor trouble if there is resistance.

In a recent statement to the National Better Business Bureau, of which the local chamber is a member, George Meany, President of the AFL-CIO expressed regret that it was necessary for trade union newspapers to accept advertising to survive since "advertising in the labor press is particularly vulnerable to abuses of one kind or another." Meany contends that the labor movement should be willing and able to support its organs of internal communications without seeking assistance from the business community.

The Chamber of Commerce urges businessmen to help stamp out the bogus labor publications, and Mr. Bottorff suggested that they contact the Better Business Division if they have any doubts about a labor publication or its method of solicitation. Further, that anyone threatened by a solicitor with "labor trouble" to notify the appropriate law enforcement agency at once.

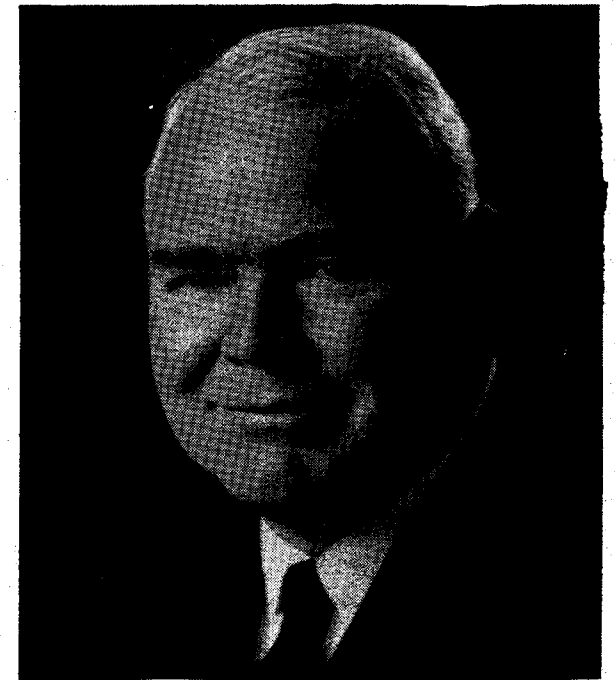

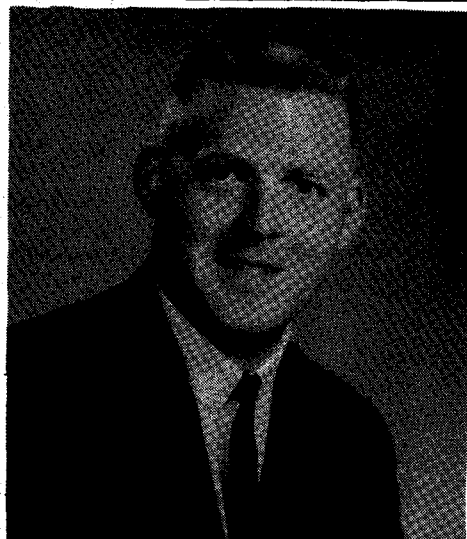

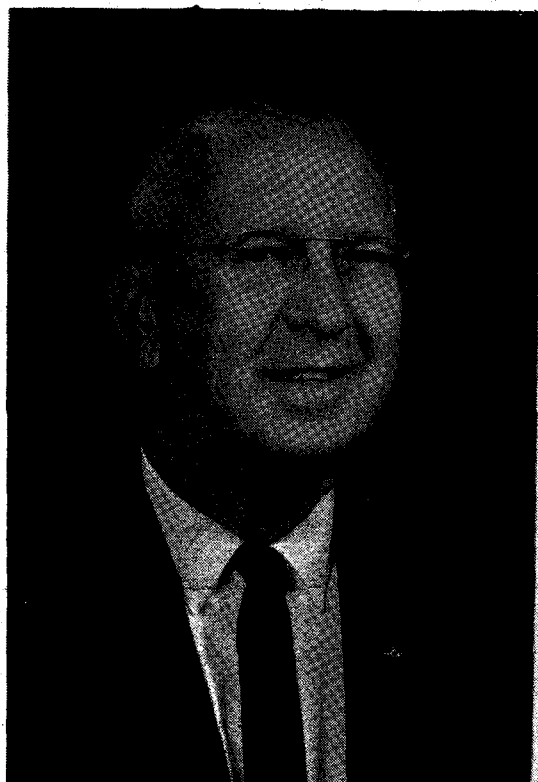
