PHOTO VERSE SHOW TONIGHT

Tonight, Thursday, one of the highlights of the Sanibel-Captiva Audubon season will be presented at 8 p.m. in the Sanibel Community House. Mario Hutton, President, will offer a gala "photo-verse" program including a number of new features only recently completed. One of these, titled "True -- or False" is a two part composition in which color pictures of real birds are strikingly paired off with artistic reproductions of the same species. Of special interest are also "Duty Before Duty," a study of the essential role of the vulture in nature's scheme; "The Yucca Parade" a rollicking nosegay to the springtime explosion of white flowers on our islands; "The Nightingale," a romantic and nostalgic tribute to the feathered Caruso of Europe; and "Homing Ibis." In a lighter vein will be shown several humorous sketches titled "Not too Cereus," "Rambling on Stilts," "Plant of the Tree Frog," and "Alligator Crunch." A special feature will consist of "Leaves from the Seasons' Calendar," an original interpretation of nature's cycles on the islands.

This will be the last Hutton program of the season, and in view of the expected attendance doors will open at 7:15 p.m. As usual, the general public is invited, and all are welcome.




HURRICANE HOUSE NEWS

ONE MILLIONTH CAR CROSSES SANIBEL CAUSEWAY

Mr. & Mrs. Joseph Alexis of Croton-on-Hudson, N.Y., were in the one millionth car to cross the Sanibel Causeway. The couple crossed the bridge at 3:05 p.m. Friday.

The 3.1 mile toll bridge opened May 26, 1963. It cost \$2,730,000. An estimated average of 309 cars have crossed the bridge every day since the opening.

Sheriff's Deputies Dave Wooster, Lou Secary and Hap Payne were waiting for the couple when they crossed the causeway and had them drive to the Chamber of Commerce office. County Commissioners Kenneth Daniels, P. A. Geraci, Julian Hudson and James Sweeney welcomed them.

For being the occupants of the one millionth car to cross the causeway, the couple received a "Key" to the islands made of sea shells, a certificate making them honorary residents of Sanibel-Captiva, a weekend vacation at the West-Wind Inn, meals at the Coconut Grove, Island Inn and Scotty's Pub, and gifts from Henderson House Printing, Red Pelican Marina, Friday's House of Treasures, Sea Horse Gift Shop, Black Pearl Crafts Shop and Sea Shell Industries.

Commissioner Hudson refunded their \$3 toll to cross the bridge.

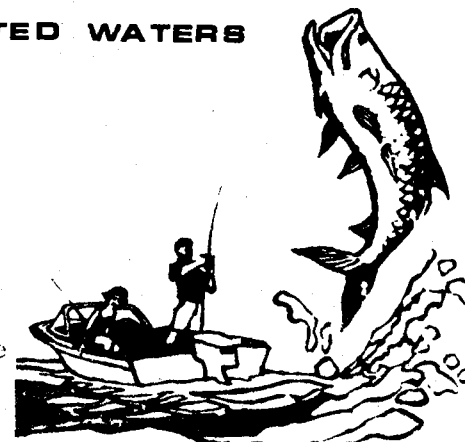




NOTICE

The Better Business Division of the Fort Myers-Lee County Chamber of Commerce Inc., today issued a warning that questionable advertising via the U. S. mail is being again received in Lee County. The latest incident is in the form of an IBM card, and looks very impressive. The logo in the upper left corner is very similar to that used in the yellow pages of the telephone directory. In the upper right corner is a block that says "Pay this amount" followed by a cost figure. Below this is the name and address of the soliciting company. The Better Business Division urges anyone receiving such a solicitation to read the two bottom lines of the card carefully, and to heed the slogan "Before you invest -- investigate."

NYLON BAGS HOLDING THEIR OWN

Big nylon bags filled in place with sand are holding their own in stopping Captiva Island erosion.

Only a portion of the county's road up the island was protected by the bags when a strong storm hit a week ago. Some bags also had been placed near the county park building.

The portion of the road protected by the bags wasn't affected; the problem was south of the bags.

Work has about caught up on hauling in fill to replace that washed out during the storms.

The bags, costing more than \$11 each, are pumped full of sand. The very fine grains wash right through the cloth, until the larger grains pack the bags, creating huge solid "boulders" eight feet long. These are overlapped slightly, creating a wall along the beach behind which sand tends to fill.

The end result may be a terraced beach.

The bags for the road are being paid for by the Captiva Island Erosion Control District, with the

county doing the work. The district has paid \$10,000 for bags. The bags are purchased from an East Coast supplier.

LOBSTER IN PATTY SHELLS

1 10 oz. pkg. frozen patty shells
 1/3 cup butter or margarine
 1/2 cup chopped celery
 1/4 cup chopped onion
 1/4 cup all-purpose flour
 1 tsp. salt
 2 cups milk
 2 tbsp. sherry (optional)
 1 tbsp. lemon juice
 1 4 oz. pkg. shredded Cheddar cheese (1 cup)
 3 cups cubed, cooked lobster meat (2 pounds lobster tails)
 About 30 minutes before serving: Bake patty shells as label directs. Meanwhile, in large skillet over medium heat, in melted butter or margarine, cook celery and onion 10 minutes or until tender. Over low heat, blend in flour and salt; gradually stir in milk, sherry and lemon juice; stir until well blended. Stir in cheese and lobster and heat, covered, over low heat 15 min. Serve mixture in patty shells. Makes 6 servings.

