SHELL TABLE UNDER WAY

There is an air of excitement and a flurry of activity in many corners of both Sanibel and Captiva Islands that belies the laziness of this sultry July weather. This is the time of year we scurry around getting those beautiful specimens to put in the shell table that the Community Association offers to some lucky ticket holder at the annual Shell Fair the first week in March. The shells have always been donated by the shell shops and individual collectors from both Islands but this year one gift shop owner said he surely would be happy to give a money gift to buy a pretty shell that some collectors might be reluctant to part with. Many other "shop keepers" were eager to follow along and some even had specific requests for their purchase. Like LeRoy and Helen Friday thought a jewel box would best express their shop. The bakery hoped we could find a lemon pectin for their contribution. The Sea Horse Shop thought any of the Sanibel-Captiva native shells would be beautiful enough and the B-Hive said they would be happy with anything we put in just so it was bright and beautiful enough to express the life on the Islands. Many other contributors thought anything we needed to add color and beauty would make them proud to participate in the community project. With one accord, everyone who was contacted immediately asked "What do you need and I'll see if I have a good one." Bernice McCaul went right to her lovely antique spool cabinet and opened drawer after drawer of glorious color while we took our pick. Clara Stran sat back and reminisced about the days when live lion's paws came up on the beaches as she fingered a lovely orange pair she wanted for the table display. Elsie Malone gave a Murex Beau from her recent dredging trip in the deep Gulf waters off shore from Sanibel and promised any more we needed to fill the gaps. Ken Havoard of Sea Shell Industries let us take the pick of his Spiney Oysters and the Sea Horse Delicatessen said, because they were so young in the shell business, they could only contribute baby shells, a lovely juvenile lions paw and juvenile angel wing.

The second prize of a large junonia was given by The Glory of the Sea and is ready to be displayed under its glass bell. Third prize is a Johnstone Junonia given by the Reynolds Shop and was dredged by Jim Moore off Sanibel. With the large perfect Butlers Junonia placed in the table itself all the area junonias are handsomely represented.

We went to see "Uncle Clarence" Rutland before he left for his trip to Alaska and he rummaged around in his assorted candy and cigar boxes and then said, take your pick - they all came in live here on Sanibel after one storm or another. Scotia Bryant dug into boxes she forgot she had and came up with shells she said were caught in the "big freeze" in 1952 and they were still as shiny as newly found. Lois Van Arsdale left a "bumpless wonder" with us before she left the Island for Wisconsin for the summer and Jim and Joe Pickens went thru their years of collecting to offer some shells that haven't been seen on the beaches in years. Reba Mast said she was delighted to have a real excuse to go shelling and she brought back a lovely pair of pink angel wings among other specimens. Willie Glass entertained her visiting great grand daughters by taking them out in the bay to catch live shells for the table. Alice and Phil Stein, winter visitors, left shells before they departed for Illin-

ATTENTION!

Even if you haven't lived in Florida long enough to register as a regular voter here, you may still be able to vote for President and Vice-President in the November 5 election.

That's the word from Secretary of State Tom Adams, Florida's chief election officer.

He called attention to a new constitutional amendment which allows newcomers from other states to vote in Florida for President and Vice-President even though they don't meet the one-year residency requirement to register as a voter in this state. To qualify, such persons must still be registered voters in the states from which they moved.

Adams emphasized that the new law permits voting only for President and Vice-President. It does not apply to other offices on the November ballot.

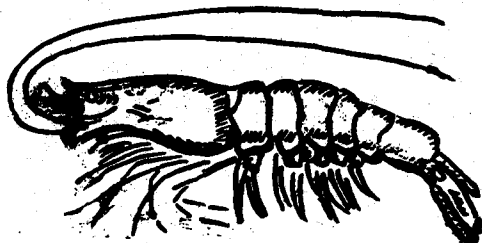
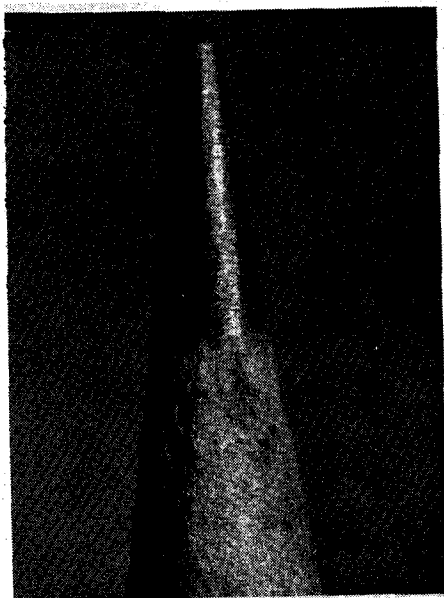
To vote under this law, new residents should apply with their County Supervisor of Elections between September 21 and October 5 for special ballots.

New residents who could not register in their former state because they were underage also will be permitted to vote for President and Vice-President if they have reached the age of 21.

"This is a great step forward in our election system," Adams said. "No longer are newcomers to our State denied the right to vote in our most important election. I urge all new residents to take advantage of this new law."
