POTLUCK SUPPER

A potluck supper, to which everyone on Captiva will be welcome, will be held in conjunction with the annual meeting of the Captiva Civic Association at the Captiva Community Center Friday, January 31. The supper will start at 6 o'clock, and be followed by a meeting at which new members of the Board of Governors will be elected.

Josephine Reddy, association secretary, is chairman of the committee in charge of arrangements for the supper. A list has been placed at the Post Office, and people are asked to show on that what dishes they will bring.

Five members will be elected to the Board of Governors. Four of these will be for three-year terms, replacing governors whose terms are expiring: John Wakefield, now president of the association; Hervey Roberts, now vice president; John Racek; and Joe Green. The fifth will be for one year, to fill out the term of Don Reese, who is moving to North Carolina.



CONSERVATION FOUNDATION BENEFIT

A two-part program of outstanding entertainment, featuring prominent speakers, photographers and lecturers, has been announced by the Sanibel-Captiva Conservation Foundation for the opening night of a three-day conference to be conducted by the foundation, Thursday, Friday and Saturday, January 23, 24 and 25.

Marie Hutton, president of the Sanibel-Captiva Audubon Society and chairman for the January 23 event, announced today that the public is invited to participate, as well as members of the foundation.

Part 1 of the program, which is scheduled to get underway at 8 p.m. in the Sanibel Community House, will feature addresses by Terry Blunt, Eastern Regional Director for the Nature Conservancy, Washington, D.C.; Joel Kuperberg, Executive Manager of the Collier County Conservancy; Griffing Bancroft, Executive Director of the Sanibel-Captiva Conservation Foundation; and opening remarks by Mr. Hutton.

The second part of the evening's events will feature a special photo-verse program by Marie Hutton, entitled "Imperiled Eden." Included will be 12 of Mr. Hutton's most significant features on the wildlife and scenic beauties of the Islands. Shown for the first time will be a six-part feature titled "The Ding Darling Sanctuary."

Donations, which will admit the public to this meeting, are now being accepted by the members of the Auxiliary Committees. The co-chairman for Sanibel is Mrs. Frank M. Culpepper. Her aides are Mrs. Mary Aleck, Mrs. H. R. Craig, Peggy T. Maloney, Mrs. Albert Muench, Josephine Reddy and Mrs. Claire T. Walter. A co-chairman with aides from Captiva will be announced in a few days.

An added feature of the Thursday event will be the showing of 30 of Ding Darling's best cartoons on conservation topics.

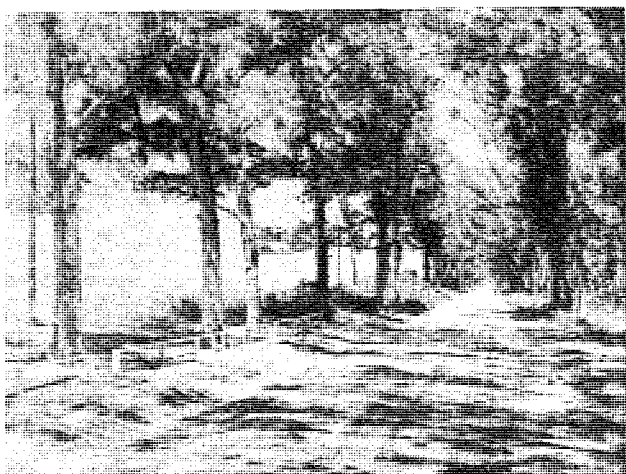

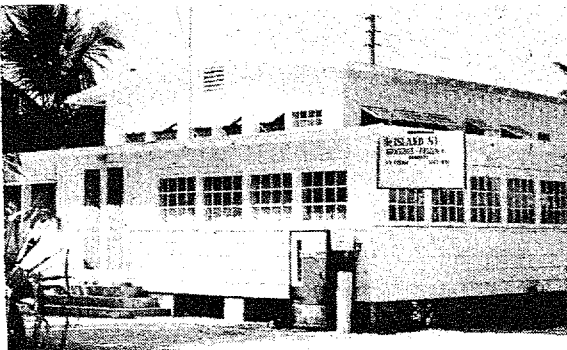

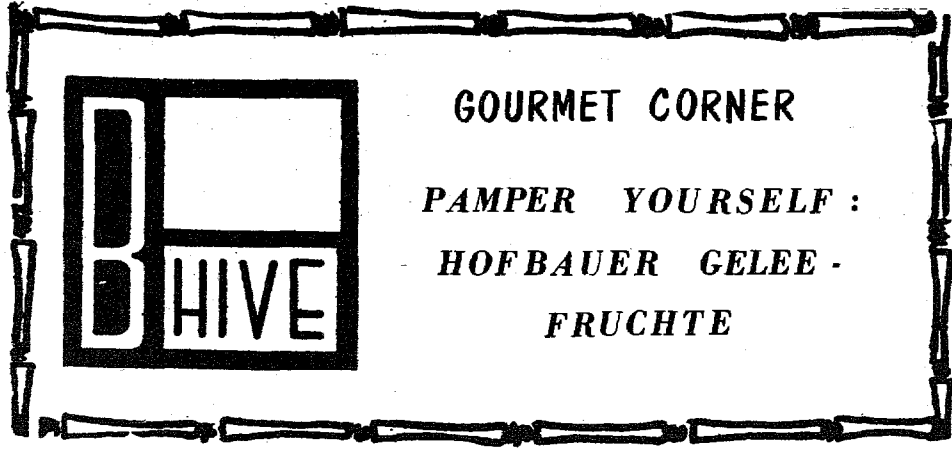

DONATION

Admiral and Mrs. Edward G. Konrad have donated twelve and a half acres of valuable land in the Sanibel Slough area to be set aside forever as a wildlife preserve in the memory of Mrs. Konrad's father, Albert Warren Akers.

