HOMES ON TOUR-1970

The House and Garden Tour, sponsored by the Women of St. Michael's and All Angels Episcopal Mission on Sanibel, is scheduled for Tuesday, March 24 (rain or shine) from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. Six homes will be featured on the Tour. They are:

1. The home of Mr. & Mrs. Erard A. Matthiessen built about 1924 by Mr. John Fenton. Mr. Fenton planned and adapted the house from a California Mission. He first built a forge in his work shop, and all the wrought iron work was made here by him, including the long iron door straps. These were forged from worn out saws used in his marble quarry in Tennessee. Mr. Fenton was helped by a young engineer named Herman Dickey. Actually, Mr. Dickey did most of the building himself. His family were old residents here and his mother is reported to have planted 1,000 pine switches and thus started the Casuarinas growing on both islands.

2. "Teepee," the winter home of Mr. & Mrs. J. O. Heyworth of Libertyville, Illinois, is an original contemporary design, inspired by the round thatched native huts of Africa. The Chicago architect, Roy Binkley, carried out Mrs. Heyworth's concept in three octagonal modules as guest house, living room, kitchen area and master bedroom. His architectural drawings have been masterfully translated by a talented

TURTLES NEAR EXTINCTION

On Monday, March 23 at 8 p.m. a Turtle Benefit sponsored by the Sanibel-Captiva Conservation Foundation will be held at the Sanibel Community House.

The program will feature Mr. Charles LeBuff of the U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service, Sanibel, who is also Executive Director of Caretta Research, and Mr. Richard Klukas of the Everglades National Park.

Mr. LeBuff will show and narrate a film entitled "Project Loggerhead," on the nesting behavior of the loggerhead turtles that use our beaches from May to August for the deposition of eggs.

Mr. Klukas will present slides showing similar behavior in the loggerheads of Everglades National Park.

Last year Mr. LeBuff organized Caretta Research, a team of young people working to counteract the rapid decline of nesting sea turtles. On one hand Caretta Research conducts original research on the overall behavior of the loggerhead and disseminates information to schools and the public. On the other, the team is actually assisting in turtle propagation in an effort to partially offset the loss of beaches to developers.

The Turtle Nursery at Tarpon Bay contains turtles from last summer's nesting all of whom will be released off our beaches this June. Owing to the excellent hatching and rearing success of the operation the turtle nursery will be expanded.

The public is urged to attend the benefit and support this well-run effort to rebuild our loggerhead population. Islanders -- bring your guests.

TWO ONE-MAN SHOWS
PLANNED FOR EXHIBIT BOARD

Weather permitting, the Sanibel-Captiva Art League Exhibit Board at the Captiva Post Office will be the scene of two one-man shows, both consisting of water-color paintings, March 23 - 26. The artists, Margaret L. Dugdale and Gretchen Wood Call, both spend their summers on the eastern shore of Maryland; however, Mrs. Call is spending her first winter on the islands while Mrs. Dugdale and her husband have come to Captiva for the winter for the last 32 years.

During those 32 years, Mrs. Dugdale, whose show will be on Monday and Tuesday, March 23

and 24, from 10 to 3 p.m., became a good friend of the late J. N. 'Ding' Darling. It was he who encouraged her to begin a portfolio on the plants of Sanibel and Captiva. She has now completed about 50 of these paintings. Another subject which she finds interesting is sea life, painting from live specimens. She has also raised butterflies and moths from cocoons and painted various aspects of their life cycles as they have developed. After she has painted them, she likes to set them free.

Mrs. Dugdale is an art school graduate and has had exhibits in a number of museums: The Museum of Art in Baltimore; national museums in Philadelphia, Des

Moines, and Washington; and in smaller galleries in Maryland, Delaware and Pennsylvania.

Mrs. Call, whose show will be on Wednesday and Thursday, March 25 and 26 from 10 to 3 p.m. studied at the Industrial Arts School of the Pennsylvania Museum in Philadelphia and the Art Students' League of New York. She has lived and traveled in France, Spain, Portugal and the Islands. While in Spain, she studied for three years with Soto Mayor, director of the Prado Museum, at his private studio. For 12 years she lived in Puerto Rico where she had her own art school and organized the Puerto Rican chapter of the American Artists Professional League giving island artists an opportunity to display and sell their works. Returning to Maryland, she organized the Eastern Shore chapter of the American Artists Professional League. She now teaches art classes in Chestertown.

