#### NEWS FROM FLORIDA STATE BOARD OF HEALTH

Have you ever spent the time at a picnic, patio party or some other outdoor activity swatting mosquitoes?

Summertime is the time for such events but many a Florida outing has been ruined by these persistent pests. Dr. Wilson T. Sowder, Division of Health (suc-cessor to the State Board of Health) reminds Floridians and their visitors that mosquitoes carry mosquito-borne encephalitis and urges all persons to use insect repellents on any occasion when mosquito exposure is likely.

Dr. Sowder adds that repellents are especially useful at twilight and in the early evening when mosquitoes usually swarm.








Florida is "blessed" with insects of all types--both harmful and beneficial, according to the Florida Nurserymen and Growers Association (FNGA). Many bugs are nuisances. A few of these that you might see around your home are earwigs, snails, slugs, and wasps. Slugs and snails may at times give you a small problem on annuals, but as a rule they do no harm to grass and plants. If control becomes necessary, one of the best materials is metaldehyde. This material is available in a bait or a spray.

By now you should have small green tomatoes on your plants, and a sharp eye should be cast for pickle worms. This is a fat, green, caterpillar which eats into the fruit just at time of maturity. Sevin is probably one of the better controls since it is relatively non-toxic.


Leaf miners become a serious problem on many of our ornamentals and vegetables in the fall months, Azaleas are very subject to Surpentine leaf miner, and so are tomatoes. These tiny insects live between the upper and lower surfaces of the leaf and eat their ways through the middle section of the leaf. The result is a snakelike white streak. Leaf miners can be controlled by repeated applications of Diazinon. The fall months bring about another problem on azaleas-the azalea defoliator. Worms of this family are rather large, 11/2to 2 inches long, sparsely covered with hairs, black and yellow with a red head. When the bush is touched or moved, the caterpillar has a tendency to raise its head and tail end. These caterpillars congregate in groups of several hundred and can defoliate a small bush almost over night. A stomach poisoning is the best control. Sevin, DDT, or Toxaphene will do the job.





## ANCHORS AWAY

There's something about boating that stimulates an appetite like nothing else. To insure happy memories of your outing on the water, it's important to give plenty of planning time to keep your hungry crew well fed.

If it's just a day-long trip, you can probably rely on a homemade picnic lunch. Plan a longer cruise, though, and you'd be wise to consider hot, well-balanced meals.

It your boat is equipped with a stove, you've probably already learned what food to stock and how to cook it. For the novice nautical chef, however, here are a few hints that might be of some help.

A portable stove should be stowed onboard if you don't want to cook over a shoreside campfire. Choose one with tow burners, large enough to handle a big skillet and a saucepan at the same time. Use your everyday pots and pans from home.

A portable, top-loading ice chest is also necessary these days. So are those tight-sealed plastic food containers (which incidentally, offer other storage benefits once the food is gone.)

To keep cool liquids cool and hot liquids hot, use insulated jugs and thermos bottles as required.

Paper plates and cups and plastic tableware are worth their light weight in storage ease. there're no automatic dishwashers in the outdoors!

And don't forget the rest of the accessories - - - things like salt and pepper in moisture-resistant containers, matches, wrapped in a waterproof covering, lots of paper napkings.

Preparing a menu beforehand will reward itself later. Think in terms of big, hot breakfasts; quick, easy-to-fix lunches; and hot, ample dinners.

A portable cooler probably won't hold everything you want to take along, so scout the supermarket for easily-stored canned and boxed foods. Be sure to hold perishable foods to a minimum. And don't forget any special

dietary foods that may be required.

Even the most experienced boat chef occasionally will leave something important behind. It happens to everyone, so don't worry.

Unless you're cruising the remotest of waters, you'll probably come across a store along the way where you can replenish your supplies.

But just incase - - - don't forget the can-opener.




