# APPLICATION APPROVED TO FINANCE PURCHASE OF WETLANDS

Application by Lee County Board of County Commissioners for \$281,000 in Land and Water Conservation Funds to finance purchase of interior wetlands on Sanibel has been approved by the Florida Bureau of Planning, Commissioners were advised of this approval by letter from the Bureau along with copy of similar letter of approval from The State Planning and Development Clearinghouse

The State Planning and Development Clearinghouse.

This is the \$562,000 land acquisition project initiated by the Sanibel-Captiva Conservation Foundation. The federal funds will match an equal amount of land donation purchased with gifts to the National Audubon Society and The Nature Conservancy for the Sanibel wetlands refuge.

Preliminary planning started more that a year ago, and became a possibility with the private foundation gifts last summer. A complex project, never before attempted, it has taken a great deal of time, and the cooperation of numerous government agencies --- federal, state and county, and of the donor foundations and conservation organizations. Final federal approval is hoped for within the next two months.

# CONSERVATION FOUNDATION

Another serious salt water intrusion into the fresh water system of Sanibel has occurred from development in the Rabbit Road area. The following statements were prepared by advisors to the Sanibel-Captiva Conservation Foundation after recent inspections of the entire Sanibel River and adjacent fresh water areas.

Dr. Maurice W. Provost, Director, Entomological Research Center, Vero Beach, Florida: "It has been repeatedly observed that heavy pumping from deep borrow pits, especially those close to Gulf or bay, soon exhausts the underground fresh waters and sucks in salt water from Gulf or bay. If this water is then discharged into the interior swales or Sanibel River, obviously the latter will become saline. The entire history of Sanibel Island is evidence that its interior waters are naturally fresh. At the turn of the century, Sanibel was the greatest agricultural center in Lee County --- this should be evidence alone. It is clearly evident that the western reaches of the Sanibel River and old ponds and borrow pits away from the River are relatively fresh, especially in view of the severe drought and salinization of the river by developers' pumps."

Dr. Frank C. Craighead, Sr., noted ecologist particularly with reference to south Florida: "It is inconceivable that the Sanibel River cannot be classified as a fresh water stream. This river has become famous over the past half century as the feeding grounds for a great variety of fresh water birds. Many references in ornithological literature will substantiate this. Should this recent decision become widely known, you will get a greater reaction from naturalists throughout the U. S. than resulted from bringing salt water into the Everglades National Park (Canal III). If this decision, based on the deliberate action of developers, can stand, it means we could lose most of our fresh water coastal swamps in southern Florida."







## J.N."DING" DARLING NATIONAL WILDLIFE REFUGE

This article initiates a new weekly column that will be prepared by the staff of the J. N. "Ding" Darling National Wildlife Refuge on Sanibel. Hopefully, many interesting releases that cover the wide spectrum of wildlife, environmental problems, and the refuge operation on the island will appear. Readers are invited to direct their comments or questions to the refuge office, by mail, to insure that specific items of interest to residents and visitors will be included.

Presently many forms of North American wildlife are listed in the "Red Book" of rare and endangered species by the Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife, the govental agency of the Department of the Interior that administers the National Wild life Refuge system.

The Endangered Species Conservation Act went into effect in June 1970 under administration of the Bureau. The law prohibits importation of any wildlife species found by the Secretary of the Interior to be threatened with world-wide extinction, except for certain scientific and educational purposes or for propagation to preserve the species.

Previously Uncle Sam could control the importation only of injurious species such as fruit bats, mongooses and walking catfish, or of birds and mammals taken or exported contrary to foreign laws. Now the federal government, with authority over all wildlife imports, requires documentary proof that imported wildlife was legally taken in the country of origin.

Domestically, the law also makes it afederal offense to transport interstate or sell or buy any reptile, amphibian, mollusk or crustacean taken contrary to state laws. (This already was unlawful for fish, mammals and birds.) So federal game management agents may seize alligator hides taken by poachers, for example, or lobsters taken illegally in one state and transported into another.


## REGISTER YOUR BOAT BY JULY 1

Florida boat owners must obtain 1971-72 registration certificates prior to July 1. it was announced today by Randolph Hodges, executive director of the Department of Natural Resources.

