It is hoped that cleanup projects will be continued as required. Better yet, don't litter the roads and admonish those that do.




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

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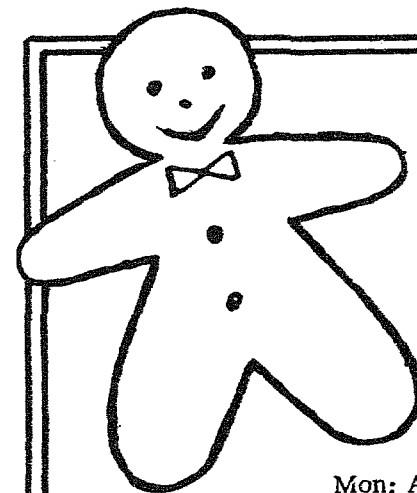

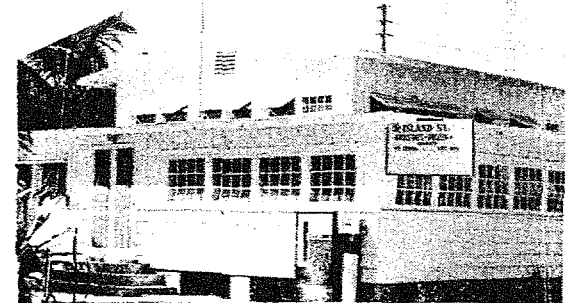

CHARLEY KING IN TRAINING FOR ANNUAL MAINLAND VISIT

When Islanders fly to the big island of "Am-er-i-ca" (a Territorial expression still used) the borrow from friends according to the weather, light or heavy coats, woolen suits, mufflers, even long johns, depending upon the season. Most of us fly over infrequently, some only once in a lifetime, we are so happy to be living on Maui.

When we return to the Valley Isle, no matter how pleasant the trip, we talk for days about how wonderful it is not to have freeways, traffic on the by-ways and say "Never again" until the next time we borrow some needed bit of wearing apparel.

But Charley King, Lahaina's Shell Man, at the Whaling Port Curio Shop has a system all his

own. A few weeks before he flies away each year to visit his mother in Indiana he goes into training by wearing shoes --- now, that isn't to say Charley goes bare-foot --- he wears the biggest, broadest "go-aheads" he can find so that his toes can wiggle in comfort while he goes into a long spiel about a certain rare shell.

And Charley has the rare ones from all over the world --- the largest collection in Hawaii. After a nice visit with his mother (Mother's Day is May 11) Charley will fly to Florida to greet and bargain with shell collectors and dealers from around the globe. They want Charley's beautiful Hawaiian shells and he is interested in the new and sometimes unidentified specimens found in recent years. This is a growing, living and exciting hobby, for shells once lived as the colorful, intricately designed home for myriad sea creatures -- excuse us, that's for Charley King to tell you about, so let's get back to shoes.

It's almost summertime in Florida, and until Charley reads this in the Maui-Go-Round, he won't know that the thing to do is take his Maui Go-Aheads right along with him --- before this trip, his annual Safari was in the winter months, but at this time of year on Sanibel Island off the West Coast of Florida, Charley may need room for his toes to wiggle as he talks about what he knows best --- shells.

County News: Commissioner P. A. Geraci is pondering the choice of either rebuilding 2.7 miles of Periwinkle Way on Sanibel Island, at between \$30,000 and \$40,000 as estimated by De Lozier, or proceeding with a \$300,000 road widening and rebuilding project on which \$25,000 already has been spent in right of way search and evaluation fees. Another \$110,000 will be needed to get the right of way set for the construction. Most of the land is donated, but structures are not, and some drainage and other easement is recommended by the State Road Department.

Attorney Frank Pavese voiced the opinion that purchase now would be wise, since the land will become more expensive as time passes. Scott and some others asked if the money isn't more badly needed in other quarters now. Hudson said that if the right of way is bought it is a tacit commitment to build.

Public Beach Access: To residents without a Gulf front property, who wishes to go to the beach without trespassing, the following.

Seagrape Lane is a public Lee County road from Bay to Gulf. The old Ferry road is public from Bay to Gulf. (Now disguised as private on the Gulf side.) Lee County and the taxpayers own a walkway to the Gulf across the Colony holding, and two walkways on Gulf Drive not including the easement of the Rocks. Would somebody indicate the exact spot to the Chamber of Commerce that signs be erected?

