WILDERNESS SOCIETY MEETS

Immediately following the most successful closing of the Florida Audubon's Conference on Sanibel, attended at times by over 200 participants, another leading American organization in the same sphere of activities will convene on the island.

The Council of the Wilderness Society is meeting at the Casa Ybel Resort from Monday evening November 18 through Friday, November 22 of this coming week. The Council is the governing board of the Wilderness Society, the national Conservation organization particularly concerned with the preservation of America's wilderness. Many Floridians Pare members.

The Wilderness Society is actively involved in such Florida projects as applying the Wilderness Act to the Everglades National Park and to the dozen National Wildlife Refuges that lie in Florida. Successful action will assure that these publicly owned areas permanently retain their dominantly natural character, despite all the increasing pressures to

put everything from TV towers to super highways to oil and mining rigs in, on, and through them. These projects are typical of the basic conservation battle going on all over Florida today--a battle to assure the conservation of Florida's extraordinary natural environment for man's use and enjoyment. The Wilderness Society Council on Thursday, November 14 began

a four-day field trip during which it will examine, under the guidance of informed Floridians, such significant natural areas as the Key Deer and Great White Heron National Wildlife Refuges along the Florida Keys, the new Biscayne National Monument, John Pennycamp Coral Reefs, Everglades National Park, the Ten Thousand Islands, Corkscrew Swamp, and Sanibel's Ding Darling National Wildlife Refuge.

On Tuesday, November 19 at the Casa Ybel Resort the Council will meet with state officials and prominent Florida conservationists to learn at firsthand more about various Florida natural resource problems.

Sigurd F. Olson of Ely, Minnesota, a nationally famous ecologist, author, and natural resources consultant to government agencies and private organizations, is the President of the Wilderness Society. Stewart M. Brandborg, originally of Montana and now of Washington, D.C., is the Executive Director. In addition to the fifteen Council members, the party includes four members of the professional staff and the wives of several of the Councilors and staff.

NOTICE TO POSTAL PATRONS

We would like to remind all of our Rural Route patrons that during the month of December, postal regulations require that all greeting cards and letter mail placed in your box for pick-up by the rural carrier must have postage affixed. Additional sorting bands for "Local" and "Out of Town" bundles of mail are available at the post office or from your carrier.

We would also like to thank you in advance for the cooperation we know we will have, as we always do, in making this a happy season. It is the goal of the Post Office Department to have all Christmas mail delivered by Christmas day and we can only accomplish this with the cooperation of all our patrons.

The U. S. Christmas postage stamp is a partial reproduction "The Annunciation," a painting by Jan van Eyck, the great 15th century Flemish artist who was court painter for Philip the Good of Burgundy. The small van Eyck painting was sold by a resident of Brussels to William II of the Netherlands in 1819. Czar Nicholas of Russia acquired it in 1850. The USSR sold the picture to Andrew Mellon of Pittsburgh in 1937 as part of a \$6.5 million purchase.

The vertical stamp, printed in five colors, is now on sale and is prepared in 6-cent denomination only. Christmas greeting cards will require this amount of postage whether or not they are sealed. As most cards will weigh under 1 oz., they should be sealed as this will indicate they are to be treated as First Class mail. Cards weighing between 1 and 2 oz. should be left unsealed unless additional stamps are attached. Unsealed mail (Third Class) will neither be forwarded if undeliverable at the first address, nor returned to the sender.

Cards for distant states should be mailed before Dec. 11, and those for delivery to nearby states and local areas should be in the mail by Dec. 15.

The following deadlines

should be observed to insure Christmas delivery for members of the Armed Services overseas: Space Available Mail (SAM) by Nov. 23 and Parcel Air Lift (PAL) by Nov. 30. Airmail by Dec. 11. Armed services overseas includes dependents living at overseas locations with servicemen, and civilian workers employed by the Government and assigned overseas.

Domestic parcel post packages should be mailed by Dec. 2 for distant states and for closer places by Dec. 15.

Senders should place the name of the sender and addressee as well as a list of contents inside each package as a precaution against possible loss.

Closure failures, broken tape or torn wrappers at the intersection of flaps and openings account for 48 percent of damaged and and rewrapped parcels. Torn wrappers usually occur because the paper isn't strong enough. Wrapping paper should be comparable to the strength and weight of grocery bags.

Crushed packages are the result of insufficient cushioning material. Fragile items such as glasses and ceramic objects should be individually cushioned which means that shredded paper or loose excelsior (or even pop corn) should be placed at least two inches deep on all sides of the item.

Sturdy cartons should be used and when Kraft tape is used the package should also be securely tied with cord or string.


