**CHRISTMAS IS COMING!
 SO IS CAB**

That's "County Against Blight" -- a far-reaching, high-hoping beautification and clean-up campaign geared to encompass all Lee County every month of the year.

It's scheduled for kick-off on January 1, spearheaded by the Fort Myers - Lee County Garden Council and the Chamber of Commerce.

"Projects - hundreds of them are the basic ingredients of a good year-round beautification and clean-up drive," said Chamber Manager Don Bottorff who is acting as chairman pro-tem of the CAB committee.

"And then we need people -- hundreds of them -- to get vitally involved in this business of beautifying and cleaning up their County," Bottorff emphasized.

An SOS is going out to all Lee County organizations to assist in the initial phase of the drive by suggesting to the committee what projects they think are most needed to get and keep Lee County clean and beautiful.

And everyone is urged to get in on the act. Every business, club, church and individual is urged to send in writing to the CAB headquarters at the Chamber of Commerce a list of beautification or improvement projects or a single project that they would like to see started in Lee County when the CAB drive officially opens on January 1.

CAB committee members urged that persons sending in projects limit their suggestions to ones that will enhance the appearance of the entire Lee County area, not simply small neighborhood projects that can best be handled by individuals in a particular section.

Individuals, businesses and organizations are urged to send in suggested projects as soon as possible so they can be studied by the CAB steering committee and included in the year-round beautification program.

The Committee envisions both short-range and long-range projects; that clubs, churches and other groups could sponsor; and projects that clubs, churches and other groups could sponsor; and projects that businesses and residential areas could participate in.

Mrs. J.T. Smoot is chairman of the pre-CAB residential drive designed to spruce up neighborhoods and individual homes and businesses for the upcoming holiday and tourist season.


"Let's sweep our own steps clean," said Mrs. Smoot, urging residents to see that their own homes and grounds are in top form for Christmas and the beginning of the big CAB campaign.


Garden Club members and CAB committee members will be touring the County for the next few weeks spotting areas that need special attention.

Owners are urged to mow vacant lots that have become overgrown, cut ditches that are adjacent or join their own property, trim palm fronds and create long-lasting Christmas decorations that won't fade long before the holiday season ends.

Residents are asked to get rid of cans and tires and boxes and other litter in ditches or on vacant lots at or near their property.



The State Board of Health noted today that there has been an increase of infectious hepatitis in Florida with small outbreaks in several sections of the state. So far in 1968 there have been 904 cases, as compared with 566 during a comparable period of 1967. This is about a 40 percent increase.

Infectious hepatitis, a disease that is usually spread from person to person by poor personal hygiene and lack of good sanitation, has been diagnosed in Hillsborough, Dade, Volusia, Polk, Pasco, Alachua and several other counties.

In the Hillsborough County outbreak in the Ruskin area, the disease has been traced to people who had taken and eaten shellfish from a posted, polluted area of the Little Manatee River. Epidemiologists of the State Board of Health found that residents of the area believed the waters were posted because the fat oysters, which thrived on pollution, were reserved for commercial use. In reality, the beds were posted to protect the health of the people.

In Dade County, many of the cases of hepatitis were among the teenage hippie group and drug-users. Twenty to 30 per cent of the cases reported were serum hepatitis which is spread by the use of infected hypodermic syringes and needles. Usually there are only a few cases of this type of hepatitis in a community.

A number of cases of infectious hepatitis were reported among students of the Daytona Beach Junior College, among a group of children in Dade City, among adults who had attended a picnic in Polk County, and a group of kindergarten students in


Gainesville.

Infectious hepatitis is a virus disease that is not fatal but can result in a prolonged period of illness and convalescence, sometimes four to six weeks. It is usually mild in children, but when the disease occurs in adults, there may be complications and a prolonged illness of four months or longer. Members of a family where there is a case have a higher chance of infection.

Early symptoms of the disease are fever, loss of appetite, abdominal discomfort, light colored stools, dark (brownish) urine, and in the advanced stages, jaundice (yellow skin, and eyeballs.) The virus is transmitted directly from person to person, usually by hands, clothing, or food contaminated from stools of infected persons, or very rarely, from droplets from the nose and throat.

The State Board of Health recommends that precautions should be taken to prevent exposure by avoiding persons whom you know to have infectious hepatitis, by practicing stringent personal hygiene, particularly hand washing after using the toilet; and, if you are a member of a household where there is a case, by seeing your family physician about the advisability of immunization with gamma globulin. This serum will not prevent the infection but it will modify the illness. Also, do not knowingly eat polluted shellfish.

With respect to serum hepatitis, the avoidance of the personal use of intravenously-administered drugs and careful screening of blood donors by commercial blood banks should decrease the incidence of disease.

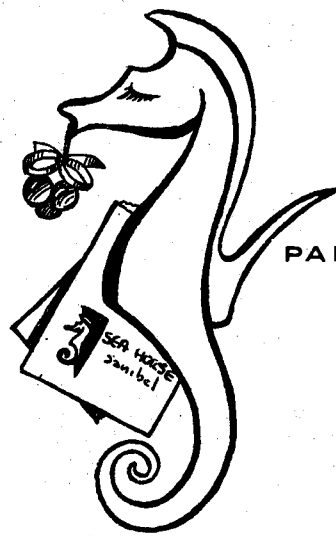
