"FLORIDA'S LURE"

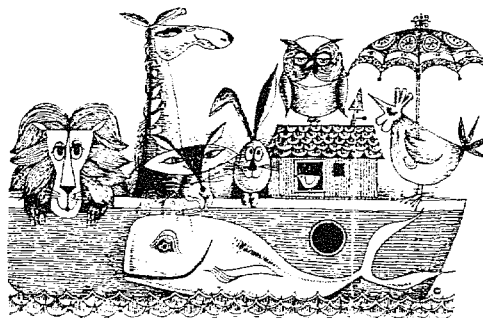



Over fifty persons interested in wildlife photography participated in the tour "Meeting Nature Halfway," that was conducted on March 20 by the local Audubon's president, Mario Hutton. The high attendance and comments overheard proved the value and attractiveness of this novel and informal presentation, that included brief talks on varied subjects by Hutton at five points of interest along the dike in the Ding Darling Sanctuary. An added attraction was the presentation by Bernard Gussett, who described and demonstrated the value of the Questar telescope and other high-class equipment for outdoor picture taking.

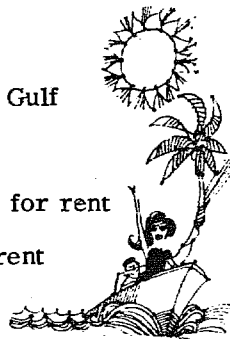
A native of Wilmington, N.C. Mr. Head was the 1957 recipient of the coveted Stanley Medal for distinguished work in music from the University of Michigan School of Music, where he received both the Bachelor and Master of Music degrees. He was a featured soloist with the famous University of Michigan Symphony Band, performing in New York City's Carnegie Hall and Boston's Symphony Hall. For many summers at the Brevard Music Center, he has served as an instructor, a frequent soloist, and first trumpet in the Festival Orchestra. He has also served as first trumpet in the Jacksonville, Fla., and Winston-Salem, N.C. symphonies. Presently he is the trumpet instructor at the University of Maryland and artist faculty member of the Northern Virginia Summer Symphony Music Camp in Reston, Va.

Works by Purcell, Handel, Hummel and Tchaikovsky will be performed by the Symphony and Mr. Head. The concert begins at 8 p.m. and tickets will be available at the door at \$2.00 for adults and \$1.00 for students.

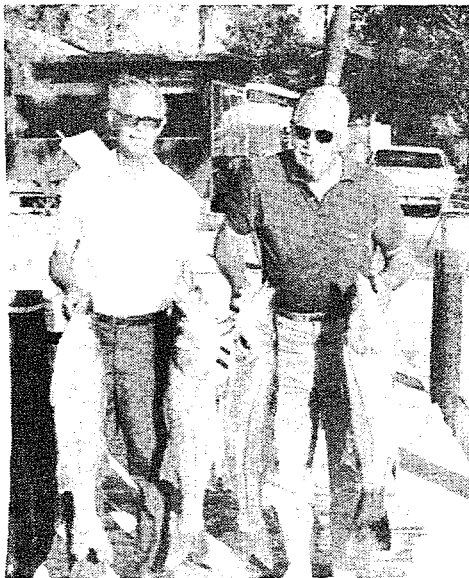

Dear Sanibelites:

Many of you have lived here a lifetime, some only a year or less. Most of us want Sanibel to remain as it was some years ago. But that is not to be, it is changing everyday. Building is going on about us every day. Motels, apartments and new homes and business.

Are we in this growth making any safety preparations? All the building means more people and with the population growth, here, the same as all over, the crime rate is also increasing. Is our police growing? Are we adequately protected? How about our fire dept.? If your home were to be on fire, do we have the equipment (in working order) and the personnel with training to fight that fire? Or would your home, belongings and maybe you be reduced to a pile of ash?

Why not get together now and prevent a tragedy from happening. I know we are not all millionaires, but I'm sure that together we could do a lot.

Small towns up North are proud of their fire departments and as they are called up there, rescue squads. They have the finest equipment and crews. The men and women belonging are proud of their jobs and see that they get all the training they can get themselves and the community is proud of them and thankful to have them and contribute as their pockets and they feel they can. The women volunteer their time also as nurses and giving dinners, bake sales, etc. to help raise the needed money. I've even heard of them collecting trading stamps and getting equipment that way.

I'm sure if we tried we could and the state would give some fire fighting teaching for about free and the Red Cross would

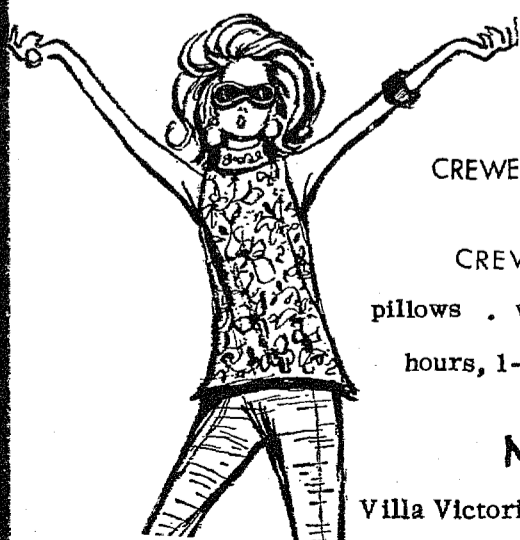

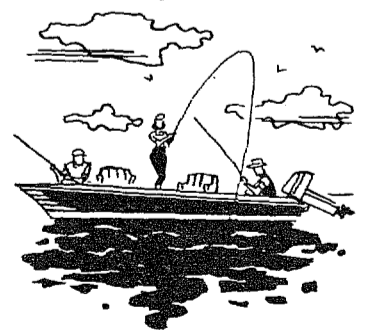