She has enjoyed painting on Sanibel, having concentrated on shells and portraits while here, because of the weather, and hopes to return next year.

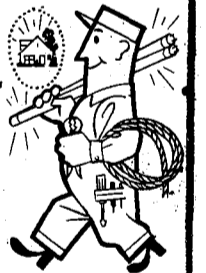

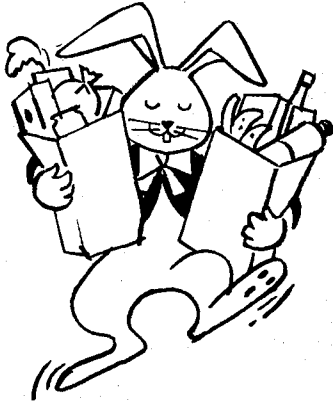

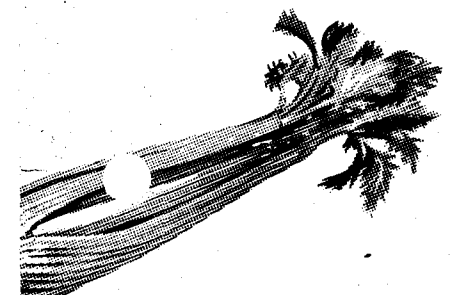

young Island builder, Carl Wightman. The exterior is of laminated cedar and, together with the open decks, are painted a pale grey driftwood color, which continues in the interior. Wide sliding glass doors facing seaward, simple and effective furnishings and great taste in details make this an unusually original Island home.

3. The winter home of Mr. & Mrs. Lloyd W. Bowers of Lake Forest, Illinois, was designed by Paul Rudolph, internationally famed architect and former head of Yale University's architectural school. The house is charming in its simplicity. Vast areas of glass open on to the Gulf. The spacious rooms are decorated in muted tones that give one a feeling of serenity and comfort. The walls are of cypress paneling, and much of the furniture is built in and delicately washed with white. Several of the chests have pulls of local seashells. An interesting feature is a cane screen which forms a partition between living room and airy hallway leading to the well-planned kitchen.

4. The residence of Mr. & Mrs. Wilson Wright was designed and located to provide a close and open view of the sea. Family pieces and antiques have been combined in the style of a traditional urban home for year-round living. Early American furniture, from the 17th and 18th centuries, together with Chinese and Japanese pieces, have been used most effectively. The grounds are landscaped in a natural style, in which the native trees and shrubs predominate. A flower garden is located in the center of a traffic circle and a garden of small cactus, which were collected in the western states, has been started by the left-hand side of the driveway.

5. The vacation home of Mr. & Mrs. John Summersby, of Summit, New Jersey, is a Rutenberg model on which 128 changes have been made, a fine example of individual quality showing thru a standard plan. The setting on the Gulf has been carefully left in a natural state, with a fine stand of Island seagrape framing the sea view and irreplaceable wild growth shielding the Gulf Drive approach. The interior, while simple and uncluttered, combines modern with some fine old pieces and shows great gaiety in color combinations. Of particular interest are the rugs; lovely Iran and Turkestan orientals, one especially designed in Greece for this setting.

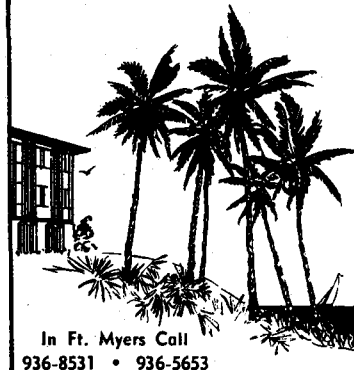
6. St. Michael's and All Angels Vicarage is a charming addition to this beautiful church, carrying its serenity and calm into the Vicar's two bedroom, two bath apartment. Father Madden's organ, his books and his many antiques, especially the fine pieces of furniture, over a hundred, and thirty years old, in one of the bedrooms, complement his Scottish great-grandmother's lovely old china and silver. Our tea this afternoon will recreate some of that Old World atmosphere for these treasures, complete with 'tea cosy' and 'curate's helpers' are not only to be displayed but are to be used, promises the Vicar.
