






BICYCLE AND PEDESTRIAN RULES OUTLINED

The Florida Highway Patrol today "peddled" some traffic safety by outlining bicycle and pedestrian regulations for youngsters returning to school.

Colonel Reid Clifton, Direc-tor of the Patrol said, "Bicyclists and pedestrians have specfice duties and responsibilities spelled out in Florida's Statutes. Students returning to school should know and obey these laws, They were made for their pro-tection."

Bicyclists must obey traffic control devices and right-ofway preferences because they have the same rights and duties as the driver of a vehicle. In addition no more persons may ride on a bicycle than it was intended to carry, Never "hitch" a ride on a car or truck. Bike riders should always ride as near to the right side as possible and not more than two abreast. Where bicycle paths are provided they must be used. The law calls for pedestrians to use sidewalks where available, or if not, to walk on the left side of the roadway facing traffic. Streets should be crossed at crosswalks where available. Never leave the curb and walk or run into the street and always obey pedestrian control signals. It is unlawful for pedestrians to stand on the paved portion of the roadway to "hitch-hike" a ride. Clifton concluded by saying, "Many of the deaths each year involving pedestrians and bi-cyclists could have been prevented by following the rules of safe walking and riding. They are for your protection so use them to your advantage."



Bewarei If you find a raccoon, don't pick it up! Don't buy one for a pet! It may appear friendly and have no fear of humans, but that little masked animal maybe rabid.

The Division of Health (formerly the State Board of Health) warned today that there is an outbreak of rabies in raccoons and other animals throughout Florida, and that people should not handle or make pets of these wild animals. Of the 118 animals that were laboratory confirmed during the first six months of 1969 as having rabies, 99 were raccoons, six were foxes, seven were bats, four cats and dogs, and two other animals. This is far more than the 111 found during all of 1968.

Although 99 rabid raccoons were found in all sections of the state, 58 of the animals were from the Manatee-Sarasota area. Ten percent of a group of normalacting raccoons recently trapped on Longboat Key in Manatee County were found to have rabies virus in the brain, salivary gland, or both.

The Division of Health warns that a healthy-appearing raccoon may seem to be all right but it may have the deadly virus which it can transmit to you through a bite. Only when the disease is well advanced does the animal develop excessive frothing at the mouth and show signs of erratic behavior. Health officials state that raccoons and skunks, as well as other wild animals, develop furious rabies in the later stages and when infected they can also transmit the disease to humans.

There has not been a human death in Florida from rabies since 1948. This is due to the intensive control and surveillance

BOATMAN'S BODY RECOVERED

The body of David Allen, 35, was recovered Thursday morning, Sept. 23 from the Gulf of Mexico about 3 miles west of Captiva Island.

Mr. Allen and companion John Ford, had captized a boat off Upper Captiva early Wednesday. After swimming ashore Mr. Allen attempted to swim Redfish Pass against the tide and was not seen again. His body was sighted by a Coast Guard helicopter about 10 a.m. Thursday. Sheriff's Sgt. Tony Delacey and Water Deputy George Hartwig recovered the body from the water.

Mr. Allen had been the object of a night long search. Next of kin was given as Fred Allen of Montgomery, Ala.


The Peninsula Motor Club,

"Remember," Mr. Jones urged, "that many of the young five and six year olds are entering our heavy traffic stream for the first time on their own and need time to develop greater self confidence in traffic." He pointed out that youngsters 5-8 years of age are involved in two out of every three school-child pedestrian accidents.

To help reduce traffic congestion and confusion around schools, Mr. Jones asked parents not to drive their children to school. "Youngsters have to learn to become independent in traffic," he said, "and besides, parents driving children to school often contribute to the creation of hazardous traffic situations for all children enroute to school."

AAA urged all motorists to help our youngsters safely begin another exciting school year by remembering that "School's Open -- Drive Carefully."




