POLLUTION MEETING

Air and water pollution problems on Sanibel Island and Captiva Island and surrounding waters were discussed in a community meeting Monday, May 18 at the Sanibel Community House.

Sponsors of the meeting include the Sanibel Community Association, the Captiva Civic Association, the Sanibel-Captiva Islands Chamber of Commerce, the Sanibel-Captiva Planning Committee, the Sanibel Rocks Civic Association, the Palm Lake Association, the Sanibel-Captiva Audubon Society, the Sanibel-Captiva Shell Club and the Sanibel-Captiva Conservation Foundation.

Dr., I. H. Simmons of Sanibel acted as chairman and moderated the question and answer period following the general program.

Participants included Dr. Joseph W. Lawrence, director of the Lee County Health Department, Dr. Joseph K. Isley, Radiologist of Fort Myers, Mr. R. M. Stott, supervisor of Lee County Health Department, Sanitarians, Mr. D. L. Smith and Mr. Charles Martindale, Director of the Lee County Mosquito Control, Mr. T. Wayne Miller, Jr., Mr. Hammond, Science Consultant for Lee County Schools, Count Commissioner, Mr. Geraci and Mr. Barnett, State Air & Water Pollution representative for this area.

The mosquito district maintains the fresh water stability in Sanibel Slough, controlling the entire island center's water level. Pollution in that slough was a major topic. Other pollution points were discussed.

 Dr.\,I.\,H. Simmons of Sanibel opened the meeting by reading a very interesting poem which ended with the advice to build a fence on the top of the cliff to prevent persons falling and forget the maintenance of an ambulance below.

Mr. R. M. Stott, gave a talk and showed slides explaining the cause and much of the pollution of Lee County. Dr. Joseph K. Isley explained that pollution is everyone's problem and suggested that we have an established set of rules and regulations and laws which would enforce pollution laws. Dr. Joseph W. Lawrence, who has been with the Lee County Health Dept. for 16 years, advised that the county is growing so rapidly that we must have more control and strengthen laws now in effect. Mr. Hammond told of using students participation in the study of pollution and prevention. He stated that approximately 3,500 students had participated. Their main study being our biggest asset, our mangrove swamps, as we are one of the three counties in the Northern hemisphere to produce such swamps. The generation who created the situation is not the one to have to solve it. Mr. Barnett, the State Air & Water Pollution representative for this area was happy to see so many people interested in the problem of pollution and hoped that all would support him in this work.


LOGGERHEAD TURTLES RELEASED

Over 500 young Loggerhead turtles produced under the restoration phase of the Caretta Research Project were released on Sanibel Sunday, May 17. Children from Sanibel and Captiva helped get the small Loggerheads into the Gulf of Mexico.

Some other turtles were released at Turner Beach and still more were turned loose about 10 miles out in the Gulf.

The turtles are marked and tagged so statistics can be compiled on their progress if they return to nest.

CRAB MEAT AND RICE

1/3 cups packaged precooked rice 2 tbsp. butter or margarine 1 can (10 1/2 oz.) condensed cream

of celery soup

2-1/4 cups milk
1 cup flaked coconut 3 tbsp. sherry 1 tbsp. lemon juice 1 tsp. salt

1/8 tsp. white pepper 6 1/2 oz. crab meat

3 tbsp. finely chopped parsley 1/3 cup grated Parmesian cheese

1/4 tsp. paprika

In skillet, saute rice in the butter, stirring, until golden brown. Remove from heat and gradually add soup, blended with milk. Stir in 2/3 cup coconut and the next 4 ingredients. Bring to boil, cover and simmer, stirring occasionally, 5 minutes. Add crab meat and parsley and heat thoroughly. Spoon into shallow broiler-proof baking dish and sprinkle with cheese and remaining coconut, combined. Sprinkle with paprika and put under broiler until top is lightly browned. Serves 4.





THE ISLAND GARDENER

Gardenia bud drop can be a real problem with the homeowner, according to the Florida Nurserymen and Growers Association (FNGA). This problem is brought about by a number of discrepancies in the culture of the plant; quite often the plan is fertilized when it is in full bud; the plant may be iron deficient; it may have a serious infestation of root knot; there can be many of the branches encrusted with scale; fungus in the base of the bud; or heavy aphid feeding on the plant. Bud drop can also be encountered when there is an excessive amount of moisture such as heavy rains or over watering. Often a specific cause for bud drop cannot be analyzed. You will need to experiment and delete one prob-

lem from the other.