More public roads now disguised as private can be checked in the Courthouse.

Could the Community Association or the Chamber of Commerce, check and ask the County to maintain ALL these roads for the benefit of ALL the residents?

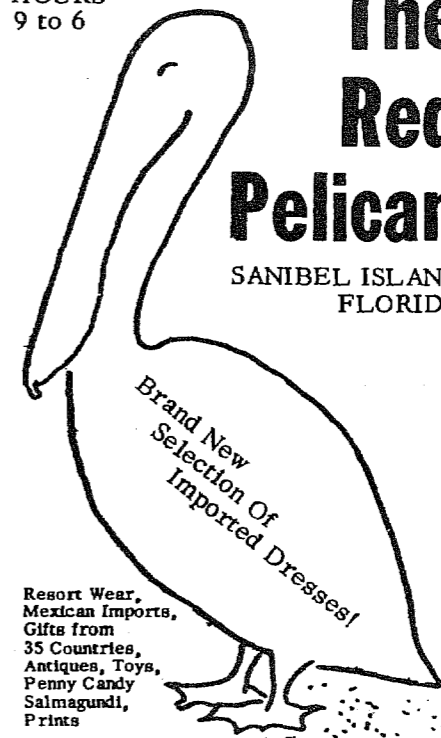

Helen Budrow Eager died Thursday in Lee Memorial Hospital after a long illness.

A popular hostess with an enormous number of friends, she began coming to the Islands with her husband George T. Eager in 1920 for winter vacations. Their first abode was a tent pitched near the Sanibel Lighthouse; for the past many years she has resided at her home on Captiva.

Mrs. Eager, who was widowed in 1957, was well known in both musical and art circles, having at one time been a concert pianist and a teacher of music. She was a member of the Art Council of Southwest Florida, as well as the Sanibel-Captiva Art League. An accomplished artist who studied with leading teachers in this country and abroad, her works have appeared and won awards in numerous exhibitions in this area, and she was highly respected in art circles.

She was also a devoted and active member of the Chapel-by-the-Sea, where a memorial service is to be held this winter. Her passing is a great loss to the Islands and to her many friends.

She is survived by two daughters, Mrs. William F. Deknatel, and Mrs. John Henderson, two sisters, four grandchildren and six great grandchildren.

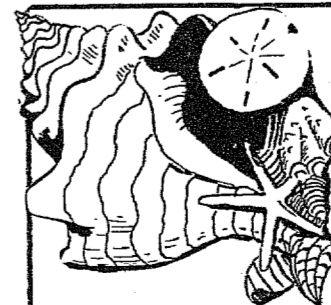

ience and observations tell us that the defensive driver could have avoided most of these accidents."

Parol records show that the greatest frequency of accidents occurred on Friday afternoon between the hours of 5 p.m. and 6 p.m. More fatal accidents occurred on Saturday night between 6 p.m. and 7 p.m.

Kirkman concluded by saying, "Drivers can be compared to students. Defensive drivers are prepared for any emergency as the student should be prepared for an examination. If the student is not prepared he usually fails the test. If the driver is not prepared he too fails, but his failing could be fatal."



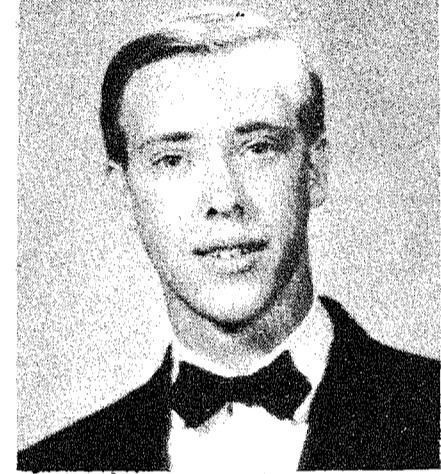



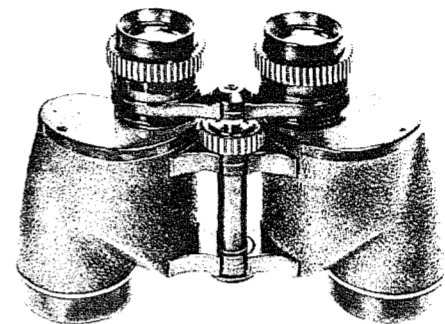
