

CAUSEWAY PROPERTY REZONED

In what may be the longest zoning resolution on record, according to Commissioner P. A. Geraci, the Lee County Commissioners accepted a five-page rezoning plan last week for the property surrounding the Sanibel causeway entrance to the Islands.


The resolution was drawn up by Steve Helgemo, who represented Jamestown-Beachview Inc., and Mike Jackson, representing Islanders who wanted to have the entrance kept as attractive as possible. The long resolution was the result of a number of earlier meetings and hearings.

The land on the right (the same side as the Chamber of Commerce building) was zoned top business, with all curb service businesses prohibited. There will be a 15 foot planting strip along the road, and each business will have its own service road leading back to the business building, which are limited to a 35 foot height and are subject to a 100 foot setback from the road. Another 15 foot planting strip will separate the back of the business property from Bailey Road, and the buildings will be subject to a 50 foot setback from the same road.

The Commissioners are to approve all plans.

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The opposite side of the entrance road is zoned for multifamily residential, with similar setback, height and planting restrictions, except



that the setback from the road is 65 feet.

The bay frontage will probably be used for apartment type condominiums, and a planned 100 foot canal will probably be bordered by motels on the causeway side. The land on Periwinkle Way is zoned for R-1, single family residences.

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

We thought the involvement of the community and audience participation added to the fun also, Give us more like this, please! /s/ Margaret, Emma and Otis Rowe.







will be signed by Dr. Haber and co-signed by an authorized member of the Islands Medical Committee. Checks will be drawn as equipment, etc., is received, and bills approved. If money in excess of that required is subscribed, the excess will be refunded on a pro-rata basis. If Dr. Haber does not establish medical service, the funds subscribed will be returned.

Medical services would be rendered on a check or cash basis, solely to reduce bookkeeping. Fees generally would conform with the standard practices prevailing in the medical community of Lee County.

For good order and service, Dr. Haber will schedule regular office hours according to the needs of the community, and these hours will be announced and adjusted to assure adequate coverage of community need. To minimize waiting and loss of time, appointments may be made by telephone for these regular office hours. When Dr. Haber is on the island he will be available for any sudden or unexpected services which he can reasonably cover. The Fort Myers fee schedule of \$8.00 for a normal office visit would be observed.

Emergency and house calls available when necessary. Fees begin at \$10 and would range higher depending on the time of day and the distance involved.

Fees for physical examinations would depend on the extent of the examination and the time required.

The member of this committee have had extensive conversations with Dr. Haber, and have had most excellent reports on his professional ability. We believe that Sanibel and Captiva will be very fortunate if he comes here to practice.
