ISLANDERS SEEKING TO ERASE VISUAL POLLUTION

A petition from the Sanibel-Captiva Chamber of Commerce calling for a new zoning ssification which would eliminate many business signs in the county as well as newser distribution, was sent to the County Commission Monday by the Lee County Zoning Board.

The zoners recommended that the petition be included with the consideration being given a new countywide zoning ordinance.

The Sanibel-Captiva chamber petition, written in the style of an ordinance by Mike Jackson, attorney for the islands chamber, was originally presented to the county commission but was sent down to the zoning board on a recommendation by County Attorney Frank Pavese, according to Jackson. It calls for the creation of a classification called S-1 as well as a fine of \$250 or 60 days in jail if violated.

Jackson said the S-1 zoning classification for the signs would be available to all areas of Lee County. To be included in the classification an area would have to present a petition signed by 10 per cent of the registered voters in the precinct.

"The petition is going to require a minimum of four hearings," Jackson said. "There will be two zoning hearings, the first one was last Monday and the one when missioners give it final consideration, and two more when the petitions from the





FHP PREDICTS 14 MEMORIAL DAY TRAFFIC DEATHS

The Florida Highway Patrol today predicted that 14 persons will die in traffic accidents during the Memorial Day holiday period.

The 54-hour period begins at 6 p.m. Friday, May 29, and ends at midnight Sunday, May 31.

Colonel Reid Clifton, commenting on the holiday prediction said, "The first real holiday of the summer will find a tremendous number of families on the highways traveling to weekend vacation spots, the beaches and parks. Some won't return from their outings. They will die in a traffic accident.

Clifton said the prediction of 14 deaths for the weekend is based on past experience and amounts to one traffic death every 3.8 hours in Florida.

The Patrol plans to have all available troopers and auxiliary officers on the highway to help curb the accident death prediction according to Clifton.

PETITION DEFERRED

Deferred until June 22 a petition from the bishop of the Diocese of St. Petersburg to change parcels zoned for Business 1 and single family residential on Estero Blvd., Fort Myers Beach, across from the Leonardo Arms Condominium, to multiple family and Business 1-A use for a development of garden type apartments and homes around a golf course.

The petition was deferred because residents complained they have no information about the project and object to protect their property from an unknown type of development.

FREE HURRICANE GUIDE

A revised edition of Freddy's Hurricane Guide is available free upon request from the Central and Southern Florida Flood Control District.

The 37-page booklet proved to be so popular when first issued in 1968 that the FCD decided to reissue the publication. It was prepared by the FCD with the cooperation of Dr. Robert Simpson, National Hurricane Center director.

The booklet contains useful information, including many safety tips as well as a center fold-out tracking chart. Also included is an account, with pictures, of the catastrophic 1928 hurricane which killed about 2,000 persons on the south shore of Lake Okeechobee.

The hurricane season begins June 1 and continues through November 30.



THEY DIED IN VAIN

Their deaths were not heroic and they have passed unmourned save for the heartache of their families. Their only battle was their fight to live -- and it was lost in the peacful pursuit of happiness on our nation's highways.

The Insurance Information Institute notes that as Memorial Day brings tribute to the fallen in our country's wars, so too must we remember those who have died needlessly, innocent victims

of society.

Battle deaths in the Revolutionary
War (1775-1783) totaled 4,435, somewhat less than the 4,760 traffic deaths in the nation during last December alone.

Combat deaths in two wars, the War of 1812 (1812-1815) and the Mexican War (1846-1848) numbered 3,993 as compared with 4,190 persons killed in traffic accidents in April 1969.

Both Union and Confederate battle fatalities in the Civil War (1861-1865) amounted to 214,938. Auto accidents claimed 217,200 victims in the years 1966 through 1969.

Three days of highway slaughter in 1969 exceeded the 385 battlefield deaths of the Spanish-American War in 1898.

World War I (1917-1918) caused 53,513 doughboys to be killed in action. llighway deaths overtook 56,400 Americans in 1969.

