

SANIBEL-CAPTIVA CONSERVATION FOUNDATION **RECEIVES GRANT**

A grant of \$25,000.00 from the Alice M. O'Brien Foundation, St. Paul, Minn., to the Sanibel-Captiva Conservation Foundation has been announced by the latter's Board of Directors through its chairman, Roy E. Bazire, and by Mr. Terence O'Brien, Director of the Minnesota organization. Mr. O'Brien and his family have been long time members of the Captiva community.

The grant was made for the purchase of lands as part of the Foundation's project for a Sanibel fresh water wetlands as part of the Found-menting the J. N. "Ding" Darling Sanctuary in the salt water tidelands. It brings total funds raised by the local Foundation to almost \$125,000 of its \$375,000 budget goal, Bazire reported. In addition, gift of land have a total value in excess of \$50,000, and the Foundation also has available a substantial line of credit with The Nature Conservancy,



REPORT ON HURRICANE CAMILLE

The total Red Cross figure as indicated at the present time is \$15,000,000 (15 million dollars.) Of this quota the Lee County Chapter share is \$3,077.

County Chapter share is \$3,077. Houses destroyed, 5,506; homes with major damage, 12,409; homes with minor damage, 24,227; families suffering some loss, 66,202; individuals receiving mass care, 100,000. There are 20,000 people who will receive recovery assistance in small business and replacement of boats.

of boats. While Red Cross has been engaged in mass care of disaster victims since the storm first moved toward the coastal area, and this phase of its operation will continue for some time, with 250 national Red Cross disaster workers at work in the area, the organization is now moving as quickly as possible into the individual family recovery assistance phase of its operation. When

the Red Cross case workers interview families they survey their losses and replace on basis of need, which is an outright gift from the American people.

More than 245,000 meals have been served to victims and disaster workers from seven Army field kitchens and 23 mobile vans which travel throughout the stricken area. There are 25 shelters housing and feeding displaced persons and 20 first aid stations are being staffed by Red Cross nursing staff and volunteers.

It was only nine years ago that Red Cross dispersed to 563 families in our area the sum of \$155,000 in recovery assistance. Let us not forget, count our blessings and show our gratefulness by being generous in our contributions to the most worthy cause of our century.



The body will be sent to Anders Rice Funeral Home in West Asheville for service and burial. Leo W. Engelhardt Funeral Home is in charge locally.