The certificates go on sale June 1.

Pleasure boat owners must register their craft through their respective county tax collector's office or sub-agency, and commercial boatowners can register through the Bureau of Licensing and Boat Registration in the Department of Natural Resources. Larson Building, Tallahassee, Florida.

Present boat registration certificates expire June 30, Hodges said and boat owners should take their old certificates with them when making application for renewal. Hodges further stated that a boat owner must present evidence of a title having been issued for his boat, or if the title has not been issued, the owner will be required to make application for a title when applying for re-registration.



### ISLAND CHEF

### RED SNAPPER MANTAZAS

1 tsp. olive oil

- 1 Tbsp. coarsely chopped onion 1 pimiento-stuffed olive, quartered lengthwise
- 1 Tbsp. coarsely chopped fresh sweet red pepper, or canned pimiento 3/4 tsp. coriander seeds
- 1 Tbsp. fresh orange juice 1/2 Tbsp. fresh lime juice Pinch of salt
- Freshly ground black pepper
- 1/2 tsp. soft margarine

1/2 lb. red snapper, cleaned (or any firm, white fish)

1 finely chopped hard-cooked egg Preheat oven to 400F. In a heavy 8' skillet, heat the olive oil until hot. Add the onion and cook over moderate heat, stirring frequently, for 5 minutes or until the onions are soft and clear, but not brown, Stire in the olive, fresh red pepper or pimiento, and coriander; cook, stirring occasionally, for 4 minutes. Now add orange juice, lime juice, salt and a few grindings of black pepper. With half the soft margarine, grease the bottom and sides of a shallow, heat-proof casserole large enough to hold the fish. Put the fish in the casserole and pour the sauce over it. Bake uncovered for 30 minutes, basting the fish with the sauce every 10 minutes. The fish is done if the flesh feels firm when pressed with a finger. Do not overcook. Serve the baked fish directly from the casserole, sprinkled with the chopped hard-cooked egg.

### FRESH WATER FISH COMMISSION MEETS

Fire and drought damage was reviewed at a meeting of the Game and Fresh Water Fish Commission on Friday, May 21, when the five member board met for its regular meeting at Remuda Ranch Resort.

Commission Chairman James B. Windham said the extent of the fire and drought conditions in the Everglades and their effects on wildlife cannot be fully evaluated at this time, but the damage was extensive, and will require continued watchfulness and vigilance between now and the opening of the hunting season.

He said, "Generally speaking fire is much more beneficial than harmful to wildlife in Florida, but under extreme drought conditions, it can seriously damage important wildlife habitat such as cypress and other forest areas." Water tables were noted to still be well below normal despite recent rains.

The meeting was open to the public and well attended.

### FLORIDA PASSES TOUGH BUMPER ACT

The Florida Senate has voted for Florida to keep the toughest bumper standards of any in the country. The act was passed in the 1970 session, requiring all cars sold in Florida after a certain date, be equipped with 5 mile an hour impact absorbing bumpers. The federal standards for back bumpers go to 4 miles per hour in 1974, and so Florida already has a requirement of one mile per hour over that. The Florida Senate voted recently to retain this act by 36 to 7. The present federal standard is set at 2.5 m.p.h. crashes, which seems ridiculous in thinking of safety standards.

Federal guidelines are concerned with safety and safety equipment on cars such as lights, brakes and windows, while Florida law is aimed at thinking in terms of damage

to the car as well.

Under Florida standards, a car driven forward or backward at 5 m.p.h. into a test barrier must have no ill effects to the bumpers, car occupants or to the car itself.







At McCauls on Captiva, they have some lovely great big chunks of agatized coral from Tampa Bay. It is an item that is becoming scarce,too, and many of the pieces have gorgeous colors, and those that don't are often ones that are fluorescent, their colors emerging in the dark. Ruth Melichar, local artist, has some lovely paintings on display that are done on coconut fiber from local palms creating something unusual from the usual. Also, their specimen shells from 100 fathoms are fantastic!