Four years of World War II (1941-1945) took the lives of 292,131 GIs, but during the years 1964-1969 a total of 313,900 men, women and children met death on our roads.

The months of January through August, 1969, accounted for 36,350 highway deaths a compared with 33,629 servicemen killed in battle in the Korean War (1950-1953)

The Vietnam War (1961ready resulted in over 44,000 U.S. dead. Highway carnage in the United States from January through October, 1969, killed 46,440.

The Institute noted that motoring casualties would be even higher, were it not for the constantly expanding efforts of highway safety groups, lawenforcement officials and the insurance industry itself. It warned, however, that there can be no armistice in this war that reaches into every community until each motorist enforces upon himself the habits of caution, courtesy and obed-ience to the simple rules of the road.



SCALLOPS EN BROCHETTE

12 sea scallops

12 small mushrooms 1/2 large green pepper

thsp, malted butter or margarine

2 tbsp. lemon juice

1 tbsp. salad oil 1/4 tsp., salt

dash pepper

4 slices bacon

4 slices process Cheddar cheese 4 thick lemon wedges

About 1 hour and 15 minutes before serving: Remove stems from mush-

rooms. (Refrigerate stems for use in soup another day.) Cut green pepper into 8 pieces about 1-inch square. In pie p'ate, combine butter or margarine. lemon juice, oil, salt and pepper. Add scallops, mushrooms and green pepper pieces; cover; refrigerate 30 minutes; toss occasionally.

Preheat broiler if manufacturer directs. In medium skillet over mediumhigh heat, fry bacon until light golden but still limp; drain on paper towels,

Run a skewer through one end of a bacon slice and then lace bacon between a fourth of the scallops, mushrooms and green papper pieces. Repeat with 3 more skewers. Place skewers on broiling pan and broil 19 minutes, turning frequently.

Cut cheese slices into foorths. When skewered food is done, place cheese strips on top of skewers, overlapping if necessary. Broil just until cheese melts. Makes 4 servings.



Jacks

The crevalle jack also called cavalla, skipjack, toro, jack, pompano and ulua, Light olive on back, shading to grayish-gold on sides and yellowish on belly. A distinct black spot on gill covers, broad forked tail. A savage fighter and rightfully called the bulldog of the sea for the stubborn fight put up when hooked. Many anglers call the crevalle the strongest and toughest of all fish. They are constantly on the move and anglers seldom hunt them in particular. They are taken usually while fishing for other fish. They travel in schools, and one strike is usually the signal for all lines to be busy at the same time. A fair sized crevalle can put up a 20 minute fight which will leave the fisherman amazed that one fish of the size he has on the line could make such an effort to escape.

The amberjack also called carilia, horse crevalle, skipjack, toro, jack, ulua. They are greenish on the back, sides reddish to silvery. The amberjack has little fear of man and his works, roaming the seas and inspecting fishing boats and coral reefs with equal impartiality. They feed entirely on live small fish, most anything from mullet to grunts. Outstanding trait of the amberjack is curiosity. Whenever one is hooked the entire school will follow the battling fish to the boat. Another bait presented by fishermen is

ckly snapped up and the whole school can be caught by always having one fish left aggling in the water. A process of smoking amberjack has been developed which turns the fish into a delicious tidbit. They are called Southern Salmon. The amber-

jack strikes at all kinds of live fish.

The yellow jack, greenish on back with a broad purple stripe following contour of the fish above lateral line. Long pectoral fin. Found mostly in the Florida Keys, but occasionally caught in all Gulf waters as well as tropical Atlantic Ocean areas. They strike at trolled baits, and put up a lusty fight. The flesh is strong and is only palatable when smoked or cured in some like manner.

voters is presented.

"The petition permits each business on Sanibel and Captiva Islands to have one

sign which is restricted to its size, lighting, construction and location.
"It would prohibit flashing lights and other things not considered appropriate on the islands, and would prohibit off premise advertising in favor of a special type community sign which would direct visitors to various shopping areas and resorts thus preventing a great many billboards along the main roads," he said.

Several chamber officials were at the meeting to speak in favor of the petition as

well as members from other island groups.

