CHAMBER MEETING

The regular meeting of the Board of Directors, which should have been held the last Monday of the month, was delayed one week due to the absence of both President Rushworth and Secretary Mary Funk, and the absence of a Vice President due to the resignation of Larry Bruno.

Before this meeting could be called to order, the Manager of REA, Homer Welch; Captiva Board Member of REA, Mrs. Jean Hayford; and several members of the Chamber of Commerce arrived and started discussing the electrical power situation on the Islands at this time. Due to the seriousness of the power failures on the Islands, it was decided to dispense with the regular meeting and to make this a special meeting, the regular monthly meeting to be held the following night.

Mr. Welch took the floor and explained the reasons for the outages; some were due to storms, lightning, birds, snakes, limbs falling on the lines, etc.; some of the faults were due to their supplier, Florida Power and Light; and some of the trouble was due to the fact that all of the circuits were overloaded. He promised us that he would try to alleviate some of these causes by Thursday night as he now has all of his crews working overtime on a hurricane emergency basis. They are putting the poles closer together, repairing old lines and putting in a 20 aluminum

wire that should give us double the present capacity. He informed us that they have already purchased the site and rights-of-way for a new substation to be built at Wulfurts Point, that this new substation has been ordered, that it will be built, and that a new line across the Bay will be installed as soon as the equipment and the necessary crews can be obtained. He stated further that all Florida is experiencing this difficulty as no one had expected the consumption load that they are experiencing now; and that this summer the temperature has been from 3 to 5 degrees hotter than average.

The members present were not fully satisfied with Mr. Welch's explanation as he had been asked to attend a meeting three years ago and, in his absence, his assistant Kari Allison had also promised improvements in the service. We also felt that he was negligent in not having made these improvements and in not having planned for the growth of Sanibel and been ready to meet this increased demand for more power. It was decided to wait a week or two to see if this new line helped the situation before investigating further. During this more than 3 hour discussion we spent an hour in the dark with candles.

Andrew Mellody informed the Board that we were covered for only \$15,000 on the Chamber Building and \$1,000 for contents, that he had checked with the builder and the building would now cost \$28,000 to replace. It was therefore decided to increase the coverage to \$30,000 on the building and to \$3,000 on the contents.

William H. Snyder was elected to fill the unexpired term caused by the resignation of Larry Bruno, and Mark McClintock was elected to fill the office as vice president.

The treasurer read the list of new applications, as follows: Bob Davis, Jr., Realtor from Ft. Myers Beach, as an associate member, Wits End Apartments, owner Lillian R. Gibson, on Tulipa Way, Island Huxster, owner Robert B. Potts, on Periwinkle Way and Casa Blanca Apartments, owner C. D. White, on Periwinkle Way. Old members reinstated are: Hines Gulf Service Station and Priscilla Murphy, Realtor.

The Lion's Club has asked the Chamber members to assist in the clean-up campaign.

The Board was informed that Miss Onstine, assistant secretary to Bill Newman, wishes to resign, preferably within a month, but will remain until a replacement is found.

The secretary informed the members that she had ordered a table, a brochure rack and an unlisted telephone to be placed near the advertising panel for the convenience of incoming guests. The telephone will have an unlisted number and will be for local calls only. The advertising on the panel is to be sold for \$50.00 a whole page and \$30.00 a half page. This will be for one year starting August 1 through July 31. All who are interested in this advertising should contact Dave Holtzman, Dan Moore or Bill Newman.

RED CROSS

"Shopping early for Christmas begins at the Lee County Red Cross Chapter, for the fourth successive year," states Mrs. Harry Schooley, Executive Secretary of the Chapter, as she announced the appointment of Mrs. Pauline Ross to serve as Chairman of the Christmas Ditty Bag project for this year.

"Santa's helpers" here will join with Red Cross volunteers in some 1,600 communities throughout the United States in "Vietnam Shop Early, 1969," the Red Cross program which annually provides a sufficient number of holiday gift-filled bags for each American serviceman and woman who is in South Vietnam during the Christmas holidays.

"Again this year the Red

Cross is asking other community service organizations, religious groups, business firms and individuals to join in helping to collect the items needed to fill the bright colored drawstring bags which local volunteers have made," said Mrs. Ross, chairman of the project.

"The Red Cross Shop Early project is just one way Americans can show that they care about our young men and women serving in South Vietnam," Mrs. Ross said.