'Tween Waters on Captiva, too, is making some drastic changes in decor that are a great improvement. "The Big Parade," a shelling original cartoon in picture form, is on the main wall of the lobby; there is something new each time we visit. Anyhow, the picture of shellers on the beach is an original of "Ding" Darling's which he did when he was a frequent guest at the Inn. Other notables have lived at 'Tween Waters and one is the Lindbergh family. Mrs. Anne Morrow Lindbergh wrote the fascinating story of sea life on Captiva in her book called, "A Gift From the Sea" with a cottage at 'Tween Waters as the background base. There is another book about Captiva written by James Branch Cabell, who wrote the delightful book "Jurgen." Please let us know the name of his Captiva book, if you know it. The Inn has brought out some real antiques to show off in the dining room. There is an old rocking cradle, which must be 100 years old, and then there is a dear little cypress secretary, and these antiques are blended with the gay print curtains and pretty modern table settings.

Moving on to South Seas Plantation, we have always been fascinated by the living history all around us in this setting. First, you must think of plantations realistically as they really were. They were large farms, with working people who brought in the crops, just as large farm combines do today, but without the tractors and modern farm equipment we are used to. South Seas was such a "farm" and the living coconut trees there today were part of a copra business. The South Seas Plantation had the first Key

Lime grove, and they still have it, and where the marina has been developed, they maintained a large fishing port back in the 1850's.

The main dining room is over 100 years old, and was the central building and hall where everybody gathered to eat and sit around and talk. Of course, through the years, many changes and improvements have been made and continue to be made, but many of the little cottages were quarters for the workers, and many new ones have been built over the years.

The two-story Manor House, which you pass on your way into this "preserve for people and birds," as the entry sign says, was the home of the Plantation owners, the Chadwicks. Captiva and Upper Captiva were one and the same island at that time, and the old coconut palms lined the road to the Manor House, as they do now.

In the early 1900's, a few guests began to be taken in as visitors who came wishing a place to stay on the island. The farming and plantation were badly hurt by hurricanes. The great 1926 hurricane cut a swathe through and separated Captiva from Upper Captiva, dumping the Bryant house into the turbulent waters and carrying it away.

The American Hotel Association bought the lovely old plantation in the 1900's and improved the property right along too. About 10 years ago, the Captiva Island Company purchased the property, and General Wallace Watts, whose picture hangs impressively in the dining room lobby, became the president of the company. The present marina, which will accommodate up to 60 foot yachts was built, and also the golf course, in very recent years.

And so time marches on, bringing with it changes and mostly for the better, at the old plantation. But the old sapodilla tree with its velvet fruit continues to shade many a visitor from Captiva's hot sun, and a breeze blows across the waters to cool the brow of the guest to South Seas Plantation.

## PLANT HIRES

## RETIREES: SUCCESS

Sixty-nine retired people here have made an immediate success of a new Lee County industry that is providing an estimated weekly payroll of about \$3,000. The retired people are assembling tiny thermostats used in small electrical appliance for American Thermostat Co. on Palm Beach Blvd.

Sam Moskowitz, vice president and a principal stock holder of American Thermostate Co., headquartered in South Cairo, N.Y., said the local plant started production in late January and because of the efficiency of the 69 retired employees the plant size will be doubled.

"We realized it would be easy to get employees who are retired and living on Social Security in this area," Moskowitz said. "These people on fixed incomes have really been caught in a squeeze by the recent waves of inflation. We are allowing them to work 15 hours a week which doesn't interfere with their Social Security benefits."


The employees do their work while seated at a table. The thermostats they assemble are about 1-1/2 inches long and half an inch high. There are three three-hour shifts a day. Moskowitz said a high degree of efficiency must be maintained in the manufacture and assembly of the thermostats and so far the local employees have exceeded all the stand-

The firm has ordered additional equipment for the local plant and its installation is expected to double the output. The equipment is expected to begin arriving in about three weeks and installation completed within three months.

Moskowitz said American Thermostat received a great amount of help in locating the assembly plant herefrom the committee of 100 of the Fort Myers-Lee County Chamber of Commerce and several local attorneys. The firm also has plants in South Cairo, N.Y., and Canada.