CRAB IMPERIAL

6 tbsp. butter or margarine
 1/4 cup chopped green pepper
 1/2 cup all-purpose flour
 1 1/2 tsp. dry mustard
 1 1/2 tsp. salt
 1 1/2 tsp. Worcestershire
 1/8 tsp. paprika
 1/8 tsp. pepper
 3 cups milk
 1/4 cup lemon juice
 3 egg yolks, beaten
 2 lbs. Florida crabmeat, flaked and well drained
 About 1 1/2 hours before serving: preheat oven to 350 F. In large saucepan over medium heat, melt butter or margarine and cook green pepper until tender, about 5 minutes. Stir in flour, mustard, salt, Worcestershire, paprika and pepper until smooth. Continue cooking and slowly add milk, stirring constantly, until sauce thickens and comes to a boil. Remove from heat and stir in lemon juice, a few spoons at a time.
 In cup, combine about 1/4 cup sauce with egg yolks. Slowly stir mixture into sauce and blend well; fold in crab.
 Pour mixture into greased 2 1/2 quart casserole. Bake 1 hour or until golden on top. Makes about 12 servings.

SKILLET PAELLA

1 can (1 lb.) green peas
 1 can (about 5 oz) boned chicken
 1 large onion, chopped (1 cup)
 1 clove garlic, chopped
 1 tbsp. vegetable oil
 2 cups packaged precooked rice
 1 can (1 lb) stewed tomatoes
 1 can (4 or 5 oz.) Vienna sausages drained and sliced
 1/4 tsp. leaf thyme, crumbled
 1/8 tsp. pepper
 10 oz. Fresh Florida deveined shrimp.
 Drain liquids from peas and chicken into a 2-cup measure; add water to make 1 1/2 cups. Dice chicken.
 Saute onion and garlic in vegetable oil until soft in a large frying pan; stir in rice, tomatoes, and the 1 1/2 cups liquid. Heat to boiling; stir in peas, chicken, sausages, thyme, and pepper; place shrimps on top; cover.
 Simmer 10 minutes, or until rice is tender and liquid is absorbed. Just before serving, sprinkle with chopped parsley, if you wish. 6 servings.

KETTLE OF FISH SOUP

2 large onions, chopped (2 cups)
 1 clove garlic, minced
 3 tbsp. olive oil or vegetable oil
 4 medium-size tomatoes, peeled and chopped
 2 tsp. salt
 1/4 tsp. freshly ground pepper
 2 pkgs. (10 oz.) each frozen baby lima beans
 2 cups water
 8 oz. clam broth
 3/4 cup apple juice
 1/4 cup lemon juice
 2 lbs. fish fillets, thawed slightly
 1/4 cup chopped parsley
 Saute onions and garlic in olive oil or vegetable oil until soft in a kettle. Stir in tomatoes, salt, and pepper; cover. Simmer 10 minutes.
 Add frozen lima beans, water, clam broth, and apple and lemon juices; heat to boiling. Simmer 10 minutes.
 Cut fillets into cubes; add to kettle. Simmer 15 minutes, or until fish flakes easily.
 Ladle into soup plates. Sprinkle with parsley and serve with crusty hard rolls. Makes 6 servings.

- 1 lb. shelled, deveined shrimp
- 1 garlic clove, minced
- 1 large onion, chopped
- 1 8 oz. can water chestnuts, drained and thinly sliced

- 1/2 lb. mushrooms, sliced
- 1/3 cup salad oil
- 2 tbsp. cornstarch
- 2 tbsp. sherry (optional)
- 1/2 tsp. sugar
- 1 tsp. salt
- 1 tbsp. soy sauce
- 1 1/3 cups canned chicken broth
- 4 cups hot cooked rice

About 45 minutes before serving: In medium bowl, combine shrimp, garlic, onion, water chestnuts and mushrooms. In large skillet over high heat, in hot salad oil, add shrimp mixture and cook, stirring constantly, until shrimp are pink and tender, about 3 minutes.

In small bowl, combine cornstarch and sherry or 2tbsp. water; stir until dissolved. Stir in sugar, salt, soy sauce and chicken broth. Pour mixture over shrimp and cook over medium heat, stirring constantly until slightly thickened. Serve over rice. 8 servings.



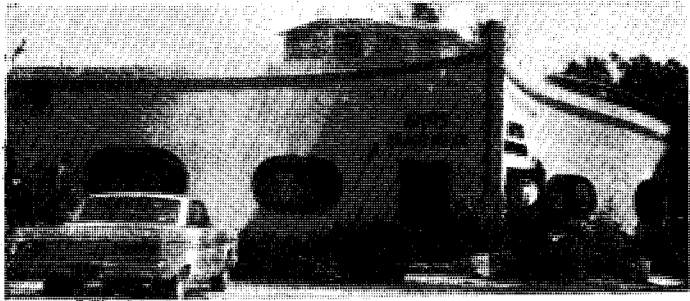
