

IMPORTANT ZONING MEETING

The Zoning Board will meet at the Court House at 1 p.m., August 25 to consider building heights restrictions for Sanibel, Islanders for or against high rises are urged to attend.

ZONING CHANGE EXPLAINED


Many islanders are asking about results of zoning application on the causeway approach. The attached letter from Mr. Malcolm Beattie, who headed the committee that spent many, many hours on this successful effort to control this key area, gives a full report.

Dear Friend,

This letter is a report on the disposition of the request of Jamestown-Beachview, Inc., for rezoning of land on Sanibel.

The petitioner first asked the Zoning Board for BU-3 zoning on the land between the causeway road and Bailey Road, and for RU-3A zoning on all the rest of the land east of the Causeway road, amounting to about 95 acres.

The Sanibel Planning Committee opposed the petition. The Zoning



Board granted the request, except that they granted only BU-1 instead of BU-3 as requested.

The County Commission heard the request on July 2. We presented evidence about the overdensity of population that would result from the zoning, and the unrestricted and uncontrolled business development that would result.

Since the land along the Causeway road is obviously not suitable for residential building, and since no funds were available to offer to purchase the land for a park, it was apparent that the Commission would approve some kind of business and commercial zoning.

At the July 2 hearing, we were instructed by the Commissioners to meet with the attorneys for Jamestown-Beachview, to try to work out a satisfactory set of restrictions to apply to the land.

We did meet with them, and resolved many of the points that concerned us. We could not agree on the disposition of the land to the East of the Causeway road. They insisted that it be all commercial - for motles, apartments, etc., and we asked that it be zoned residential, except for a strip along the east side of the Causeway road.

Our committee presented a letter at the July 9 hearing, listing the points that were in agreement, and other points that we asked the com-mission to approve. The hearing was a long one, and it resolved itself into a compromising problem.

Eventually the Commission instructed us to prepare a motion, based


WELCOME SERVICE ON THE ISLANDS


SANIBEL COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION


Following the dinner the regular monthly business meeting was held.





ZONING CHANGES from p. 1

- 10. On all of the Business and Commercial zoned land, no building of any sort may be built without the approval of the County Commissioners, given at a public hearing.
- 11. A 35 foot height restriction is imposed on all of this land, for building construction.
- 12. Density controls will be observed, and while no specific figure has been set, guidelines were discussed, and it is hoped that the Commissioners will rule in favor of low density construction on any application.
- 13. A 15 foot strip of natural growth will be maintained along Bailey road.

It can be mentioned that not one of these restrictions was proposed by the petitioner, who wanted no restructions at all. Under the circumstances, we feel that the Commissioners have done their best to protect the island from unrestricted development, insofar as their powers permit.

If it is good to write in protest to them, it is good to write in commendation. We suggest that you do this.