This was announced today by the Sanibel-Captiva Conservation Foundation. The donation was made to Nature Conservancy, Inc., a national organization which designated the local Foundation to administer the land with the stipulation that it must always remain a wildlife sanctuary.

The parcel is part of the acreage purchased by Mr. Akers, a lawyer and native Floridian, in 1916. Admiral and Mrs. Konrad started developing the land in 1961. Since it was learned that part of it would be a sanctuary the value of the remaining land has been considerably enhanced.

LOWDEN-SNYDER MARRIAGE

The marriage of Medina Lowden of Beach Haven, New Jersey and Boca Raton, Florida to James Wilb Snyder of Surf City, N.J., AND Sanibel Island, Florida has been announced.

The couple was married Dec. 15, 1968 at the Chapel of The Central Presbyterian Church in Summit, N.J.

Mrs. Snyder is the widow of the late H. Preston Lowden, fiber merchant and lumberman. She is a noted clubwoman, artist and teacher, well-known for her serigraphs and ceramics.

Mr. Snyder is a retired Colonel (USAF), many times decorated for WW II service in European, Indian and Asian Theatres. He has been affiliated with American University of Beirut, the University of Pennsylvania, New York University and Registrar of Athens College, Greece. He holds graduate degrees in history from several universities, including a PhD in Social Sciences from New York University. After retirement, he was a consultant to the U. S. Government and Chairman of the Department of Intelligence Research and Analysis at American University, Washington, D. C.

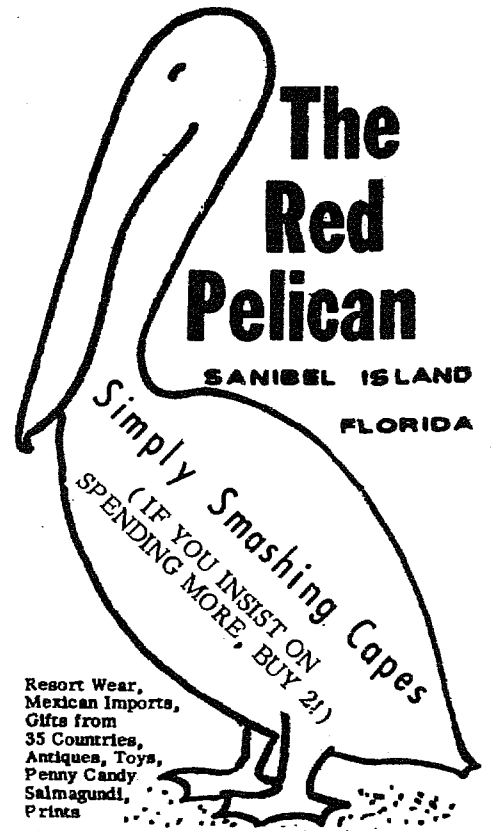



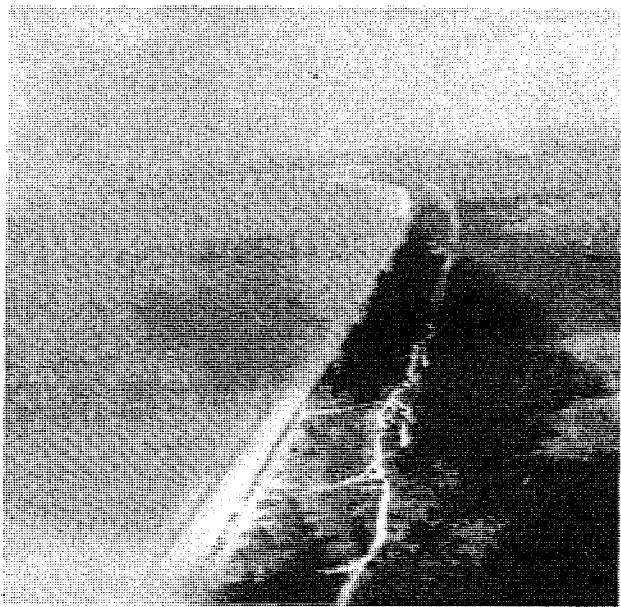

EDISON JUNIOR COLLEGE

Funds in the amount of \$2600 have been awarded to Edison Junior College by the Department of Justice for student grants and loans to be used in the law enforcement education program authorized under Title I of the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968.

Congressman James A. Haley notified Edison President David G. Robinson of the allocation of the funds which had been requested for institutional participation in offering aid in law enforcement careers.

Grants are available to persons employed by a public law enforcement agency, either state or local, who agree to remain with the agency for two years after completion of the program. The amount of the grant will be sufficient to cover tuition, fees, books and supplies but not to exceed \$300 a semester. Loans up to \$1800 per academic year are available to eligible students preparing for employment in law enforcement. Loans cover academic expenses as well as room and board and transportation, are available to full-time students only, and take into consideration financial need.

Money for these programs is available to persons who may wish to enroll in Session II, which begins next week, at Edison Junior College, and information on the grants and loans may be obtained any week day by calling at the office of Mrs. Jane Falk, Financial Aid Officer of the College.

Any funds not utilized in Session II will be available to students desiring to enroll in the summer sessions or Session I of Fall 1969. Under the law enforcement education program, students may take any of the police science courses or law enforcement related programs offered by the college.

"TOO LATE TO CLASSIFY"

Thousands throughout the nation think of Florida when they are ready to retire, other thousands think of Florida as the ideal vacation land for sun and fun.
