SANIBEL-CAPTIVA DEMOCRATIC CLUB

The Sanibel-Captiva Democratic Club will hold its annual dinner meeting next Monday, May 17, starting at 6 p.m. at Scotty's Pub, Sanibel.

This is the night before the special election on the proposed new Lee County Charter and Griffing Bancroft, club president, has announced that Dr. Charles Fishburne, Jr., Professor of Political Science, Edison Junior College, will be the speaker for the evening and will answer questions about the charter.

HUTTON - BAZIRE ATTEND MEETING

Mario Hutton, president of the Sanibel-Captiva Audubon Society and Roy Bazire, executive director of the Sanibel-Captiva Conservation Foundation were among about 30 delegates who attended the first quarterly meeting of ECOSWF, in Sarasota, May 1. Bazire presided at the meeting.

ECOSWF (Environmental Confederation of Southwest Florida) was organized on Sanibel at a workshop conference last January, sponsored by the Sanibel-Captiva Conservation Foundation. An Implementation Committee has been working on proposals to round out the organizational plan adopted on Sanibel. Its recommendations were presented to the quarterly meeting.

Major action was the decision to establish through ECOSWF a regional environmental unit. This would cover the five coastal counties from Manatee through Collier, which the delegates adopted as the area to be covered by the new conservation group.

To supervise the first phase of the project, investigating procedures for setting up a regional planning unit, and obtaining funds, the Sarasota meeting selected Mr. Frank Blandford of St. Petersburg. He is to report his findings to a follow-up meeting of ECOSWF some time in June.

Other local organizations represented at the meeting were Audubon Society of Southwest Florida, Southwest Florida Conservation Clearinghouse, Fort Myers Beach Improvement Association, Lee County Conservation Association, Koreshan State Park, Caretta Research, Students for Environmental Action and Student Pollution Control Committee of North Fort Myers High School, and Southwest Florida Chapter, American Institute of Architects. A total of more than 30 local and state-wide conservation-minded groups are included in ECOSWF.

PROGRESS MADE AT SANIBEL'S FIRST GOLF COURSE


Sanibel Island's first and only golf course, known as Beachview Country Club is making rapid progress. According to a spokesman for the developer, seeding of the first nine holes is planned within the next 30 days just in time to have the benefit of anticipated summer showers. It is expected that actual playing on the course will be possible in November or December. Plans are currently underway for a clubhouse facility.

Hugo Lindgren of Jamestown Beachview, Inc., stated that the links were originally conceived for the benefit of the island. In keeping with this, the course will be open for island residents as well as resort visitors. A playing membership rate for 1971-72 has been set at \$250. Additional information may be obtained at the Michigan Homes models in Shell Harbor on Sanibel.

The Gulf is within a golf shot of the new course which is reached via Donax Street and Tulipa Way off Periwinkle just a half mile from the causeway.

Designed by gold architect Richard Wallace of Naples, the course is planned for 18 holes and quite challenging. A number of the 220 estate-size homesites planned in and around the course have already been purchased. A recently activated \$500,000 sewer plant serves this area.


The preserved existing tropical greenery and the planned plantings will result in an attractive "green beauty spot," according to contractor H. O. Hanchey. Extensive waterways and lagoons, to assure a lush tropical golf course and surroundings, are expected to help improve the existing fresh water characteristics of the area.



Letter To The Editor

TO THE ISLANDER:

Well, I see by the papers that the Zoning Board has followed the classic pattern of most Zoning Boards and allowed money pressures to influence a decision against the preservation and life of the Islands.

It's strange to see one hand acting against the other hand. That is, on the one side (at the moment) you have County Commissioners passing ordinances (low-rise and no signs) that are designed to protect the unique beauty and life of the islands. On the other you have a Zoning Board that has agreed to fantastic high density construction.

This kind of diverse public administration is exactly the way so many other areas of the country have been raped and killed.

High density (and that is precisely what the zoners voted for) is the quickest, surest way to negate all that has been done and all that is being fought for by the people dedicated to the cause of conservation, anti-pollution and preservation of those few remaining corners of the country that are so uniquely important to the general public and the generations to come.

That Sanibel-Captiva are enormously worthy of careful preservation is a foregone conclusion. That the zoners have betrayed this trust has been amply demonstrated.

So it rests with the County Commissioners to continue to look far beyond the immediate pressures, to see clearly the dangers of high density manipulators and act with determination to forestall those who would destroy the good that has already been accomplished.

