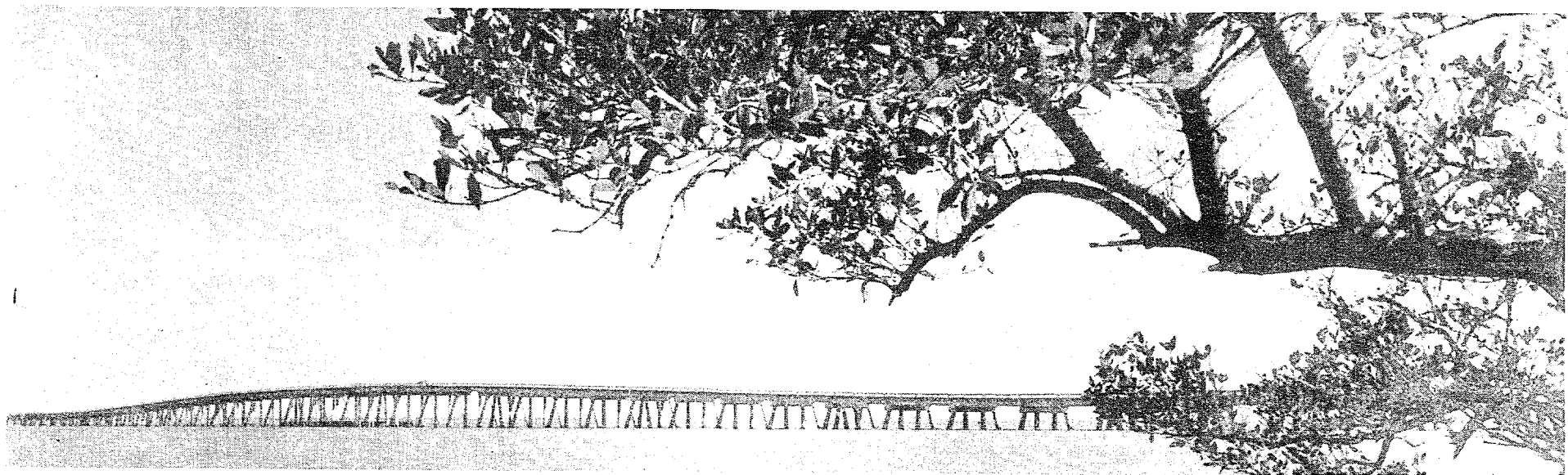



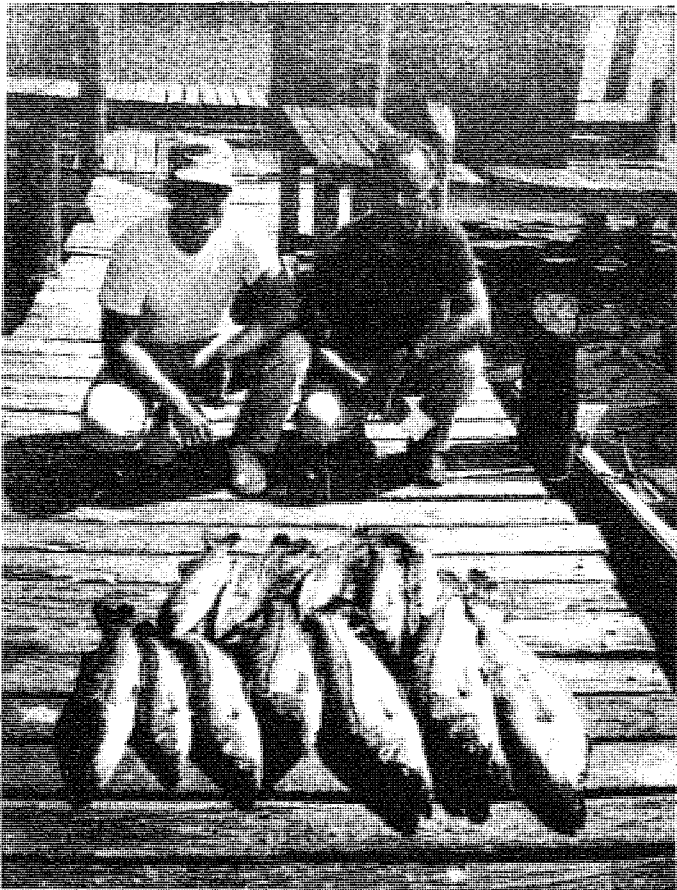

WANTED ALL MOWERS!

High school and college boys in the Lee County area who have lawn mowers and are available for mowing small lots during the month of June are asked to register at the Fort Myers-Lee County Chamber of Commerce with Mrs. Chris South.

The CAB (County Against Blight) Committee has designated June as lot-mowing month in its year round campaign for clean-up and beautification. All property owners in the area are urged to mow their lots or have them mowed.

Persons who are not able to mow their own lots or who have no regular yard care service may call the Chamber of Commerce for the names of these young men who have registered for mowing jobs during June.

Mrs. James Sapp, June chairman of the vacant lot mowing project, urges property owners to take advantage of the services of these young people by calling 334-1133 and asking for Mrs. South.