It is not unusual to have a shootfrom the understock of gardenias grow up through the grafted top. The understock is Gardenia Thunbergia. The leaves are crinkled, more narrow than the grafted gardenia, and it is quite vigorous in its growth. Gardenia Thunbergias will produce blossoms, but they are single and not double like the grafted specimens. If you have enough room you can have gardenias blooming over a long period of time. Some plants are dwarf, others are extremely large. These bushes can be shaped by pruning judiciously. Prune only after the plant has blossomed. Remember, gardenias are quite often deficient in iron and manganese. These two materials should be applied at least once a year, more often on sweet soil.

If you like a sweet fragrance at night, then you will enjoy the Night Blooming Jasmine. Most of the jasmine plants growing in Florida have some fragrance, but the Night Blooming Jasmine produces a heavy scent early in the evening and by morning time there is little fragrance left. Night Blooming Jasmine is subject to a worm that feeds specifically on it. This worm can be controlled by re-

peated applications of sevin.

Chrysanthemums are producing some growth and whether you live in north, central, or south Florida you should begin spraying for the control of fungus on these plants. The fungus is called Septoria and it causes a browning of the leaves. If the fungus progresses from the stem of the plant onto the leaves you will have no leaves left by the blooming season. Repeated applications of zineb or maneb or Dithane M-45 will give your plants a full leaf development.

RED SNAPPER WITH OYSTER STUFFING

1 4 to 4 1/2 lb. red snapper, dressed Salt Salad oil 3/4 cup minced celery

1/4 cup chopped onion 8 oz. shucked oysters 3 cups day-old bread cubes

1/4 cup butter or margarine, melted 1 tsp. poultry seasoning 1/4 tsp. pepper

About 1 1/2 hours before serving: Preheat over to 350. Sprinkle inside and outside of fish with salt. Brush large shallow roasting pan lightly with salad oil. Brush one side of fish with oil and place oiled-side down in pan.

In medium saucepan over high heat, in 1 cup boiling water, cook celery and onion until tender; drain, reserving liquid, Into cup, drain liquid from oysters; add drained celery liquid to make 1/2 cup.

In large bowl, cup up oysters; stir in bread cubes, liquid, celery, onion and remaining ingredients. Stuff mixture into fish; skewer closed with toothpicks. Brush other side of fish with salad oil. Bake 1 hour, brushing occasionally with

With 2 large pancake turners, lift fish to warm platter. To serve, remove toothpicks; cut top side of fish into squares just down to bone; serve squares with some stuffing. Lift off bones and cut lower portion of fish. Makes 8 servings.



F.W. FINGER, SR.

Friedrich Wolfgang Finger Sr., a wmaster for half a century, died at 11:25 p.m., April 22 at the Friendship House nursing Home at Danville, Ky. He was 90.

He was a brewmaster for the old Oertel Brewing Co. until 1939. He was succeeded by his son, F. W. Finger, Jr., of Bowling Green, Ky., and the elder Finger became consulting brewmaster.

In 1954 Finger celebrated two golden anniversaries within a few months; one h the company, the other of his mar-

ge. Finger was also an attorney. He was a graduate of the old Jefferson School of Law, and was a member of the Louisville, Kentucky and American Bar associations,

He was an honorary member of the Brewmasters' Association of America and was a graduate of the Wahl-Henuis Institute Brewing School in Chicago.

He was a member of the Scottish Rite and the Kosair Shrine.

Finger was a native of St. Louis,

Since 1967, Finger had been living at Danville, Ky. with a daughter, Mrs. Doris Haywood.

Also surviving are two other daughters, Mrs. Thelma Meiss of Truchee, Calif., and Mrs. Bertha Lynes of Nashville, Tenn.; one other son; Ernest Finger of Fort Myers, Fla.; 16 grandchildren and eight great-grandchildren; and a sister, Mrs. J. T. Stidham of Sanibel.

Mr. Finger had been coming to Sanibel since 1925.

Shortly before his death Mr. Finger sold the majority of his Sanibel property for wildlife preservation.

"Men who are not for sale."


- "Men who will stand for the right if the heavens totter and the earth reels."

- "Men who are willing to eat what they have earned and wear what they have paid for."