If there is any doubt in the zoners or commissioners' minds about what high think to this quote from the April issue of Skin Diver Magazine:

"Splashing in the water with her family, a horrified mother noticed a repulsive glob of fecal matter clinging to her six year old daughter's neck. Sick with disgust, the family began to recognize the nature of similar objects floating in the turbid water all around them. Churning in the surf and mixed with the litter on the beach were con-

traceptives, tampon cartons, used toilet tissue and brown globs of gunk. The family cut its vacation short and went back to Ohio."

Gentlemen, can you guess where this condition exists right at this moment? Singapore? Hong Kong? No, gentlemen, you can have this mess in just a few hours drive; right in Miami Beach, the developers' paradise!

You can also have it in your own back yard.

A headline of your March 25, 1971 "Islander" reads "Rumor Untrue." (I do not wish my name mentioned in any way) but I could say "No Rumor," for I saw 3 men and 2 women teasing, poking with a stick and throwing rocks at an alligator just as I was nearing the exit of the D. D. Sanctuary in late February. I slowed my car intending to get out and say something to them; however, in my rear vision mirror I could see the antagonistic glances of the men, one especially, so I reached over and locked my car doors and windows and stepped on the gas. I honestly believe they were trying to catch the alligator which was on the opposite side of the water and looked to be about five to six feet in length. I went through the Sanctuary at different hours three or four times a week during the months of January and February and I was always disappointed NOT to see anybody watching the visitors --- that is any one of authority --- and as I drove along I saw many very small fishes caught (ones that should have been thrown back because of size) which were just dropped into buckets and the back of the cars.

SANIBEL DEVELOPERS PLEASE NOTE THAT "USELESS" OLD SWAMP

Wetlands are not wastelands and should not be used as dumping grounds for cities or industry. They are gigantic energy and nutrient traps, converting the basic elements of sunlight, water and nutrients into a diversity of species, essential for our existence and well being. No area of intensive agriculture is as productive as are these natural areas.

Within the limits of their capability, wetlands act as efficient tertiary sewage treatment plants at no cost to the public. Where these natural areas have been altered, so as not to be able efficiently to trap nutrients, growth of noxious plants may develop elsewhere.

Native wetlands plants assist in stabilizing shorelines as well as contribute to productivity of these areas. Wetlands plants, from emergent species to phytoplankton, are important for recycling oxygen into our atmosphere. They are the nursery ground for the majority of our sport and commercial fishes and are habitat and breeding grounds for shellfish.

Wetlands cycle nitrogen and detoxify nitrites through the actions of anaerobic bacteria. They provide habitat for game and non-game wildlife, such as ducks and herons, and for endangered species, such as eagles, pelicans, porpoises, manatees and alligators.

They act as water storage and aquifer recharge areas, as natural sponges during raining seasons, and as sources of water during droughts. Wetlands also fulfill recreational and esthetic needs of man.

BOAT POLLUTION COMMITTEE

Dr. MacKenzie was retained on the boat pollution committee which was selected by the County Commissioners Thursday night, and ten others were appointed by Chairman Bruce Scott and commissioners. Ken Pacetti of Diesel Engine Sales Co., A. Ernest Hansen, president of Hansen Marine Ways, Inc., George Cook, Gerald Hudson, brother of Julian Hudson, and Col. H. M. Fiore of North Fort Myers.

Others who will be retained on the committee are Commissioners Walter Shirey and James Sweeney, D. L. Smith, County Director of Sanitation, Capt. Ed Hansen, city yacht basin master, and Julian D. Page of the Cape Coral Yacht Club.

Sweeney was named chairman of the committee, and Col. Fred E. Dueker was elected alternate in the event Hudson does not accept the post. The committee will further study the boat pollution ordinance proposed by the Citizen Action Against Pollution Committee, and presented by Dr. MacKenzie, and try to come up with a new proposal which will be more in line with boat owners wishes.

BILL TO PROTECT PORPOISES

A bill to protect porpoises from indiscriminate collection for shipment to various entertainment and "research" organizations throughout the world has been introduced in the Florida legislature by Representative Guy W. Spicola, Chairman, House Committee on Environmental Pollution Control.

This information was reported to the Sanibel-Captiva Conservation Foundation by Mr. James K. Lewis, Administrative Assistant to Representative Spicola's committee, following an inquiry by Roy Bazire, executive director of the Foundation.

Representative Spicola has invited the Foundation to offer "ideas, thoughts or suggestions concerning possible legislation which you think would be helpful" in the area of environmental pollution. In addition to controls to safeguard porpoises, the Foundation has suggested the need for special legislation to protect Sanibel's threatened fresh water resource.

NEW ISLAND FIRE HOUSE

The new home for the Sanibel Fire Control District on Palm Ridge Road near the Sanibel Island Shopping Center will be completed in about 60 days, according to Architect Frank Vellake.
