

DR. RICHARD M. ELLIOTT

His man friends and admirers on the Islands and elsewhere were saddened this week with news of the death in St. Paul, Minn., of Dr. Richard M. Elliott, for many years a winter resident on Captiva.

Dr. Elliott, known to all here as "Mike," was the retired founder and first chairman of the Department of Psychology at the University of Minnesota. Only last year a building there was dedicated in his name and is now Elliott Hall on the campus.

Dr. Elliott was born in Lowell, Massachusetts, Nov. 3, 1887 and joined the University of Minnesota faculty in 1919. He was also editor of the Century Psychology series of textbooks at which he remained actively at work during his winters here.

His widow has requested that in lieu of flowers or other remembrances contributions in Dr. Elliott's memory can be made to the Sanibel-Captiva Conservation Foundation. He was an ardent ornithologist and conservationist.

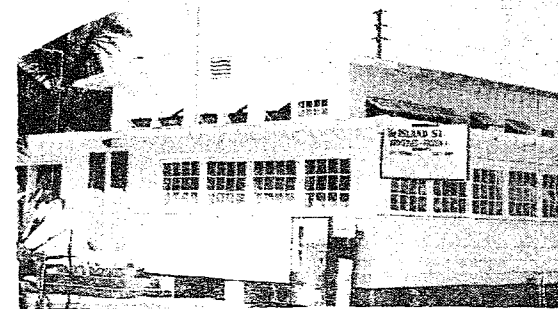

A telephone call to the County Engineer brought prompt action in getting the pot holes filled in along the Sanibel-Captiva Road.

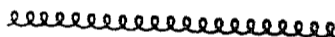

SOME TIPS ON ANCHORING

There is much more to anchoring a boat than just dropping the "hook."

Properly used, an anchor will hold a pleasure boat secure against all but the strongest current or wind. Used incorrectly, though, an anchor is just that much more weight for the boat to lug along as it drifts downstream.

There are many types of anchors on the market today; the boater's choice depends largely on where it will be used.

A Yachtsman anchor, for example, will hold well in grass, sand and rocks, but not mud. A Mushroom type, on the other hand, will work well in mud, but not so well on other bottoms. Other common types of anchors in use today include the Spade Palm (mud, sand and grass), Grapnel (rocks), Navy (mud) and Danforth (all types of bottoms.)

Selecting the spot to anchor is important, too, reports the Johnson Motors News Bureau. Make sure the water is deep enough to allow the boat to rise and fall on the waves without grounding.

In tidal waters, check the tables to make sure your boat won't be left high and dry at low tide. Or too far at sea during high tide.

It's also a good idea to keep an eye on the wind, and try to anchor in a protected area. If possible, anchor out of the current and in the lee side of the wind.

Once you've picked a spot, swing your boat into the wind and run a bit past where you'd like the boat to end up.

Ease the anchor overboard (never throw it--tangled line has a way of causing all sorts of headaches) and allow it to set, then let the boat drift back about five or six times the water depth.

Finally, wrap the anchor line around a cleat and motor backwards a short ways to hel secure the anchor. That's all there is to it.

If strong winds are expected, it's always a good idea to use at least two, and sometimes three, anchors: one from the bow, one from the stern and one (if necessary) from midships.

When weighing anchor, just motor ahead slowly, pulling in the anchor line, until you're directly over the anchor -- then pull the anchor free.

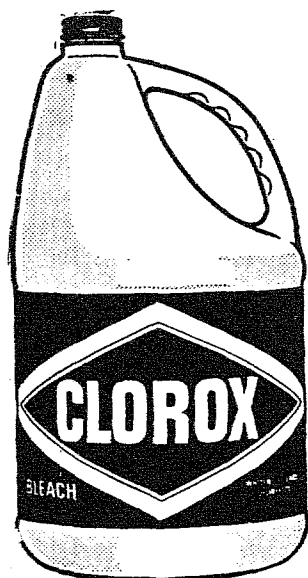

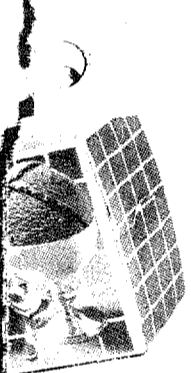

GARDENING NEWS

Many bulbs produce next year's flowers at this time of year. Amaryllis is no exception, says the Florida Nurserymen and Growers Association.

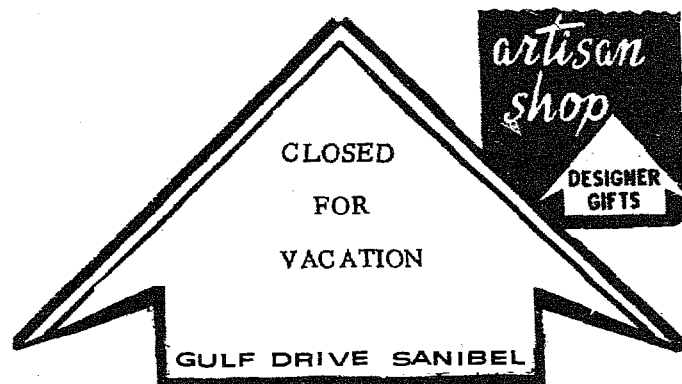
Amaryllis bulbs are quite peculiar in that they pull themselves into the ground over a period of time. A bulb that is too deep will fail to bloom. A bulb that is over fertilized with nitrogen many fail to set flowers. Now is the time to apply an application of a 4-8-8 to your amaryllis bulbs to produce flowers for next year. Bulbs that are lifted at this time will also fail to bloom.

Amaryllis are subject to a disease called red leaf blotch. A temporary control for this disease is a spray of neutral copper at two-week intervals. Complete control can be effected by lifting the bulbs in the fall and treating them in formaldehyde.

If you are a fall gardener and let your garden rest during the summer months, it is advisable to plant a small cover crop to help enrich the soil. You can use a cover crop of field peas. This not only enriches the soil, but it also provides a vegetable for your dinner table. Another cover crop that has been used not only by home gardeners but also by commercial people is hairy indigo. This is a vigorous growing plant of the legume family. The shading from this plant will help to prevent weed encroachment in your garden during the summer.

Chrysanthemums have produced enough growth for propagation purposes. Remove the top four inches of the plant and make new cuttings. These cuttings will root if inserted in peat and sand in approximately 3 weeks. After the cuttings have rooted, set them in place for a new bed of flowers for this fall.

Homeowners with citrus trees should watch for water spots on the trunks of their trees. These use extra fertilizer and should be removed. Water sprouts are angular, succulent growth with many thorns. You need not cut them off, just break them off.