Robert Dormer, an island real estate broker, in speaking in favor of the petition, called signs "visual pollution" and said he was concerned about it on Sanibel and Captiva Islands.

The chamber is proposing a few centrally located signs with maps on them to guide people. A similar type billboard has been in front of the island's chamber headquarters on the causeway entrance for several years. Other signs on the island would resemble those found in state and national parks directing visitors to food, lodging and business-

Signs specifically restricted under the petition presented by Jackson include: Banner signs or any sign of a similar type. A banner sign was defined as signs possessing characters, letters, illustrations or ornamentations applied to cloth, paper or fabric of any kind either with or without frames, including awning signs.

Signs with beacon lights attached to them.

Signs with flashing lights.

Sandwich signs including all types of portable signs.

Billboards.

Snipe signs (defined as any small sign of any material which can be nailed to trees, posts, buildings, other signs or anything else.)

Animated signs (defined as having any part which revolves or moves in any fashion and uses lights for illustration which change color or alternate colors. Any neon signs,

Also, the petition limited the height of signs to 35 feet but granted lighted signs. ground signs, marquee signs, projecting signs and wall signs when they were erected in either an industrial zoned area or one zoned for business.

Jackson said a section prohibiting the distribution of literature included the distribution of newspapers and the placing of metal tubes they are sometimes placed in, but said some exceptions could be written into the classification.

Zoner William Smith moved to neither approve nor deny the petition but to send it on to the county commission to deal with on a recommendation that it be considered for including in the proposed countywide zoning ordinance.

The commissioners will meet on July 7 to consider the recommendations made at last Monday's zoning meeting.



THE ISLAND GARDENER

The dry weather is having adverse effects on many of the ornamentals in Florida according to the Florida Nurerymen and Growers Assn. (FNGA). Some of the plants, however, can endure the dry weather with little or no ill effects, and these are cacti, Mexican flame vine, crape myrtle, and some of the plants related to cacti. This does not mean that these plants need no water but that they can survive on less water than many of your tender plants.

Trees that have an extensive root system and are several years old may be able to tolerate the dry weather, but the FNGA says to water young trees at least twice a week. The ground should be thoroughly soaked with one-half inch of water per watering. This means you should apply the water around the trees

long enough to thoroughly soak the soil to a depth of 6 - 8 inches. It takes one-half inch of water to do this. The amount you have applied can be determined by setting a coffee can under the sprinkler. When you have one-half inch depth of water in the can, then you have a thorough soaking 6 - 8 inches deep in the soil.

If you water your trees by holding the hose around the base of the tree, it will take at least 20 - 30 minutes of water to soak the entire ball and the area around the ball. Most newly set trees will have a circle around them which is called a "bern." Fill this bern at least 4 times, waiting each time until the water has soaked in.

Bahiagrass may show dark gray areas that are irregular in shape. These areas are the result of extreme drought conditions. In addition to the off-color of the bahia, the leaves of the grass will be rolled tightly and appear to be shrivelled. If you have watered your lawn thoroughly,

these areas may still show up because the soil has a tendency to repel water when it becomes excessively dry. These extremely dry areas can be overcome by using a wetting agent or any liquid soap. Use 4 - 6 tablespoonfuls of the liquid soap in a gallon of water and pour over the dry area. Then water the soil thoroughly with a hose or sprinkler.

St. Augustine, Centiped, Zoysia, and Bermuda grasses may also show these drying-out symptoms. All grasses should have at least two waterings a week with one-half inch of water applied at each watering at this time of year.

Should your lawn have an exceptionally heavy thatch like that of St. Augustine you will need to add at least one-fourth to one-half inch more water than the normal amount. Why? Because the thatch is capable of absorbing 30 - 40% of the water applied. This is especially true when there is a drought such as we have now.

I learned the value of a dollar and came to realize how many hours of hard work it took to acquire the things I wanted. The experience stood me in good stead all my life.


Now our bankers encourage us to buy anything and everything we want on credit. They have fallen over themselves trying to get folks to accept and use credit cards so they can live better now.




