REPUBLICAN CLUB BEING ORGANIZED ON SANIBEL-CAPTIVA

A meeting was held last Tuesday evening at St. Michael's Episcopal Church in the interest of forming a Republican Club on the sister islands of Sanibel and Captiva. The 34 people present constituted 25% of the registered Republicans in this precinct. Paul Stahlin, Precinct Chairman and a member of the Lee County Republican Committee acted as temporary chairman. He introduced special guests tax collector Harry Schooley, judge and Mrs. Blair, all of Fort Myers, Mrs. Doris Baughman of the Cape Coral Republican Club and Mr. O. Bergen from the Los Angeles, California Republican Club.

A short history of the origin of the Republican Party was given and it was noted co-incidentally that the initial meeting was held in a church in Wisconsin in 1834. The political issue involved at that time was whether or not to extend slavery into the newly incorporated Western States. When Congress failed to enact legislation to stop the spread of slavery a group of concerned citizens banded together to found the Republican Party in order to more effectively fight the issue. It was noted

that good government has always been achieved through the process of individual citizens standing firm in their beliefs and making those beliefs known thru political channels.

Mr. Schooley explained the Party structure of Lee County and outlined what should be accomplished to satisfy the State and County Republican committees. Judge Blair gave a short resume of the most salient factors in forming any political group and listed as of prime significance the following five points: 1. Positive thinking on matters of current interest. 2. Progressiveness in planning for the future. 3. Involvement in governmental affairs even if only to the extent of being well informed. 4. Patriotism by acknowledging openly a pride in flag and country. 5. And above all, integrity and honesty in dealing with matters of public concern.

Ken Havourd who for 17 years has been holding the torch for the party on the islands was introduced as the number 1 Republican in this precinct. Ethel Snyder, who for reasons of health could not attend was recalled as being the second registered Republican and one of the staunchest early party members. In past issues of this paper she has recounted some of her more amusing experiences at the all Democratic polling place at Old Baileys store. Paul Stahlin, present standard bearer was the third registered Republican in this precinct.

As each person present was introduced they told briefly of their personal efforts in other areas of the country in the interest of Republicanism and expressed their eagerness to further the growth of party principles in this area.

From those attending the meeting a committee of nine was selected to draft a basic set of by-laws and to appoint a nominating committee to present a slate of officers to the first official meeting early in November. This meeting time and place will be announced at a later date. The committee members are: Paul Stahlin, Temporary Chairman, Gene Broadbent, Kay Casparis, Robert Haynie, Mary Holtz, Jackie Purdy, Miriam Schriener, Howard Schriener, Jr. and William Sur.

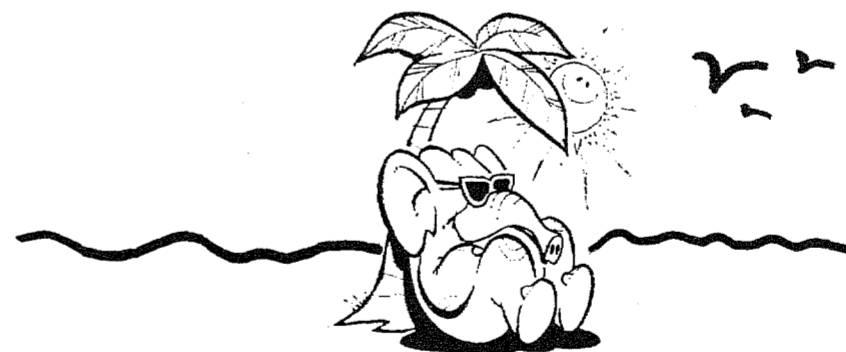

REV. CANON CHARLES JATHO

Rev. Canon Charles C. Jatho,
80, of 517 W. Webster, Royal
Oak, Mich., died on Saturday,
Aug. 10, 1069.

He was the rector of St.
John's, at Woodward and Eleven
Mile, from 1929 until retiring in
1960. In 1961, he was named a
canon of Cathedral Church of St.
Paul, 4800 Woodward.

Canon Jatho was active in a
wide range of civic activities,
including the Red Cross, the
American Field Service, the A-
merican Legion, the Royal Oak
Library Commission and the
Oakland County Hospital Com-
mission.

He was on the board of trust-
ees of William B. Mumont Hospital
and had been its chaplain there
since his retirement from St.
John's. He was president of the
Pastors Association of Royal
Oak.

In 1960, he was named the out-
standing citizen of the year by the
Royal Oak Kiwanis Club. In 1961,
he received the award of merit
from the Royal Oak Chamber of
Commerce.

In 1961-1962 Canon Jatho
preached at Chapel by the Sea
on Captiva.

He is survived by his widow,
Margaret; a son, C. Wells Jatho,
Birmingham; a daughter, Mrs.
Robert Livingston, Kalamazoo,
and nine grandchildren.

Funeral services were held
at St. John's Episcopal Church
in Royal Oak, where he was the
rector for 31 years. Burial was
in Oakview Cemetery.



Ned has been logging a lot of fishing time while his wife, KAREN, goes shelling. Karen got bitten by the shell bug (an extremely contagious virus) when she visited Fort Myers Beach in the early 1950's when she was still in high school. That was about the time the shrimp boats began bringing in all sorts of brand new treasures of the deep.

She is now the president of the Pittsburg Shell Club, and after their last trip here in 1967, presented a program of Ned's photographs of the Islands and Karen's shells collected on that trip to the club. This program was later followed up by an article on Karen's Sanibel shelling experiences which was published in the Pittsburg Shell Club Bulletin in 1968.

A beautiful golden olive was found by one of the JACK GONTERMAN family near the lighthouse on Saturday evening. Mr. & Mrs. Gonterman and their two sons, PHILLIP and MARTIN were all shelling, using masks. The men doing the diving and Mrs. Gonterman holding the shells for all. It wasn't until much later that they realized the prize shell was among those collected. The Gontermans are from Bonapart, Iowa and this was their first visit to the island.

They left Sunday, not knowing they had a golden olive but revisited the island on Monday evening and learned of their find, and have stayed on ...not only for the excellent shelling but for the relaxation and enjoyment they found on the Island.

In this consideration I will seek help and support, and I do not want this support predicated or influenced by my holding another elective office.

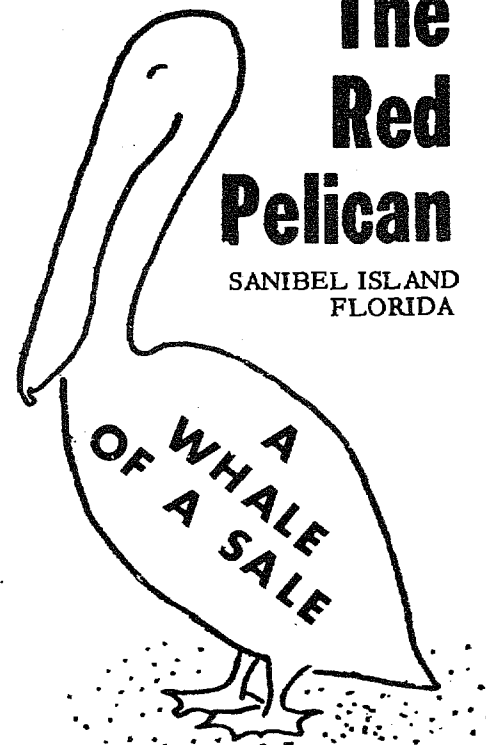
