SERENITY HOUSE FUNDS AT HALFWAY MARK

Serenity House has reached the halfway mark in its drive for \$15,000. Co-chairman Franklin Mann said the drive is extended so that the goal can be met. He said, "So much has to be done. We must increase the capacity of Serenity House. A drying out ward must be added and medical treatment for the very ill alcoholic when he arrives is paramount."

The House is located on Second Street, and resident manager Ernie Gurtner said, "Employment offers to the men at Serenity House are at an all time high." Everybody benefits by the rehabilitation of an alcoholic. The men are able to find work, and contribute toward their room and board and also they in turn contribute something good to society.

An effort to raise more money will culminate in a white elephant sale at the house. to be held soon. BE LAWFUL ... REMOVE ILLEGAL SIGNS

The Sanibel-Captiva Sign Ordinance, which became effective February 1, 1971, stipulates that banner signs (signs possessing characters, letters, illustrations or ornamentations applied to cloth, paper or fabric of any kind either with or without frames), sandwich signs (any sign, double or single faced, which is portable and may readily be moved from place to place) and snipe signs (any small sign of any material, including paper, cardboard, wood and metal, when tacked, nailed or attached in anyway to trees or other objects where such sign may or may not apply to the premises) must be removed within six months of the effective date of the ordinance. This means that banner signs, sandwich signs and snipe signs regardless of how long they have been posted have become illegal on Sanibel and Captiva as of August 1, 1971.

The ordinance is being enforced and all those having such illegal signs either on or off their properties should remove them immediately.

Signs of any kind, whether easily removable or permanent, which have been put on the county or state right-of-ways are also illegal and they, there again, should be taken down promptly.

Please help beautify our island and comply with the law.

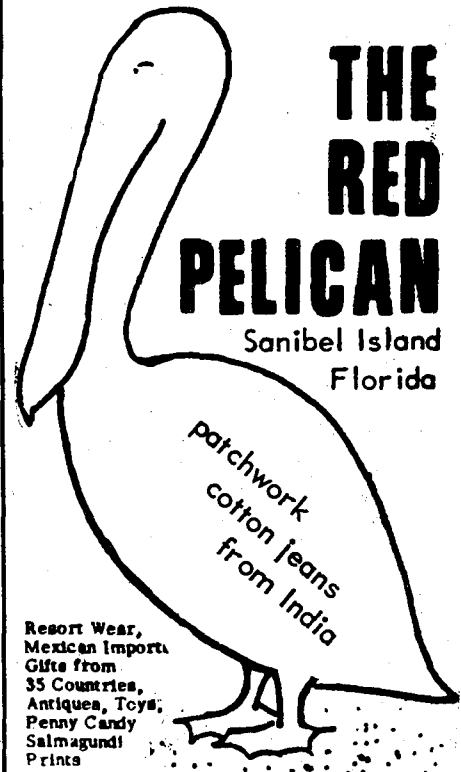

Did you know that South Seas Plantation has a tiny Ship's Store to replenish stores of yachts coming into their deep water port? They can furnish galley items, in limited amounts, until the yachtsman can take on supplies at a larger grocery.


Gift Shop manager Frances Hallinrake said, "Often guests come to the Plantation, and because of the lie of the Island, think they see the sun rising in the west and setting in the east! It's because the island takes a bend, and you are really looking out on Pine Island Sound and Pine Island off in the distance, Refish Pass and the Gulf beyond are far to the left, and Upper Captiva, too."

Reynolds' Craft Shop has an interesting collection of boxes to display shells with glass tops. They come in a variety of woods, but we suggest you feel them to get satiny ones. And they have the specimen shells, bag shells and jewelry findings; in fact everything pertaining to shells, even shell tables. But the thing that fascinated us was a clean white putty, that never hardens and is reusable over and over. It is strong enough to hold a picture to the wall, and has all sorts of uses, as adhesive for your shell decorations.