"The earlier the weeds are cut, the cheaper it is," Mrs. Sapp reminded. "Once they grow too high it takes a larger mower to mow them."

The CAB Committee, headed by Mrs. Francis Campbell, has as its aim a cleaner and more beautiful Fort Myers and Lee County. They stressed that lots overgrown with weeds which grow especially rank during the rainy months, deface the landscape and make an unattractive city.

"It's up to every property owner to see that his lots are kept mowed and cleaned," said Mrs. Sapp.

BEWARE OF GIMMICKS

Many Floridians have or will receive something in the mail saying, "Congratulations, you have a lucky license number. It has been selected as this week's winner of ..."

The "gift" may range from a stereo record player to a human hair wig. However, the Florida Department of Agriculture's Office of Consumer Services warned the lucky license number gimmick may be the mailer's license to "steal," as the gimmick is usually just a come-on for an expensive, over-priced item.

As a recurring example of the lucky license number scheme, Commissioner of Agriculture Doyle Conner cited a stereo record player scheme.

The trick in the "free" stereo record player offer, he said, is

that the consumer must agree to buy the equivalent of one stereo record per week for eighteen months.

The total price of the records is equal to the full retail price or more for the stereo, and sometimes the records as well, he said.

In order to receive the "free" stereo a note to pay the full price must be signed. If full payments are not paid, the consumer may be sued by a finance company and the seller may be able to take the stereo back.

Unfortunately, this is just one of many examples of such schemes. The Office of Consumer Services said other examples include sewing machines "if" the projector is purchased, refrigerators "if" two years supply of food is purchased, just to name a few. Conner pointed out the need in any "bargain" offer for the consumer to watch for the "if" clause.

He said the best advice in dealing with such offers is to discard the "certificate." However, for the consumer who cannot bear to pass up a chance, some further advice was offered: before picking up the "prize" the consumer should check the actual price of the same or an equivalent item for comparison basis. A call to the Better Business Bureau or the Chamber of Commerce is also available.

JUNE IS WEED CUTTING
MONTH IN LEE COUNTY

Supermarkets, department stores and local merchants are distributing handbills during the month of June to urge citizens to mow their vacant lots, drainage ditches, along streets, rights-of-ways and wherever possible.

LICENSE NOW REQUIRED

According to John Viking, manager of the Lee County Contractors Association, the Association, in an effort to curb the activities of unlicensed building contractors operating in this area, has named a "License Complaint Committee" to handle complaints of this nature. The Committee will receive complaints from the public, as well as from its members.

Florida State Law licenses 3 classes of contractors:

1. General contractor, whose services are unlimited as to the type of building he can do.
2. Building contractor, who is limited to commercial buildings, and single or multiple dwellings (residential) not exceeding 3 stories.
3. Residential building contractor, who is limited to con-

struction of one, two or three family residences, not over two stories high.

The State Law contains an exemption that allows a property-owner to build or improve, on his own property, for his own occupancy, a residence or dwelling. He will be able to obtain a permit for this, but only one permit is to be issued during the year, for this purpose. He may sell one house during the year, but if he builds and sells more than one such residence, then he is presumed to be in the business of building, and is required to be licensed.

The Committee has requested the Lee County Building Dept. to require applicants for building permits to display a contractors license, before the permit is issued, as required by the State Law. Specific complaints have been given to the Lee County Building Dept., and also to the

The two-day operation allows the student personnel office to score and interpret the tests and thus aid the student and his counselor on the second day in selecting the correct program for his college major."



and College Ability Test (SCAT) which is an aptitude measurement; the Missouri College English test (MCE); the Lankton Algebra test; and the Nelson-Denny Reading test.

The second day of the procedure begins at 9:30 a.m. in the auditorium of the Learning Resources Center with welcomes from President David G. Robinson and Deans H. J. Burnette and Max Rieves. Mark Adams, president of the Student Government Association, will greet the new students, explaining the aims and activities of this organization and other clubs on campus.

From information given on

the application, the student is then directed to one of the two divisions of academic programs where he learns what courses are needed for his particular college major.

After this meeting, the 100 students then separate into groups of 25 to meet with a counselor during lunch.

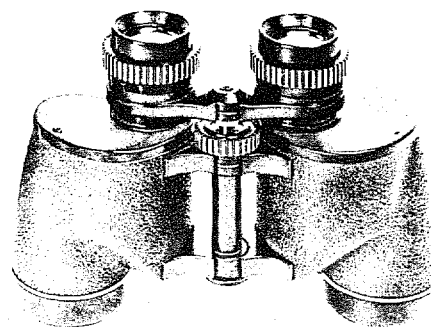

coming semester. Upon completion of his program and class schedule, the student goes to the registration area where the procedure is completed with the payment of fees. Barnes said one of the greatest advantages of this system is the prevention of conflicts in class schedules. The counselor is immediately available at all times to assist the student in overcoming such prob-

Registration completed, the student is assigned an advisor, a faculty member from his major area. During the first month of classes the student meets with his advisor, who will work with him in this capacity through his two years at Edison. Two hours are reserved each day in faculty schedules for individual conferences between student and advisor.
