CASA YBEL SOLD FOR \$2,613,300

Sanibel's Casa Ybel Resort was sold last week for \$2,613,300. A group of Naples investors, headed by Walter R. Condon, a Naples attorney, purchased the Resort from Dayton of Daytona Beach and members of his family.

There are 30 buildings in the 57 unit Casa Ybel complex, including two structures which are believed to be original buildings. In 1966 a fire destroyed the resort's main dining room and lounge area and it has been replaced with a large modern structure that includes a convention hall with seating for about 250 people.

The new owners are now actively planning a number of improvement projects including adding tennis courts to the facility's recreational pavilion and expanding the main club building.

The resort presently has eight employees, including Manager Bryant, but normally has about 16 employees during the summer months and as many as 40 during the winter. The resort was started in the late 1880s as the Three Sisters Hotel. The early history of the hotel is uncertain but it is believed to have remained under the same owner-

ship until 1918 when it was purchased by Charles J. Knapp. The point of land that juts out into the Gulf of Mexico where the resort is located for many years was known as Knapp's Point and it was under his ownership that the name of the resort was changed to Casa Ybel, meaning house with beauty.

Howard L. Dayton bought the resort from Knapp in 1943 and it was under his guidance that additional lands surrounding the resort were purchased. Last week's sale to Condon by Dayton included about 195 acres around the resort and 150 acres in a landing field. The property is about half a mile square.

mond is also a director of the Sanibel-Captiva Conservation Foundation, as is Mrs. Lewis. Mrs. Lewis was the first chairman of the board of the Foundation, having served as chairman of the J. N. "Ding" Darling Memorial Committee from its inception shortly after the death of Mr. Darling in 1962. It was this organization which was responsible for the creation of the Darling Refuge.

servation Foundation, earmarked for the Herbert Lewis Memorial Fund.

ZONING CHANGE REQUEST DROPPED

In an amicable meeting with board members of the Sanibel-Captiva Planning Board, Inc., and their attorney, Judge Archie Odom, Mr. Eric Trost of Frankfurt, Germany, presented new plans for developing his property west of Casa Ybel on Sanibel. With him was his attorney, George Kluttz, project manager, Peter Mannchen, also of Germany, and Bob Dormer, whose firm, San Carlos Realty, will handle the real estate dealings.

The new concept plan would utilize land already zoned business for a motel or condominiums while the 102 acre tract previously requested for apartments will become instead, single family dwellings on lots 100'x 150'. Also proposed were circular parking, bicycle trails and a sewage disposal plant as well as measures to prevent ecological damage or the pollution of the Sanibel River.

Also under discussion at Tuesday's meeting was the proposed plan of Nationwide Realty for a development at Wulfert on Sanibel. This had been presented last summer to members of the Sanibel-Captiva Conservation Foundation and Planning Board members, at which time those present had generally approved the low density figures and efforts to preserve the local ecology. At a recent hearing of the Lee County Zoning Board, however, Malcolm Beattie, representing the Sanibel-Captiva Planning Board, opposed the petition of this developer for a zoning change of approximately 10 acres to RU-3. This is in line with present Planning Board policy to oppose all such changes to multiple housing until guide lines can be laid down. Nevertheless, the Lee County Zoning Board did approve the change.

Meetings are to begin soon to start work on an overall land use plan for Sanibel as representatives of the Lee County Zoning Board and the Sanibel-Captiva Planning Board.


SHELL HARBOR INN



Letter To The Editor

TO THE ISLANDER:

A copy of the following letter was sent to The Islander for publication:
Mr. Paul Stahlin

Chairman, Planning Commission of Lee County

Fort Myers, Fla. Dear Paul:

I have read with interest the report of the County Commissioners dealing with the entire problem of erosion on Captiva at a meeting held on April 14, as reported in the Sanibel-Captiva Islander of April 15, 1971.

As a property owner on Captiva, and as a private citizen interested in the problems of Florida beach erosion since 1952, I will not remain silent any longer concerning your handling of this specific problem.

I have watchedyou, as executive manager of the Captiva Erosion Prevention District, proceed with plans and projects dating back to the 1950's in a futile effort to prevent beach erosion from occurring on the island of Captiva, I have personally paid the mill rate on property taxes on Captiva, and in doing so have unwittingly contributed to your futile efforts.

Over three years ago I voiced my alarm to you in person, while you were at South Seas Plantation, over your proposed use of nylon sandbags to prevent erosion from occurring on the Captiva road, I told you then, and I tell you again now, that impermeable barriers have never stopped erosion and will never stop erosion.

Furthermore, I tell you now, and will tell you in the future, that the plan to pour concrete over limerock along the eroding road will be another example of an impermeable barrier that will fail in its purpose. One has only to look at the barrier beaches of our eastern shores stretching from Nantucket Island and extending through New Jersey, North and South Carolina, Georgia, and Florida to see the remains of huge chunks of concrete thrown up by the force of ocean storms. Florida Highway A1A, running from St. Augustine through Daytona Beach to Cocoa Beach, and U. S. Highway No. 1 and State Highway AIA running from Vero Beach through Hobe Sound and Jupiter to Palm Beach are littered with examples of concrete thrown up by

Although little has been written about

the field, any research will reveal that impermeable groins will never serve our purpose. I am prepared to make my entire research file and complete library of the work that I have done in this matter since 1962 available to you immediately, if it will serve your purpose and prevent this useless expenditure of time and effort.

I would like to end this letter by saying that I cannot as yet offer a solution to our beach erosion problem on Captiva, and in this posture I am accompanied by the Corps of Engineers of the United States Army and most of the other erosion control experts in the field. We may in fact find that there is no solution to beach erosion and that people who build homes and maintain property near eroding beaches must learn that erosion may be an unstoppable fact of life.

TO THE ISLANDER:

The proposed extension of Gulf Drive through the Combs and Kuder property would convenience a few and deprive many. The first thing to go would be a small Eden known as "Woodmere Preserve", a natural arboretum which contains not only plants unique to Sanibel but some found no where else in the world. Although privately owned, it has always been hospitably open to all who wished a guided tour including numerous school children from all over Lee County. The destruction of it simply to run a road in a straight line makes no sense at all and a bypass must be found, for this lovely sanctuary is not only a source of joy and pride to its owners but a great asset to Sanibel.

We have shown great concern, and rightfully, for our marine environment, but perhaps not enough for the interesting and beautiful plants on our islands. There must be a stop to this mindless rape of the land for it deprives us not only of our natural beauty but shade, coolness and moisture, without which we become highly susceptible to fires and drought.

Even without endangering this par-

ticular parcei, it would be ill-advised to build this road as proposed for Gulf Drive is a quiet, residential neighborhood not suitable for a highway. Like our rare and serene little garden, it would be ruined by the "racetrack" traffic such a thoroughfare would engender. While we would not deprive any property owner of access, no one can deny that there are always alternatives and one must be found that better serves Sanibel. I think we should write our commissioner, Mr. Walter Shirey, and urge him to do this.

The first annual Southwest Florida Environmental Education Conference was held


in Fort Myers at the Ramada Inn, May 14.