The local chapter has been asked by the national organization to provide 300 of the bags. Last year some 30 community groups in Lee County participated in the project.

Among the most useful items the servicemen enjoy finding in a Christmas gift bag are ballpoint pens, plastic soap cases, small

address books, washcloths, nail clippers, plastic snapshot holders, plastic cigarette cases and toothbrush holders, small vacuum-packed tins of nuts or candies, playing cards, games and small flash lights. At least 12 items should be included in each bag. Each bag will also contain a holiday greeting card listing the contributors and the name of the chapter where the bag was made and filled.

The Christmas project must


be completed by September 1. Bags to fill may be obtained from the Red Cross office and the Volunteer Service Bureau in the Community Service Bldg., at 1514 Broadway.

Collection boxes are placed at M. Flossie Hill Co., Sears-Roebuck, American Department Store, Edison National Bank, Cape Coral Bank, Citizen's Bank in Lehigh Acres, and the Publix Market in Lehigh Acres.

I have received a telephone call from the Lee County Electric Cooperative telling me that the number 4 copper wire has now been replaced by a 20 aluminum wire. This is a three-phase distribution line from the Burnt Store Road Substation to St. James and Bokelia. Work will continue on clearing the right-of-way along this stretch and it is hoped that this will take care of the frequent power failures, barring of course power failures through thunder storms, rats, snakes, birds and coons being chased up poles.

LASTING LONGER
UNDERWATER

The eerie underwater world
can be beautiful. But treacherous.

Swimming through that world
has its thrills and hazards. Over-
breathing is one of the hazards.

What is overbreathing? It
happens when a swimmer breathes
deeply and quickly many times
before diving. By this extra
breathing, he hopes to build up
his supply of oxygen. And, as a
matter of fact, he can double or
triple his time underwater.

But the swimmer who over-
breathes may stay under a lot
longer than he wants. He may
never come up. Overbreathing
can sometimes be fatal.

To avoid underwater tragedy,

swimmers usually should not
take more than two or three
breaths before plunging into the
beautiful, watery world. Two or
three breaths.

What happens when a swim-
mer overbreathes? The bursting
feeling in the lungs that signals
swimmers to come up for air
may never happen after over-
breathing. And an unexpected
blackout makes these swimmers
lose consciousness -- and drown.

Tragedies take place every
summer on beaches across the
country. Some of them overtake
expert swimmers who over-
breathe. Underwater disasters
can be prevented if people know
the facts about breathing.

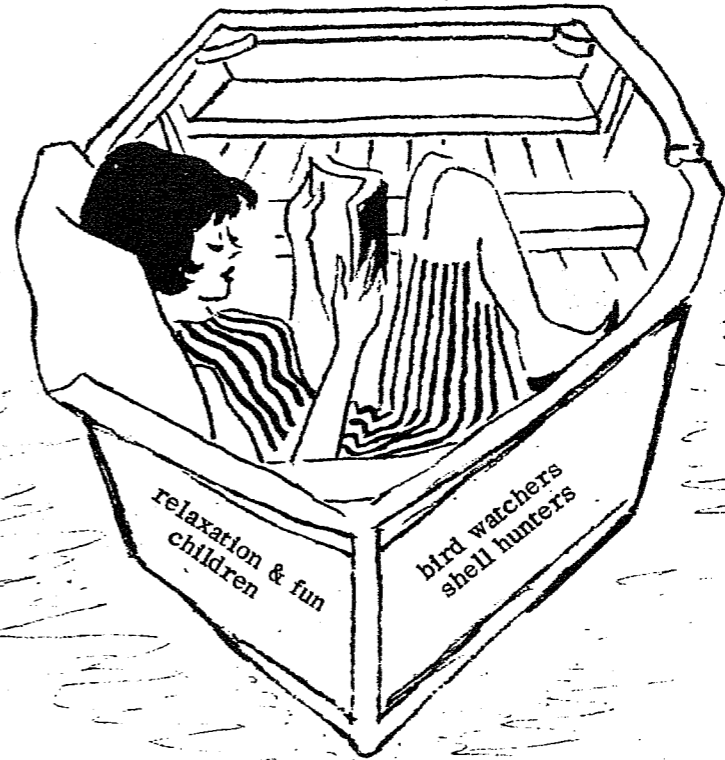
