ZONING BOARD ACTION

The Lee County Zoning Board met Monday and approved a 208 acre tract for development of single family dwellings, apartments and a business center, despite disapproval by residents on Sanibel received through the Sanibel-Captiva Planning Board.

Attorney Ronald W. Smalley, representing Nationwide Realty Corp., told Board

members that the plan for the development had been completed so there would be about 292 single family residential units and about 142 multiple family housing units.

The petition asked for the change of one part of the property from existing single

family units to multiple family, and another general use part to single family residential. The land is north of the Sanibel-Captiva Road on Wulfurt Road.

Dr. Vernon MacKenzie and Malcolm Beatty, representing the Sanibel-Captiva Planning Board asked that a decision be withheld until the County Commission meets to consider a master plan for the entire island.

Smalley countered with since the ultimate approval rests with the commissioners, there could be no objection to giving approval on a tentative basis.

Larry Webb made the motion for approval and this was seconded by A. T. Kidd. Don Thyer cast the dissenting vote, but the motion carried.

NEW MANAGER AT "Ding" DARLING

EITHER VOTE YES OR NO - BUT VOTE INFORMED!

The present structure of Lee County government was established by the 1885 Florida Constitution, with no local authority --- all power being vested at the state capital. Since this time the population has grown from 1,414 to over 105,000. Because of this growth, and similar growth in other counties, the 1968 Florida Constitution gives home-rule power to local governments, if they so choose. Because of this option, the Lee County Commissioners established a LEE COUNTY CHARTER COMMISSION which allowed 15 local citizens to examine their present government and attempt to mold a local government to fit the needs of today and tomorrow. The result of this study is the proposed CHARTER GOVERNMENT.

On Tuesday, May 19, 1971, the registered voters of Lee County will be asked to either say "YES" or "NO" on this new form of government for Lee County. It proposes a restructure and re-alignment of our present government system. This proposal is of extreme importance to all citizens of Lee County. You should become familiar with the provisions as set forth under the proposed structure.

You are urged to get all of the facts.

R/V Susio, the Florida Institute of Oceanography's estuarine research floating laboratory and dormitory came in at Sanibel last weekend.

This was the first shakedown cruise down the entire west coast of Florida for the houseboat given to the Florida Institute of Oceanography by a client of Mr. A. Scott Hamilton, Jr., winter resident of Sanibel. The donation was made through the Sanibel-Captiva Conservation Foundation which was first offered the vessel.

Being used by seven state universities associated in the Florida Institute of Oceanography, R/V Susio can sleep eight persons, but has facilities to handle up to 24 persons. Dormitory accommodations permit faculty and graduate research personnel to live on board as well as do the variety of research projects possible with the equipment provided on board.

The first cruise started at Pensacola April 7 and is to cover Pensacola-Panama City, Turkey Point area, Fenholloway River, Steinhatchee River, Cedar Key, Tarpon Springs, Tampa Bay area, Siesta Key, Sanibel, Caloosahatchee area, Cape Sable, returning to the vessel's base at St. Petersburg May 5.

It is planned in the future to station the vessel for periods of up to three months in each of 3 or 4 west coast areas, Sanibel being one of these.

FLORIDA DRYING UP?

It has been about seven months since Southwest Florida has had any rain to speak of, and there are fires in the Everglades, and the wild animals are dying for lack of water. On recent trips, even just down to Naples, the smoke was heavy and hazy in the usually wine-clear air. We feel the drought on the islands, but not as much as many other Floridians, but make no mistake, it affects us greatly, in that our water supply comes from the mainland, and right now is very short and unable to meet the demands placed on it. The situation can only become worse, before it can get better because the rainy season is not due for at least four weeks.

Florida's Attorney General Robert Shevin has advised the state cabinet to bring suit in Monroe County Circuit Court to block further inroads and incursions in Everglades National Park by developers who are dynamiting and dredging and draining to make land in the glades. Landowners and developers, anxious for new agricultural field and residences for the continued influx of new residents in Florida, are busy draining south of U. S. 41 in the Everglades Park. The "private development" threatens to cut off water that flows southinto the glades in a shallow sheet, and it is known that deleterious substances such as pesticides used in farming will eventually reach the coastal waters and pollute them, even causing fish kills.

The action by these developers flies in the face of a 1970 ruling by the late Circuit Judge Aquilino Lopez, Jr. of Key West, who prohibited the same developers from draining the same land in question with a \$2.2 million canal network. Shevin said the developers were circumventing the Lopez ruling.

He stated, "The implication is clear, If you own enough land and have enough money, the drainage district statues can be circumvented with impunity; if you are poor you must comply with the law."






