WILDLIFE LAND PURCHA

The Sanibel-Captiva Conservation Foundation today purchase of 185 acres of land for wildlife preservation and Sanibel.

The total of first payments of \$37,000 was advanced to the Foc by Nature Conservancy, Inc. of Washington, D.C. Total cost will be in the neighborhood of \$117,000 which the Foundation plans to raise from its members and other contributors.


The land purchased consists of two parcels. One, of 163 acres, is in the Sanibel Slough area fronting on Rabbit Road to the west and the state

highway on the north. It was purchased from Finger Corporation of Louisville, Ky., and Gene L. Greem, trustee, of Venice, Fla.

The other consists of 22 acres near the north end of Sanibel with 1,000 feet on Pine Island Sound and 900 feet on Wulfurt Road. This is the site of a projected marine biological laboratory which will be manned by teachers and students from Florida Atlantic University.

The acreage in the slough area is the site of a projected Nature Center. Plans for these and other projects will be formulated during a three day conservation conference which the Foundation is sponsoring on Jan. 23, 24 and 25.

GRIFFING BANCROFT TO SPEAK

The annual dinner of the Fort Myers Beach Chamber of Commerce will be held on January 11, 1969 at the Commodore Hotel, 7:30 p.m. Door prizes donated by many Beach businesses will be awarded. Tickets at \$4.50 per person are on sale at the Chamber booth. Mr. Griffing Bancroft, noted news analyst, will be the speaker.

Griffing Bancroft, who is doing a weekly commentary for the new Fort Myers Television station, WBBH Channel 20, was for twenty years a Washington correspondent covering government and politics there and around the country for International News Service, the Chicago Sun, and for the last ten years as a radio and TV news analyst and commentator for the Columbia Broadcasting System.

During World War II, on leave of absence, Mr. Bancroft served overseas, heading the news operation in the Mediterranean theater for the Psychological Warfare Department. For this he received the Medal of Freedom, the highest award given civilians by the War Department.

Since moving to Florida in 1958 as a free lance writer and lecturer, Mr. Bancroft has written extensively on Government and politics for The Voice of America, and has authored a text book on "The Meaning of Com-munism" for the Silver Burdette Company,

With his wife, the former Jane Eads, who was for many years a columnist for the Associated Press, Mr. Bancroft lives on Captiva Island. He is a former president of the Captiva Civic Association and currently a member of the Captiva Erosian Control Commisssion, adirector of the Sanibel-Captiva Conservation Foundation, and vice president of the Sanibel-Captiva Audubon Society, He conducts lectures on current events during the winter months and, an ornithologist by avocation, conducts nature tours of the islands.
